At 7:32 p.m., the President of the Board of Education opened the Workshop Meeting. As the first order of business, Board President Bruce Kahn led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Topics covered in Mr. Conboy's Administrative Report dated March 24, 2017, included:

Discussions tonight on budget/state aid

New York State budget not settled yet; trying to meet budget deadline

- Governor Cuomo may freeze depending on Federal funding
- Confident we can produce a balanced budget even if we don't receive an additional amount of State Aid
- Large transfer that will be on the April Agenda
- ELA testing
- Refusal rate similar to last year
- Dr. Pecora has been in District getting to know the District
- Toured all buildings

- Joined Mr. Striffolino's professional development today Use of funds in repair reserve

- Painting of HS gym and repair of some fencing
- \$150,000 available in repair reserve
- Must have public hearing on this prior to using those funds

Consider holding that public hearing on the same night as Budget Hearing

Ashley Soliwoda has been named News 12 Scholar Athlete for this month

Discussion on letter sent home to parents concerning "opting" out of testing

- Any thoughts changing letter sent home to parents
- Mr. Conboy advised that he had no thoughts on changing letter
- At meeting of 10 Superintendents from Long Island last year, Commissioner stated Superintendent's responsibility to reduce opt out
- In Commissioners Regulations 100.3 & 100.4 language is clear; no right for anyone to opt out
- Guidance from SED says students have ability to opt out; nothing that specifically allows or authorizes
- Not really opt out; it is a refusal
- This could be a discussion item in the future
- Letter is based on memo written in 2013 from Assistant Commissioner Steven Katz which specifically states what Superintendents were required to do in communicating with people who wanted their children to not take the test
- Mr. Conboy stated, as Superintendent of Schools, he needs from someone at SED to give specific direction that he is allowed to tell parents that they have every right to opt their child out
- He has never received such direction; not included in Commissioners regulations
- Superintendent and Board are required by oath, to follow the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of New York State which includes the New York State Education Department
 Commissioners regulations state what is mandatory
- Change wording of letter in the future; possible discussion item for
- letters which go out next year
 Perhaps need as a Board to pressure the State more to figure out
- what to do about this; it is ridiculous what is going on
 Last line in letter says to contact the principal of your child's school to understand what the procedures will be on the day of the test
- Farce right now; waste of people's time; something needs to be done about it
- Good thing to discuss in the future with new Superintendent

Board President Bruce Kahn gave an update on the Harbor Roadway Project:

Meeting was held on March 17th with County, Architects, Contractor, Ms. Cavassa and Ms. Pellati Contractor waiting for signed contract; will be signed this evening Timeline for project has been set Hoping to break ground around April 15th and be done by July (assuming weather, etc.)

Will try to minimize impact on community while work goes on
