Now, therefore, be it resolved, that the Board of Education hereby declares the purchase of such equipment to be an ordinary contingent expense in an amount not to exceed \$2,400 and authorizes the Assistant Superintendent of Business to fund such expenses by making the appropriate and necessary transfers between budgetary appropriation codes.
