Dear Seaford Families, Faculty and Staff,

Over the last ten days, there have been nine new cases across the District with some of the cases requiring contact tracing in our schools. As a community we must be committed to keeping children home who are not feeling well. It is vital that if a student or an employee is not feeling well or believes to be a close contact to someone who has tested positive, that he/she must remain at home. Please remember that an individual who has tested for COVID-19 must quarantine until the lab results are received. Also, individuals who are in isolation or quarantined should not socialize with friends and extended family.

Below are the number of positive COVID cases since my letter dated February 12, 2021:

Building	Student/Employee
Harbor Elementary	1 Student
Manor Elementary	1 Student, 4 Employees
Middle School	1 Student
Seaford High School	2 Students

Individuals receiving a positive test result are required to isolate for ten days as per the Department of Health guidelines. These people will not be permitted to return to school until we receive a letter from the Department of Health and/or medical documentation clearing them to return to school. If you test positive for COVID-19, please send immediate email notification to your building principal and your school nurse. As a reminder, New York State has adopted the CDC recommended quarantine period of 10 days for those considered to be close contacts. The symptoms of COVID-19 are like the regular seasonal influenza and include fever, coughing, and shortness of breath. Some have reported additional symptoms, such as a runny nose, sore throat, nausea, lethargy, lack of appetite, vomiting, diarrhea, loss of senses of taste and smell. If you are exhibiting any symptoms such as those listed above, please stay home and contact your medical provider.
