Dear Seaford Families, Faculty and Staff,

Last night and early today, the Seaford School District was notified that three students have tested positive for COVID-19, one at the Seaford Middle School, one at the Seaford High School and one at the Seaford Harbor Elementary School. After receiving a positive test, these individuals are required to quarantine per the Department of Health guidelines. These individuals will not be permitted to return to school until they receive a letter from the Department of Health clearing them to return to school.

Out of an abundance of caution and following guidance issued by the New York State Education Department at the Nassau County Department of Health (NCDOH), we have closed off all areas of the building that the individual used and are thoroughly cleaning and disinfecting those spaces. Based on the guidance from the NCDOH, we will follow all necessary protocols to mitigate any potential exposure to other students or staff.

Due to the circumstances of these particular cases and the implementation of masks, barriers and social distancing in the classrooms we have not been advised to quarantine the school at this point in time. However, out of an abundance of caution and in consultation with the Nassau County Department of Health, specific students will be quarantined. All schools will be open on Monday, December 21, 2020.

The symptoms of COVID-19 are like the regular seasonal influenza and include fever, coughing, and shortness of breath. Some have reported additional symptoms, such as a runny nose, sore throat, nausea, lethargy, lack of appetite, vomiting, diarrhea, loss of senses of taste and smell. If your child is exhibiting any symptoms such as those listed above, please keep your child home and contact your child's medical provider.

We are closely monitoring this situation and will provide you with updates as we learn more. As always, the health and safety of our students, faculty and staff is our priority. If you have questions, please do not hesitate to contact me or your child's building principal.
