Dear Harbor Families,

As always, we hope you and your families are doing well. We appreciate your hard work and partnership to ensure the success of our students during these unprecedented times. We understand all the work that you are doing to help your child(ren) reach success. As we continue to navigate through this unusual time, and as a result of the Governor's Executive Order to have schools remain closed, the district has modified its plan for remote instruction for the remainder of the school year. We have reflected upon our current learning stage and are asking both you and your child(ren)'s teacher to help adjust to the next phase of learning which will now include "live instruction" through Zoom or Microsoft TEAMs. The expectation is that all students will participate in their remote classes as outlined below.

Starting Monday, May 18th, your child's classroom teacher will be providing five "live instruction" lessons a week. The schedule and length of the lessons will be determined by your classroom teacher and will cover the basic subjects of ELA, math, science, social studies and character education. Please note that the length of the lessons will be age appropriate and will be determined by the classroom teacher. The live instruction will be modeled around a typical "mini-lesson" structure where topics are introduced.

In addition, our Special Area and Supportive Area (Reading, Math, and ENL) teachers will be providing live lessons. You will be receiving a "links page" prior to the start of next week so you can access the Special Area lessons. The supportive area teachers will be contacting the parents with a live link. All classroom, special area, and supportive area teachers will continue to provide a daily interaction hour where your child(ren) will have access to your child's teacher.

Finally, please review the additional documents attached to this letter. One is a guide for the digital instruction. Also included is the Harbor School Digital Learning Schedule. The third document is the Virtual Learning Class Etiquette for Students and Parents Document regarding live instruction. Adherence to these guidelines will help to ensure a smooth and successful transition to Phase III of remote instruction. We are all learning and navigating this new type of instruction. We truly appreciate the support and your cooperation as our teachers take on the new task of educating your child(ren) through a live platform. Thank you and stay well.

- Please remember that virtual classes are for students. Parents should not interrupt learning. Any interaction with the teacher should occur through email outside the classroom period.
- The privacy and confidentiality of all participants is important. Taking photos, screenshots, recording audio/video is prohibited during the online class, as is posting any portions of the class to social media.
