Topics covered in Dr. Pecora's Administrative Report dated April 13, 2022:

Middle School Principal Dan Smith spoke about the Middle School's goal of having as many clubs as possible. Mr. Smith advised that two students wanted to present their proposals for two clubs in the new school year. One of the students could not be present so Mr. Smith about the request to have a Math Club. He went on to say that years back, the Middle School did have a club called Mathletes. He explained that this would hopefully include math competitions within the school and perhaps in the future out of the school.

PRESENTATIONS RECOGNITIONS

Mr. Smith then introduced student Thomas Anderson, who proposed creating a Strategic Game Club in the Middle School. Thomas then explained in detail, how he came upon the idea, suggested time, day of week and location for the club.
