

Essential Elements: Schools-To-Watch Program

Since its inception nineteen years ago, New York's EE: STW program operated as a program to <u>identify</u> and <u>recognize</u> exemplary schools that are successfully implementing New York State's Essential Elements and the National Forum's criteria for high performance and to <u>promote</u> school improvement and continuous growth.



Benefits of being an EE:STW School

SOME NOTORIETY!

- National & state recognition for the district, school, and staff.
- Membership in a select group of nationally recognized middle-level schools.
- A Banner! Hooray!

GROWTH & PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- On-going, research-based school improvement.
- Professional development opportunities and networking.
- Coaching towards continued success.

Benefits of Completing the EE: STW Application Process

- A thorough, research-based, review of the middle-level school and its programs consistent with the Regents Policy Statement on Middle-Level Education, the SED's Essential Elements of Standards-Focused Middle-Level Schools and Programs, and the National Forum's STW Criteria.
- Engagement of the Seaford community in a constructive school improvement activity.
- Identification of school/program strengths as well as areas in need of improvement.
- Development of a research-based continuous improvement plan for the school.
- Site visit (and follow-up report) by a team of trained middle-level educators.

Typical Two-Year Application Timeline

- January July 2023: Application preparation and submission
- August September 2023: Peer review process of submitted application
- October January 2023-24: Site visit to middle school by auditors
- <u>February 2024</u>: Notification of Essential Elements: Schools-To-Watch
 Designation or Rising School Designation
- March May 2024: Celebrations at Schools
- June 2024: Attendance at National Forum's Awards Conference in Washington,
 DC
- October 2024: Present at the NYS Middle School Association's Annual
 Conference

The criteria.....

- Four Elements with 37 criteria with over 130 indicators:
 - Element 1 Academic Excellence (8 criteria)
 - Element 2 Organizational Structure and Operations (9 criteria)
 - Element 3 Social Equity (10 criteria)
 - Element 4 Developmental Responsiveness (10 criteria)
- Schoolwide Self-Study and Rubric then blind survey
- Application
- Auditors.....and best of all
