



LIFT

The LIFT program is an exciting interdisciplinary program for our K-5 students at the Harbor and Manor Elementary Schools. The program is facilitated by a library media specialist, physical education/health and general education/special education/gifted and talented educators. The focus of the program will be the following:

- Library: Focus on library skills, continue collaboration with classroom teachers to focus on research, and Project Lead The Way
- Innovation: Focus on critical thinking, teamwork, creative problem solving, innovative thinking and inquiry based learning
- Fitness: Focus on nutrition, mindfulness that focuses on our SEL (Social Emotional Learning) programs such as RULER & Habits of Mind, and movement/fitness
- Technology: STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics)













Re-imaging Library Spaces


To support not only the LIFT program but to create a hub of learning for students at the Harbor and Manor, the District is looking to recreate the library spaces at these schools.

Since its inception nineteen years ago, New York's EE: STW program operated as a program to identify and recognize exemplary schools that are successfully implementing New York State's Essential Elements and the National Forum's criteria for high performance and to promote school improvement and continuous growth.



A thorough, research-based, review of Seaford Middle School and its programs consistent with the Regents Policy Statement on Middle-Level Education, the SED's Essential Elements of Standards-Focused Middle Level Schools and Programs, and the National Forum's STW Criteria will be conducted, including:

- Engagement of the educational community in a constructive school improvement activity.
- · Identification of school/program strengths as well as areas in need of improvement.
- Development of a research-based continuous improvement plan for the school.
- Site visit (and follow-up report) by a team of trained middle-level educators.







FAST FACTS: Mental Health in Children

According to the National Alliance on Mental Health (NAMI):

- ▶1 in 6 U.S. youth aged 6-17 experience a mental health illness each year
- ≥50% of all lifetime mental illness begins by age 14
- ➤ Suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death among people aged 10-14

According to research conducted by Leeb et al. (2020), mental heath emergency department visits have increased by 24% for ages 5-11 and by 31% for ages 12-17.

Between 2016 and 2020, the number of children ages 3-17 years diagnosed with anxiety grew by 29 percent and those with depression grew by 27 percent. (Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA)




New Outdoor Field Comfort Station with Bathrooms at Seaford High School (Proposition 2)

The Seaford Residents will be asked to vote on the use of the **District's Capital Reserve** for an up to amount of **\$1.5 million** to construct new outdoor bathrooms in a Comfort Station at Seaford High School

A portion of the expense associated with the construction of the proposed handicapped accessible outdoor comfort station may be funded with a grant from NYS entitled Community, Resiliency, Economic, Sustainability, and Technology Program ("CREST")



New Pathways for Seaford's Sports Complex (Proposition 3)

The Seaford Residents will be asked to vote on the use of the **District's Repair Reserve** for an up to amount of \$500,000 to repair masonry work, stair wells and walking paths at the High School that have been identified within a Building Condition Study recently completed.

Additionally, new asphalt walkways will be replacing existing walkways to complete the outskirts of the new turf field constructed with funds from the District's existing Capital Reserve.
