- Library Renovations in Manor, Harbor, MS

 School architecture can be part of your district's strategy to recover from the pandemic because physical learning spaces can play a role in enhancing learning and fostering better socialemotional health




# Library Project PROCESS

Goal: refine the vision of our library spaces as the nexus where 21<sup>st</sup> century design and curriculum meet to amplify inquiry-based teaching and learning.

- o Fall 2023
  - Site visits to other schools; LIFT teachers, library media specialists, and administrators
- Fall-Winter 2023-2024:
  - Used feedback to inform design process
  - Library designers and facilities team created renderings
  - Prioritized and intensified collection maintenance in elementary libraries
- Spring 2024:
  - Finalize design plans
  - Plan logistics of moving and storing the elementary collection
- Summer 2024:
  - Demolition and construction in Harbor and Manor Libraries

# **Collection Review and Maintenance**

The following research-based methods guide the process of review and maintenance of our school library collections:

- CREW Method: Continuous Review, Evaluation and Weeding
  - Format, Reading Level, Current Interest, Visual Appeal, Curriculum
  - Formula (15/5/MUSTIE)—years since published; years since circulated; physical condition
- o MUSTIE Guidelines
  - $\boldsymbol{\mathsf{M}}$  Misleading
  - **U** Ugly
  - $\boldsymbol{S}$  Superseded
  - **T** Trivial
  - I Irrelevant
  - **E** Elsewhere
