























Envirothon is an international high school competition that allows students to compete in tournaments that range from regional level all the way to international level.

This year at the Mississippi Envirothon Area Competition, OHS Team A tied for first place in Current Events and Tanner Marquis and Kendal was second in the region.






"I was really excited about visiting the Nuremberg Zoo. I've always wanted to see the baby polar bears." Mattern says.







The National Honor Society sponsers two blood drives each year; one in April and one in October. Sponsor Joan Westmoreland said that close to 100 people gave blood during the two drives. Seniors who donated twice received red cords to wear at graduation.

"Most states are facing a critical shortage of blood, and this is the only way we can increase the supplies. We're so thankful for the students' generosity," Westmoreland said.


In order to give blood, donors had to be 17 or older and weigh at least 110 pounds.



McGraw reflects on Science Fair process




Jacqueline Chatman, being involved in school activities has made her experience easier than most.








Players Learn to Build a Team
