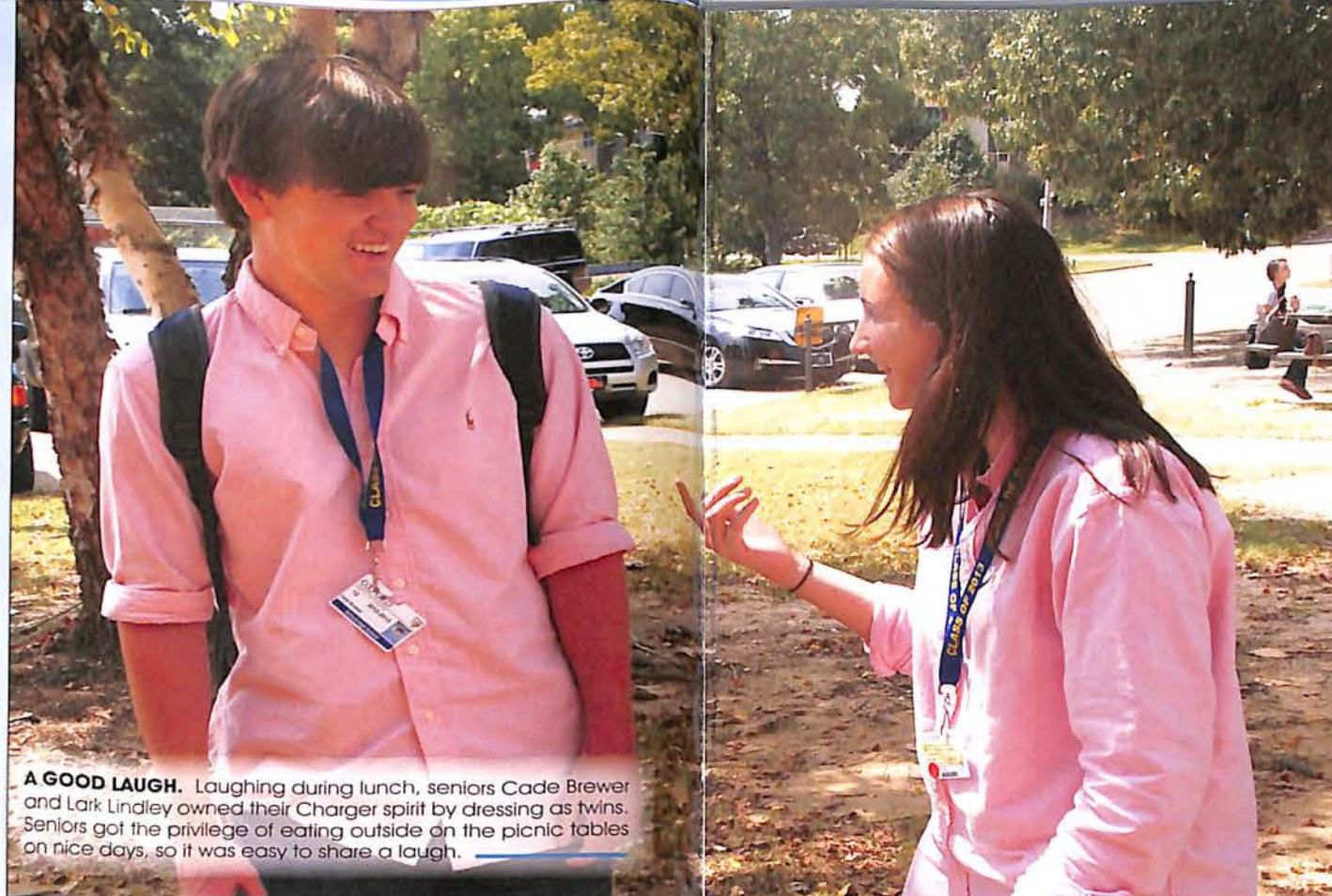

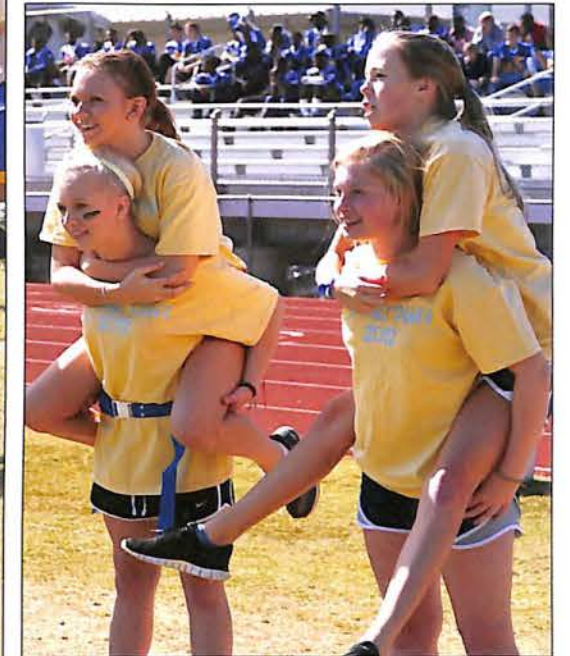

Phillips: "I was happy to (be Brandy's escort)."

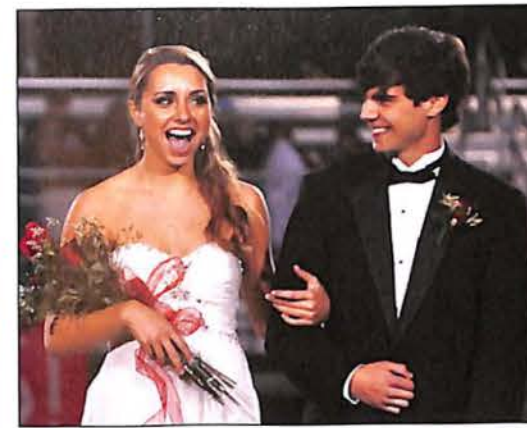
Q: Was the day and night stressful or just a good experience?

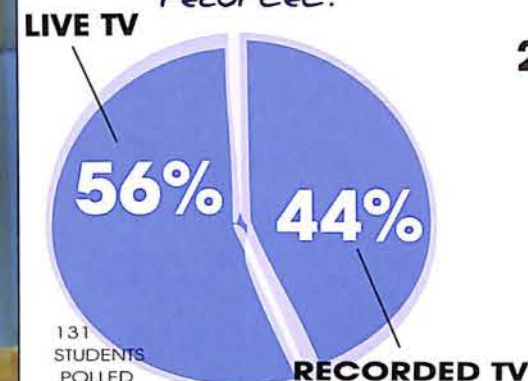

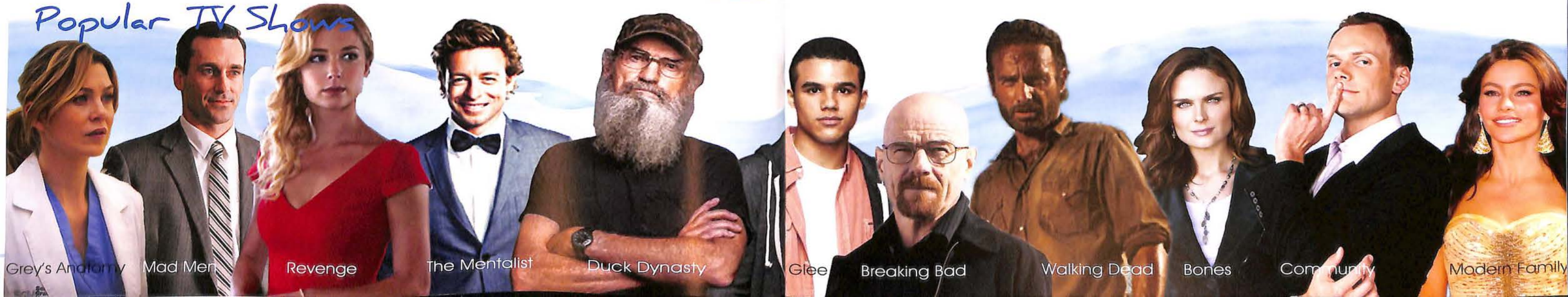

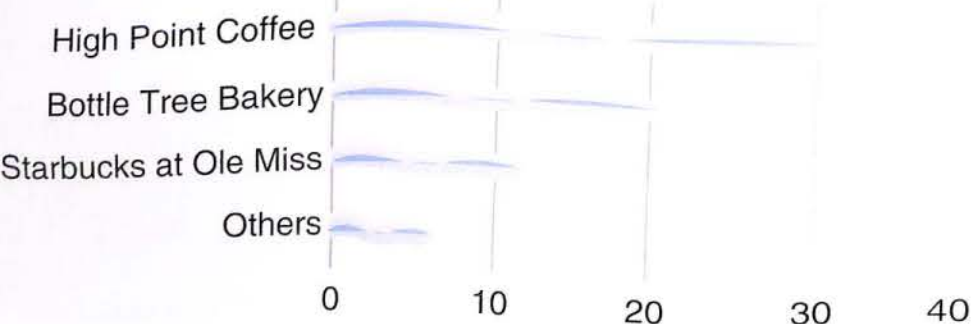

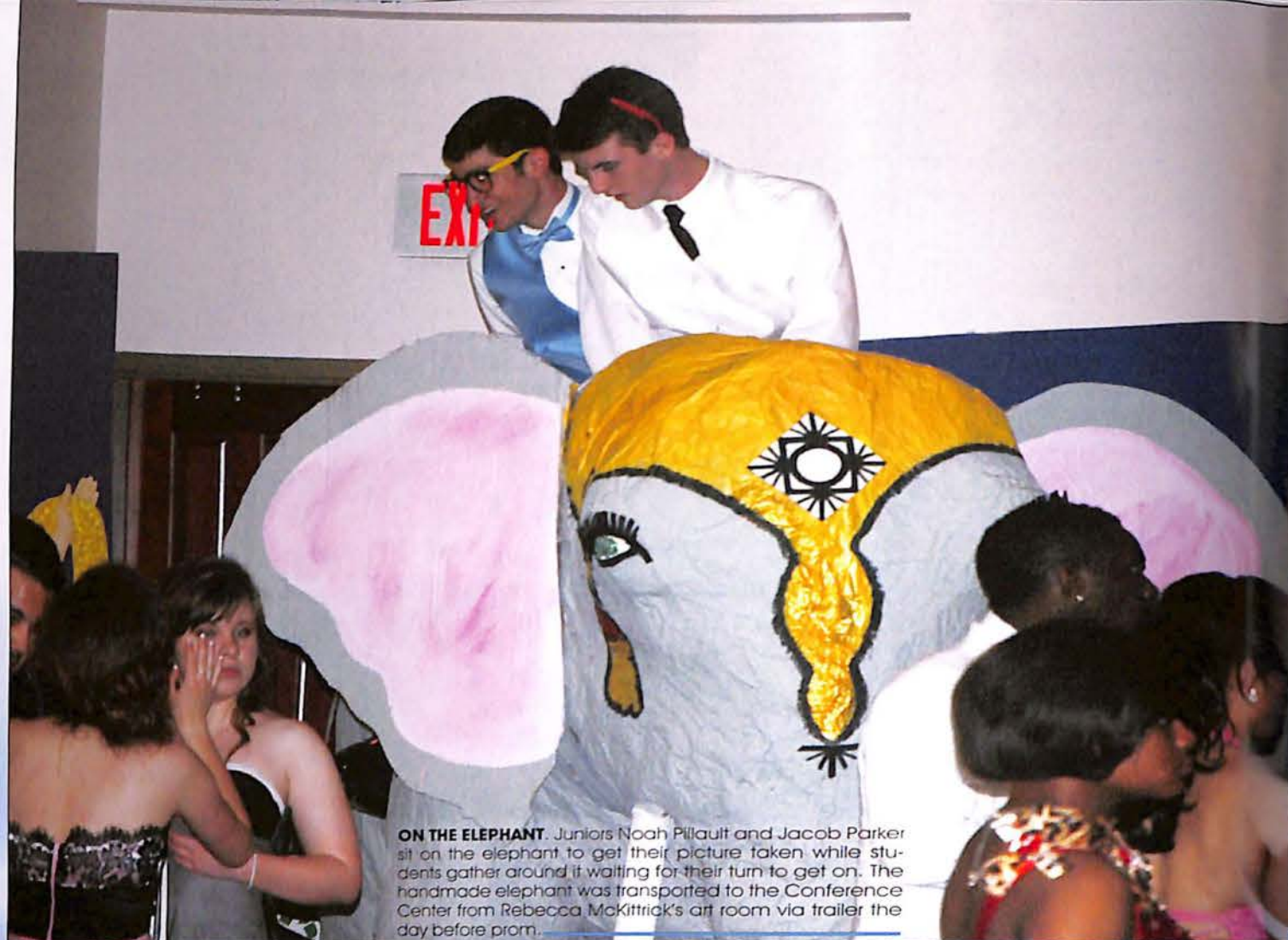

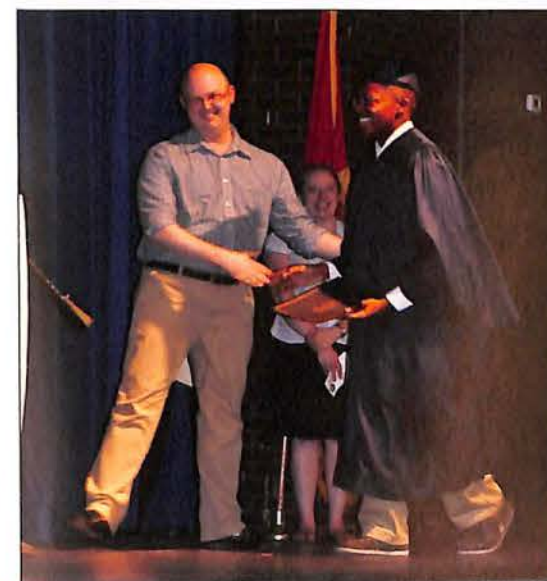

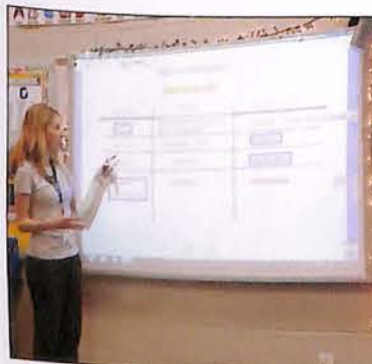

"I absolutely, one hundred percent, no doubt thought I was going to win," he said, because he knew he had been playing Power Rangers since he was young.

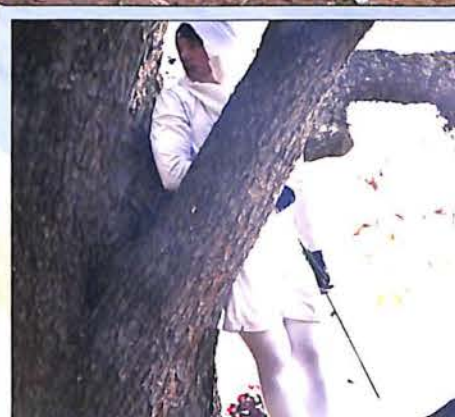

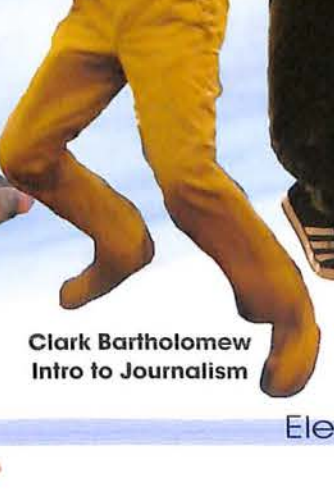

EDUCATION at the SCOTT CENTER

Students from the Scott Center need to learn independence so that they can enjoy life to the max. In order for the students to reach their maximum potential, their educational plan may require some or all of the following: physical therapy, occupational therapy, functional math, language, daily living, social/behavioral and recreational which prepares the students for transitioning.

What is a transition program? A transition program is a set of services which includes instruction, community awareness, exploration, as well as school-based employment training opportunities. The purpose of the OSD Transition Program is to provide learning opportunities to prepare students to gain the knowledge and skills needed to move toward employment within the local community. The transition program provides students with an array of instructional opportunities and settings to enable them to acquire "real job" experiences before they exit school.

The students experience realistic work-related opportunities for hands-on training to prepare for employment or to be entrepreneurs.

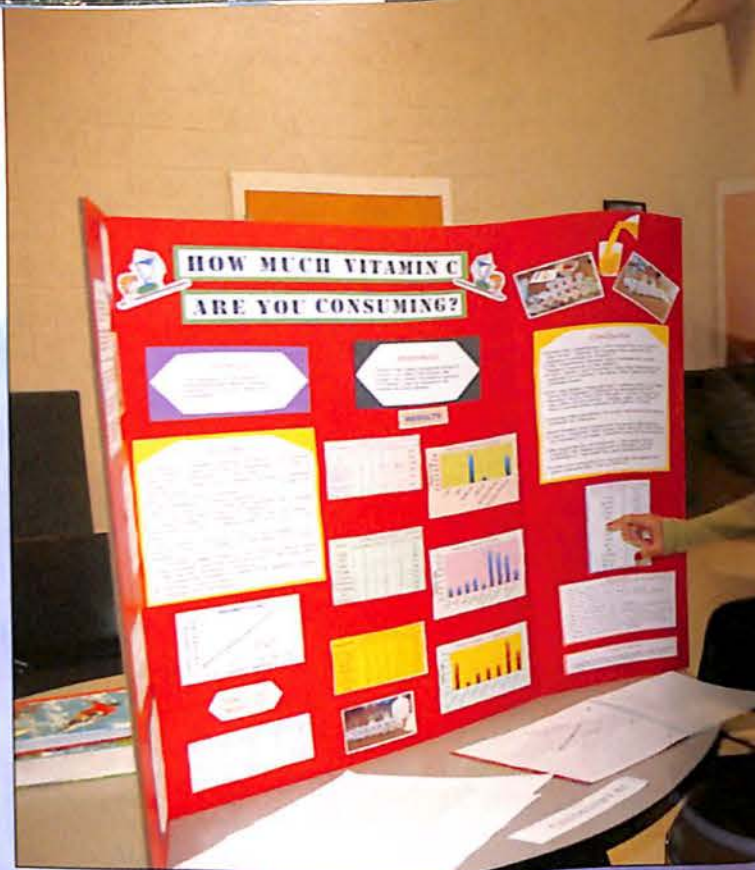

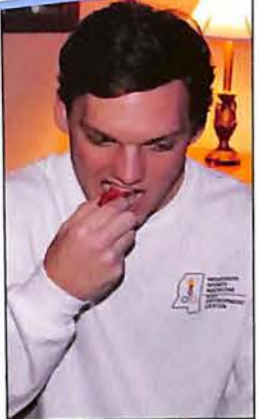

This friendly atmosphere opens up new experiences for new students, which allows them to meet new people.

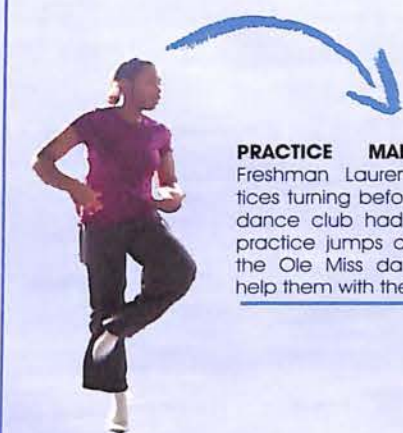
"I enjoyed it. There were different people and new faces. It was fun," said freshman Elisha Webb.

Wright and Hickey plan to continue the club next year in order to continue building the female students' confidence.

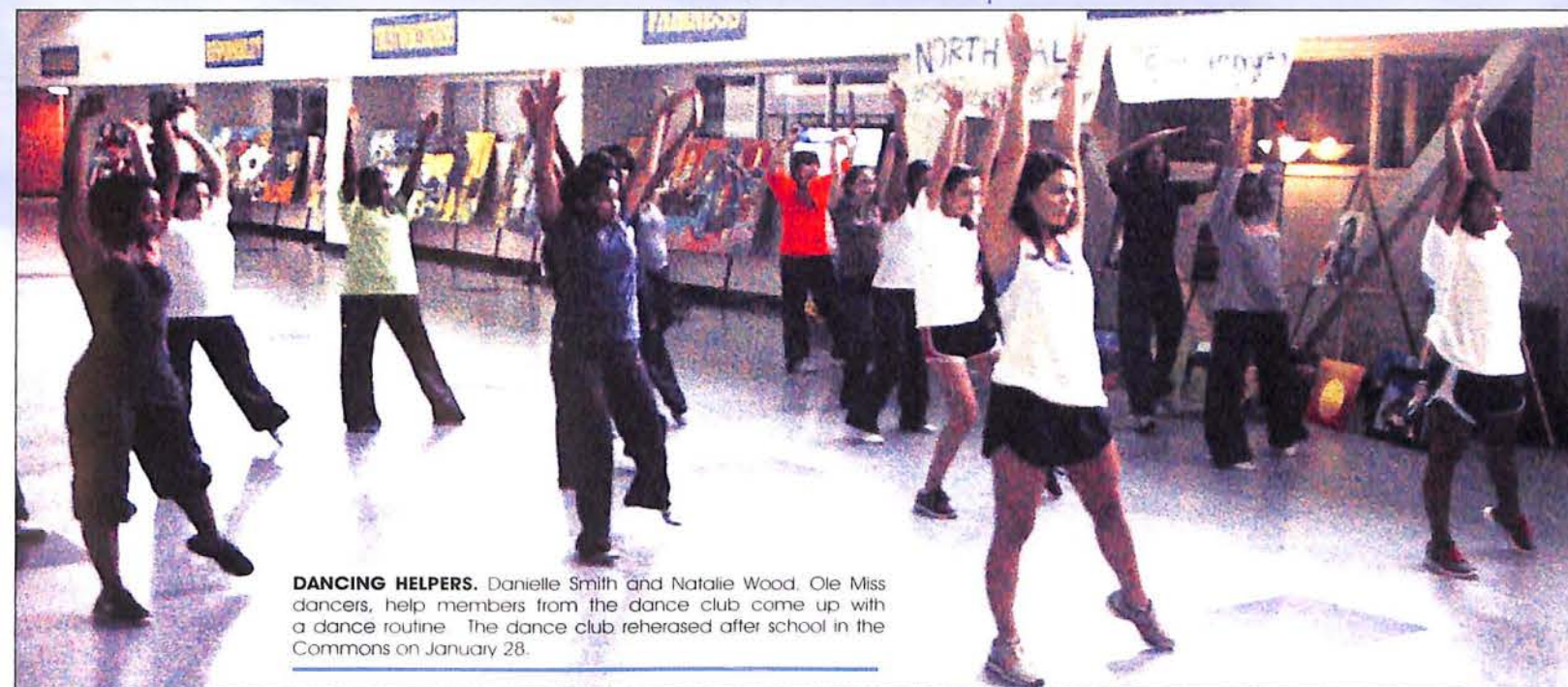

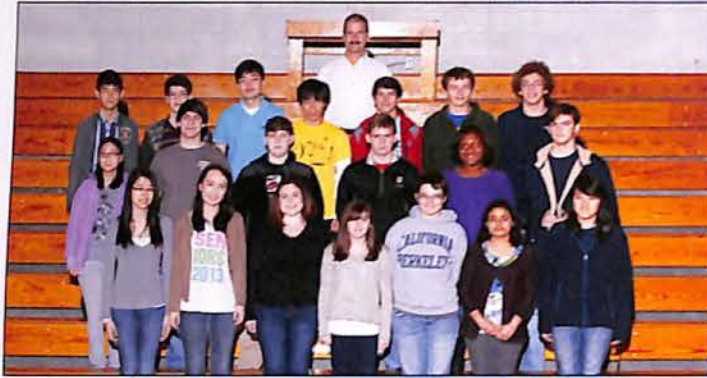

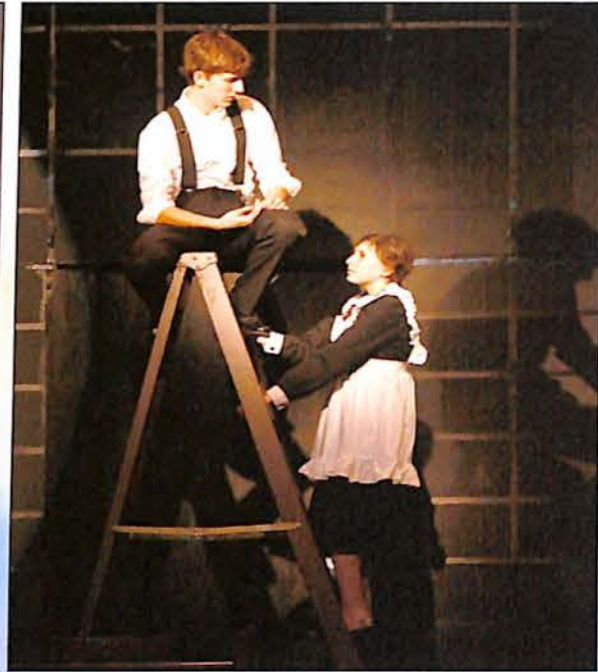

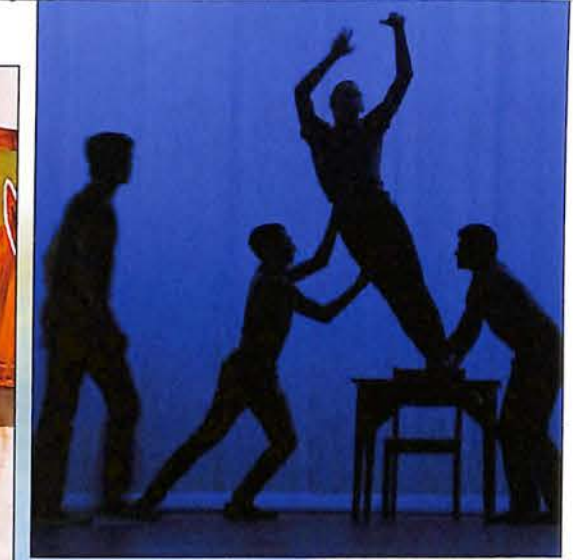

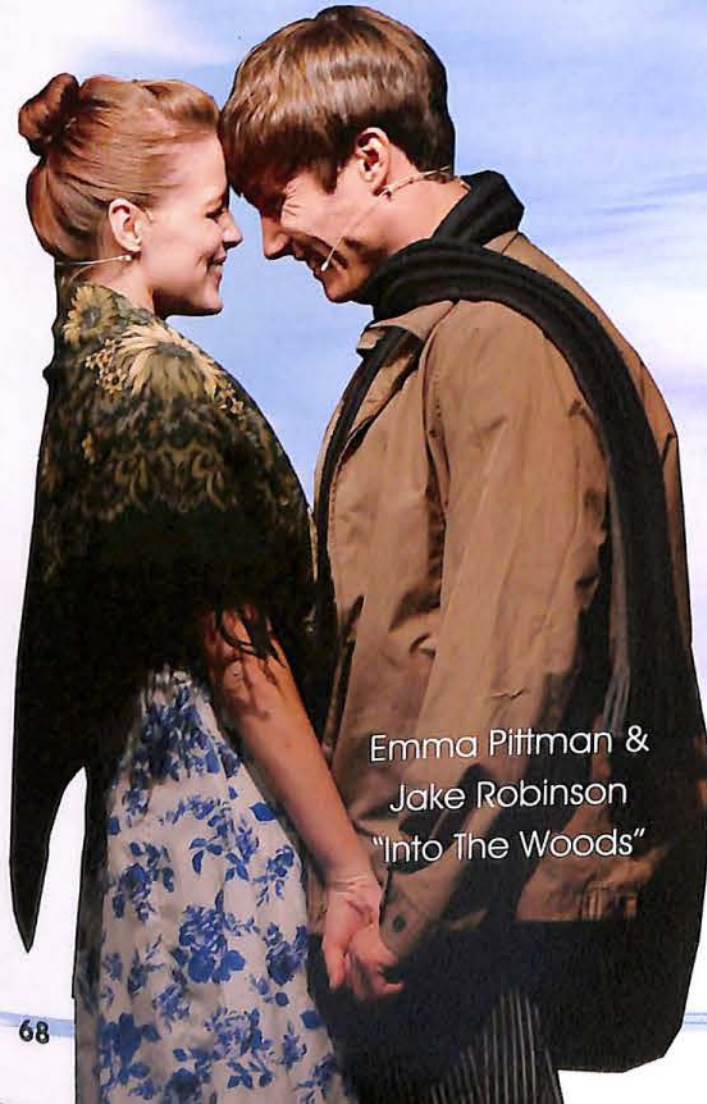

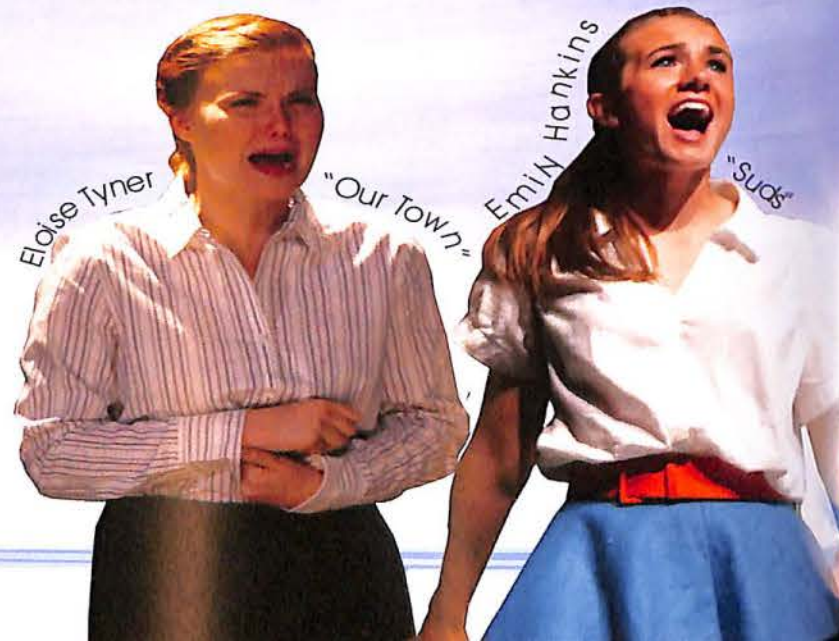

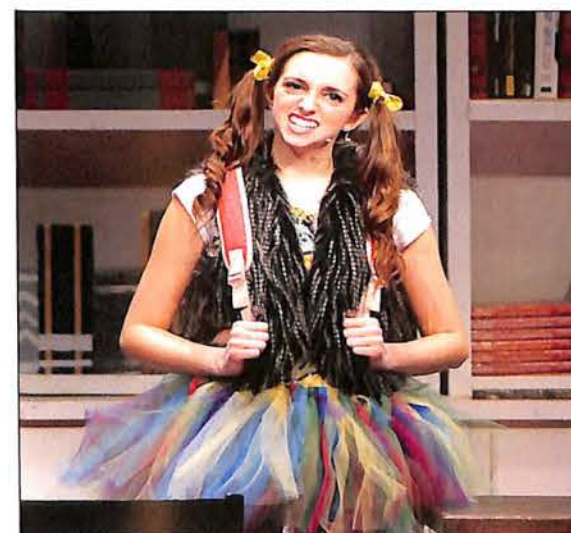

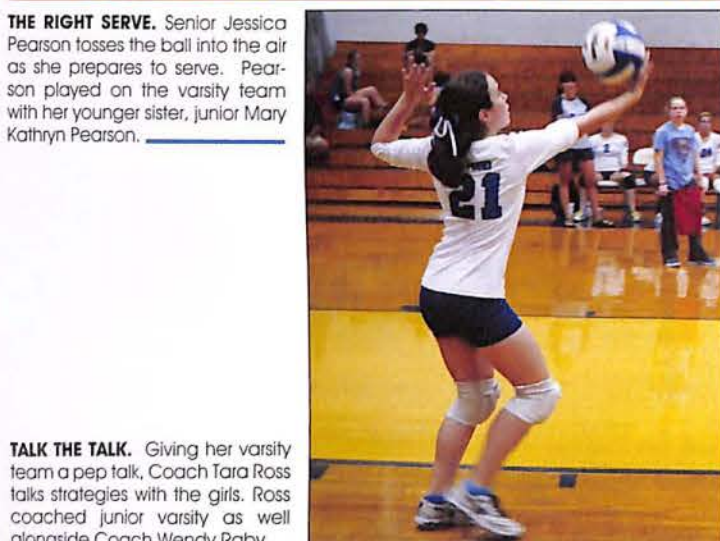

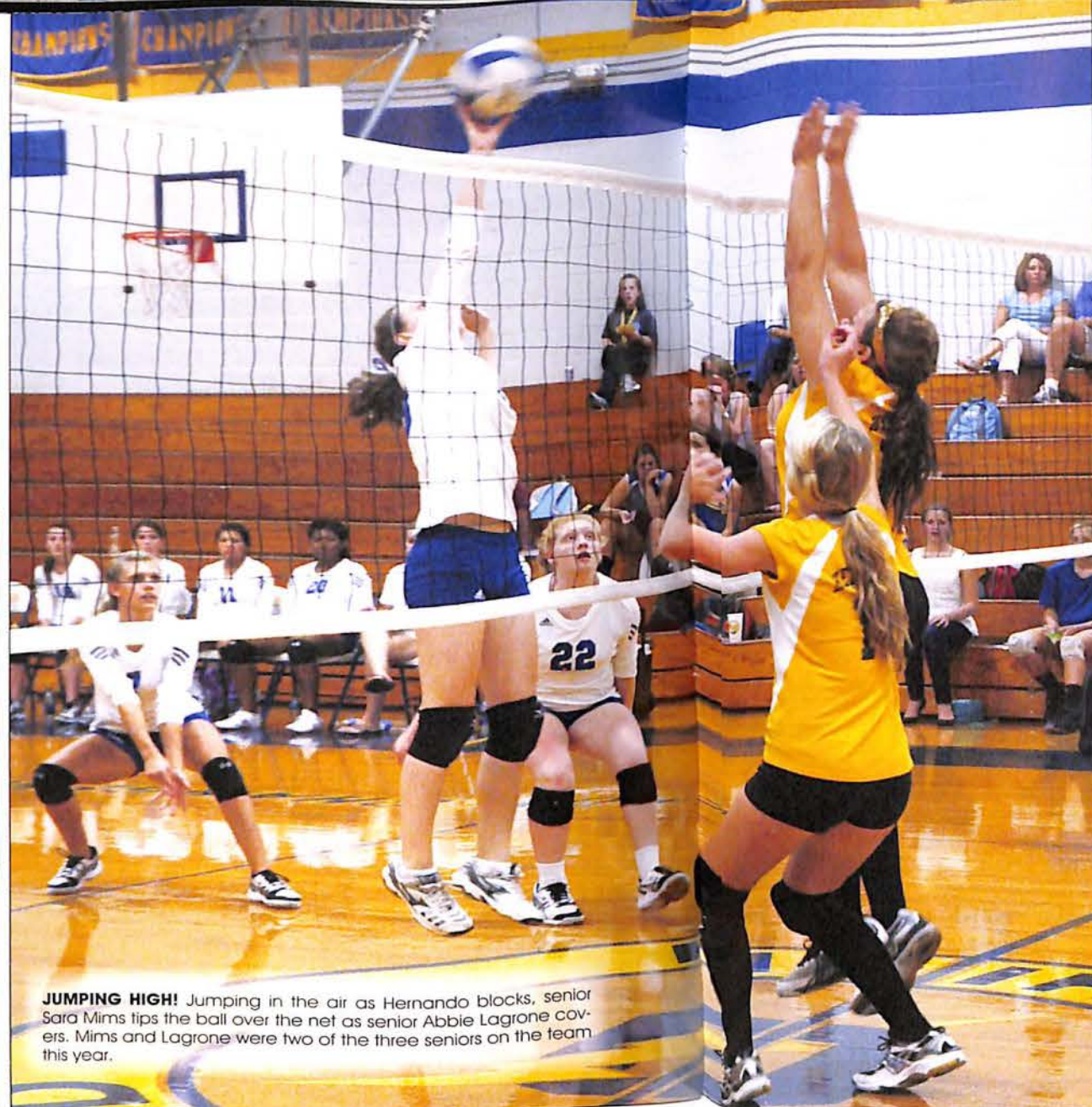

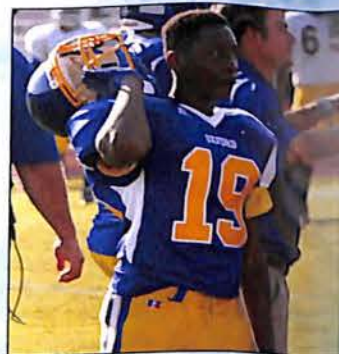

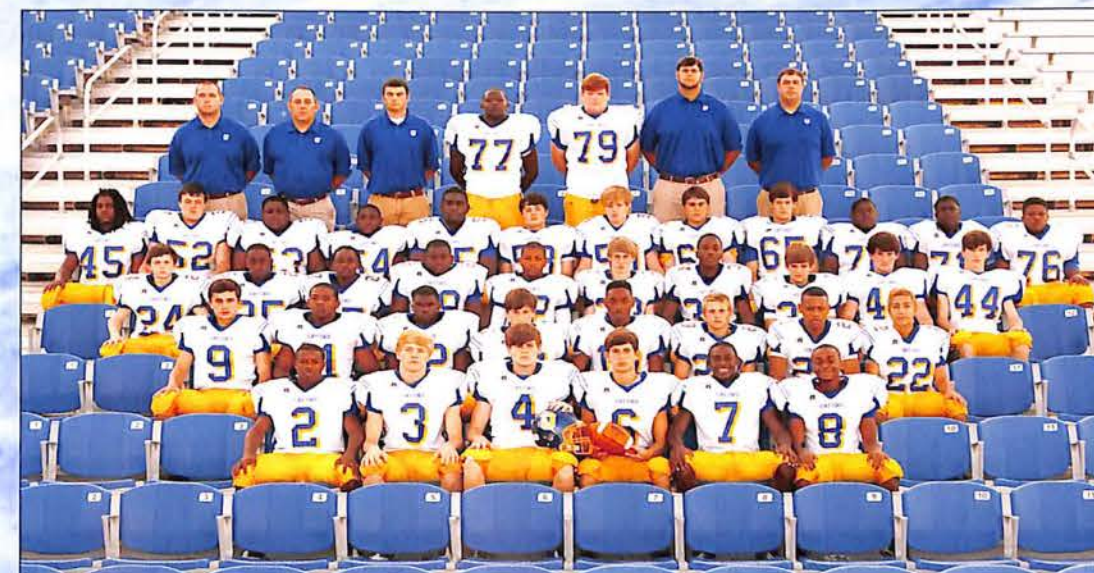

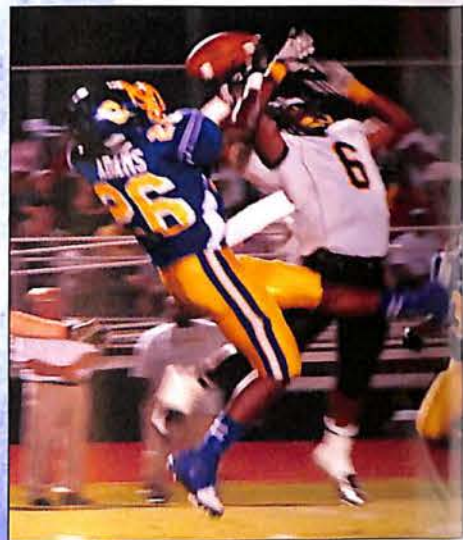

"I have been in athletics a long time and this is my first championship," Russell said. "It was really nice

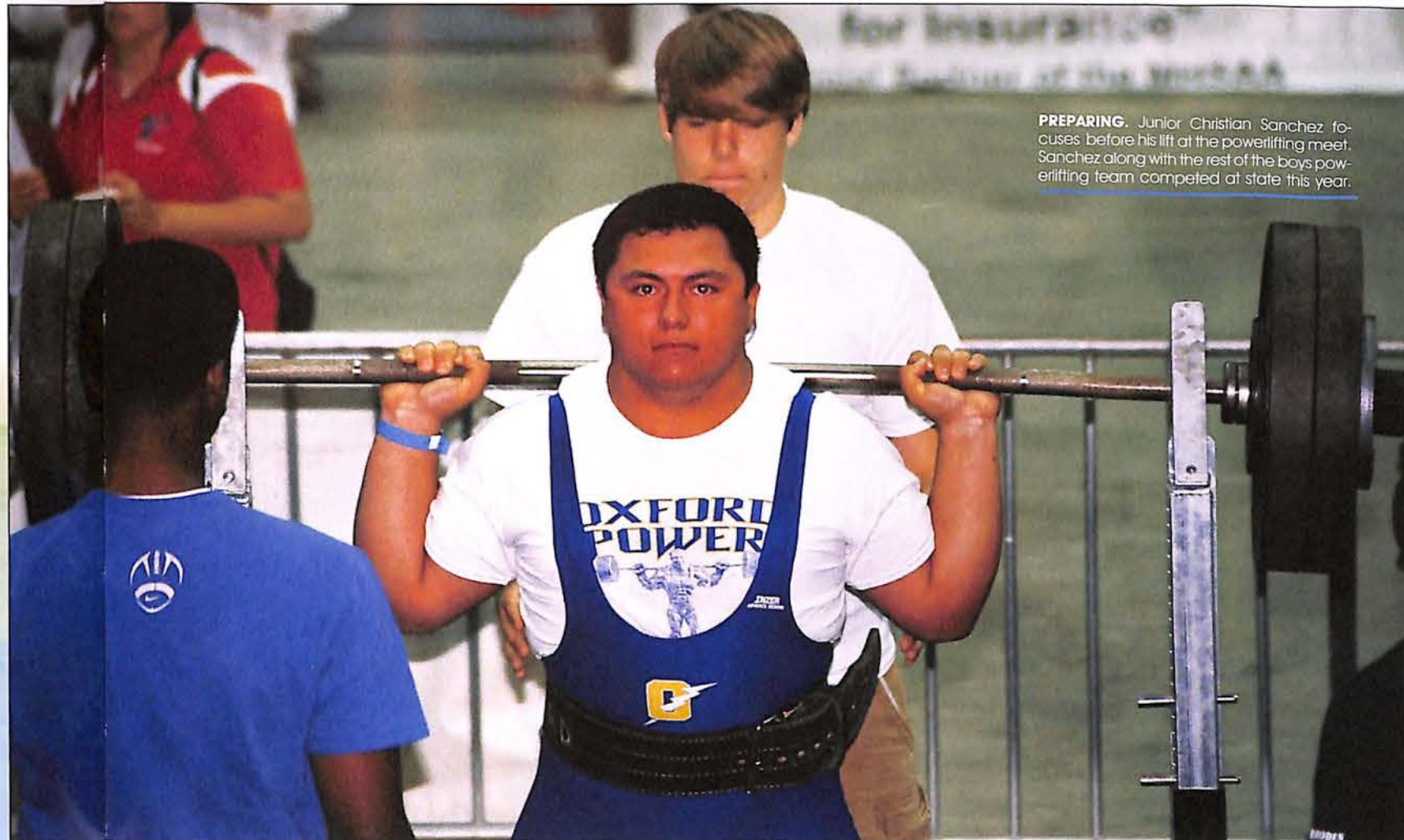
to be able to say we are the best in the state."

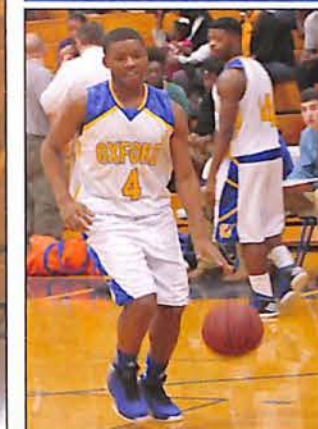
"(The seniors) all can lead well," O'Keefe said.

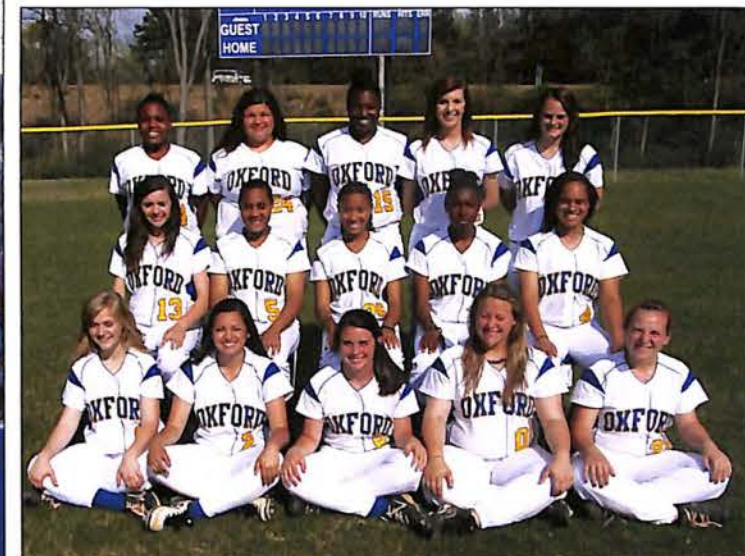

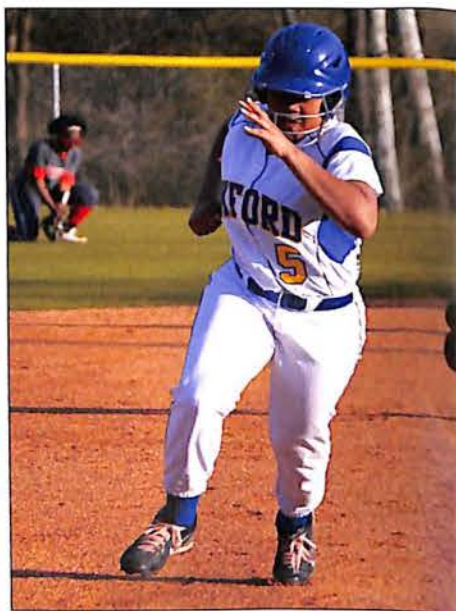

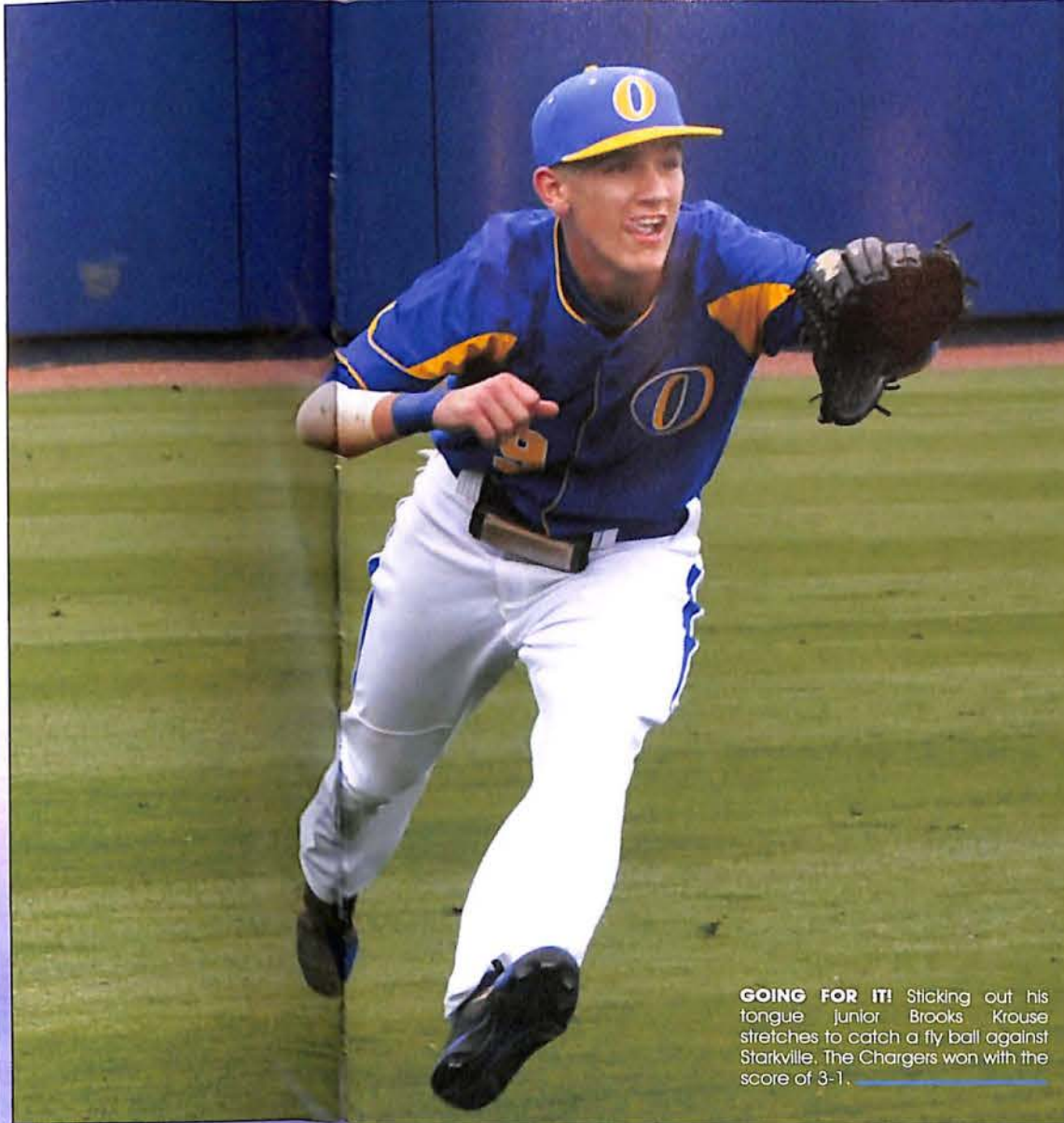

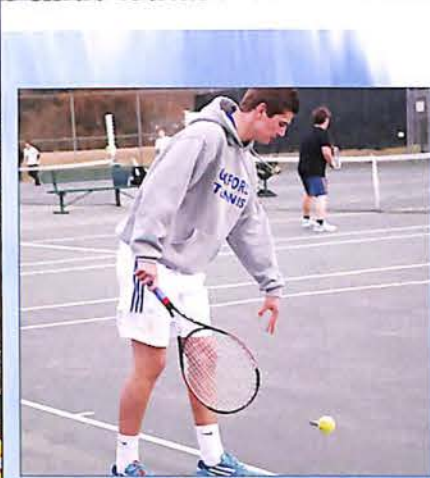

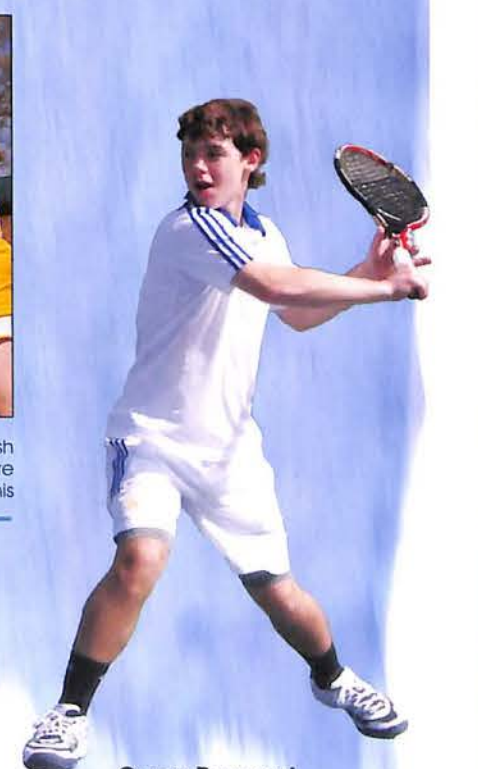

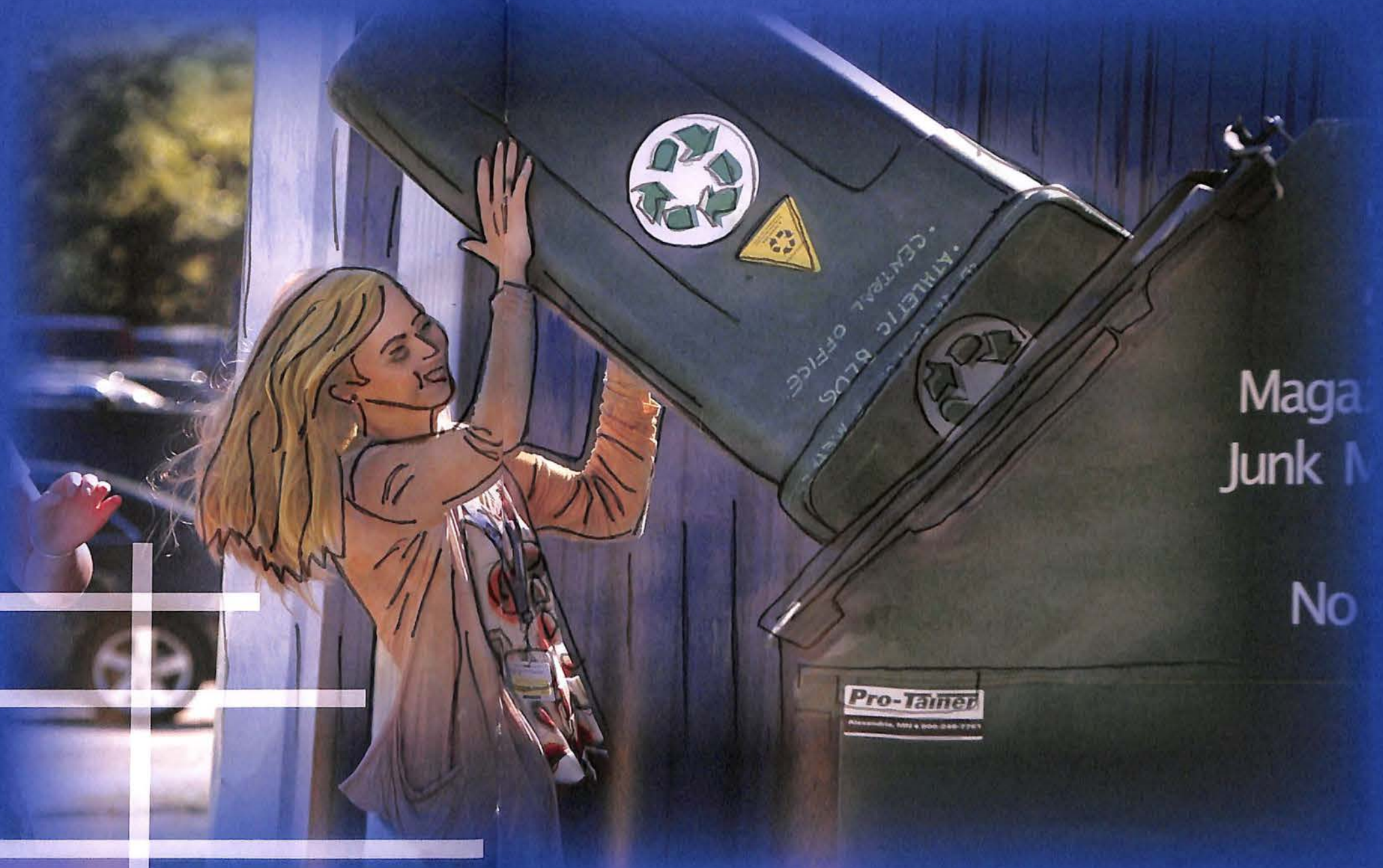

We spent many hours at sporting events, awards ceremonies, and in the hallways hunting for people to get their pictures, their signatures or their senior quotes. We have to

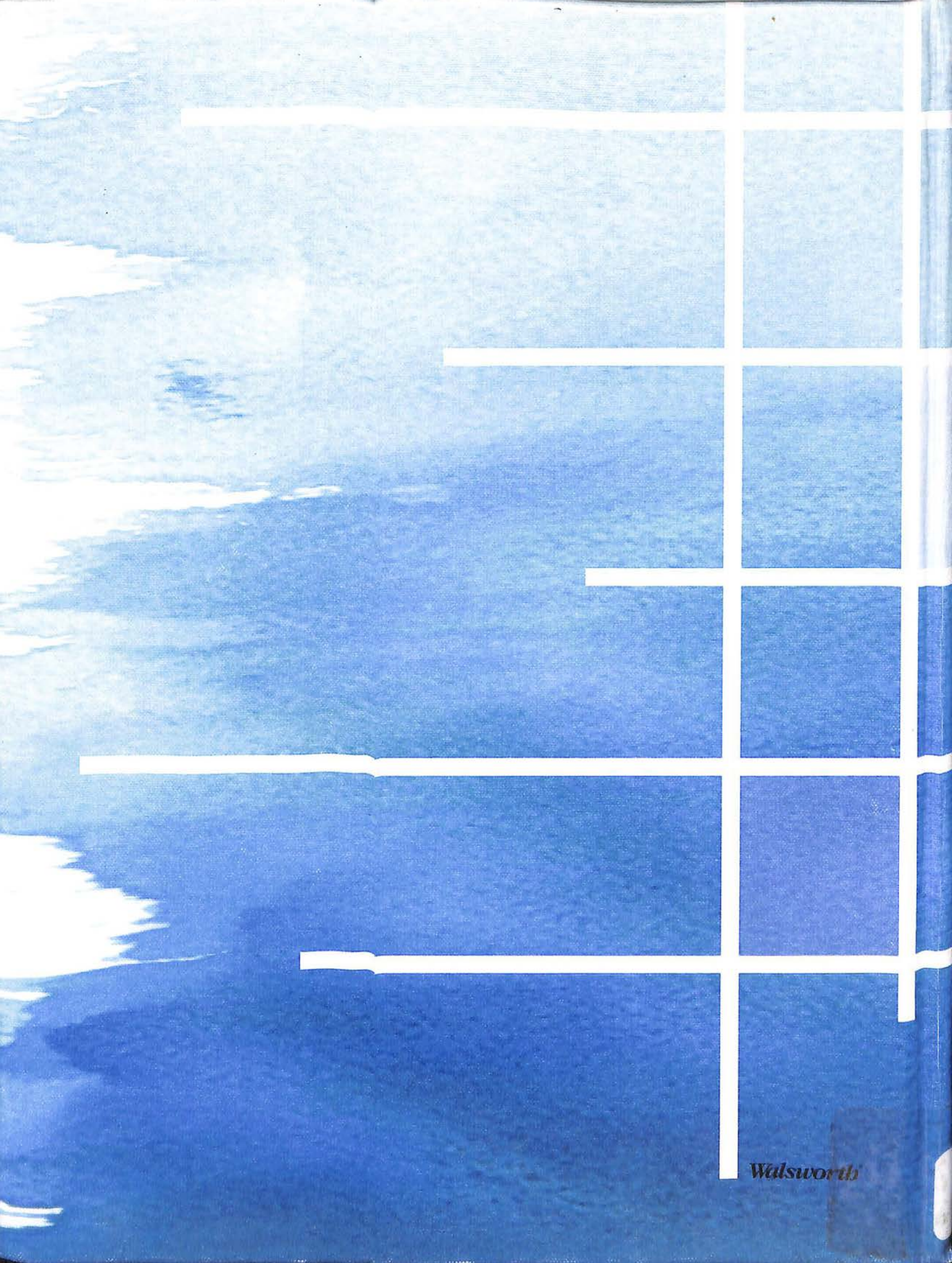
