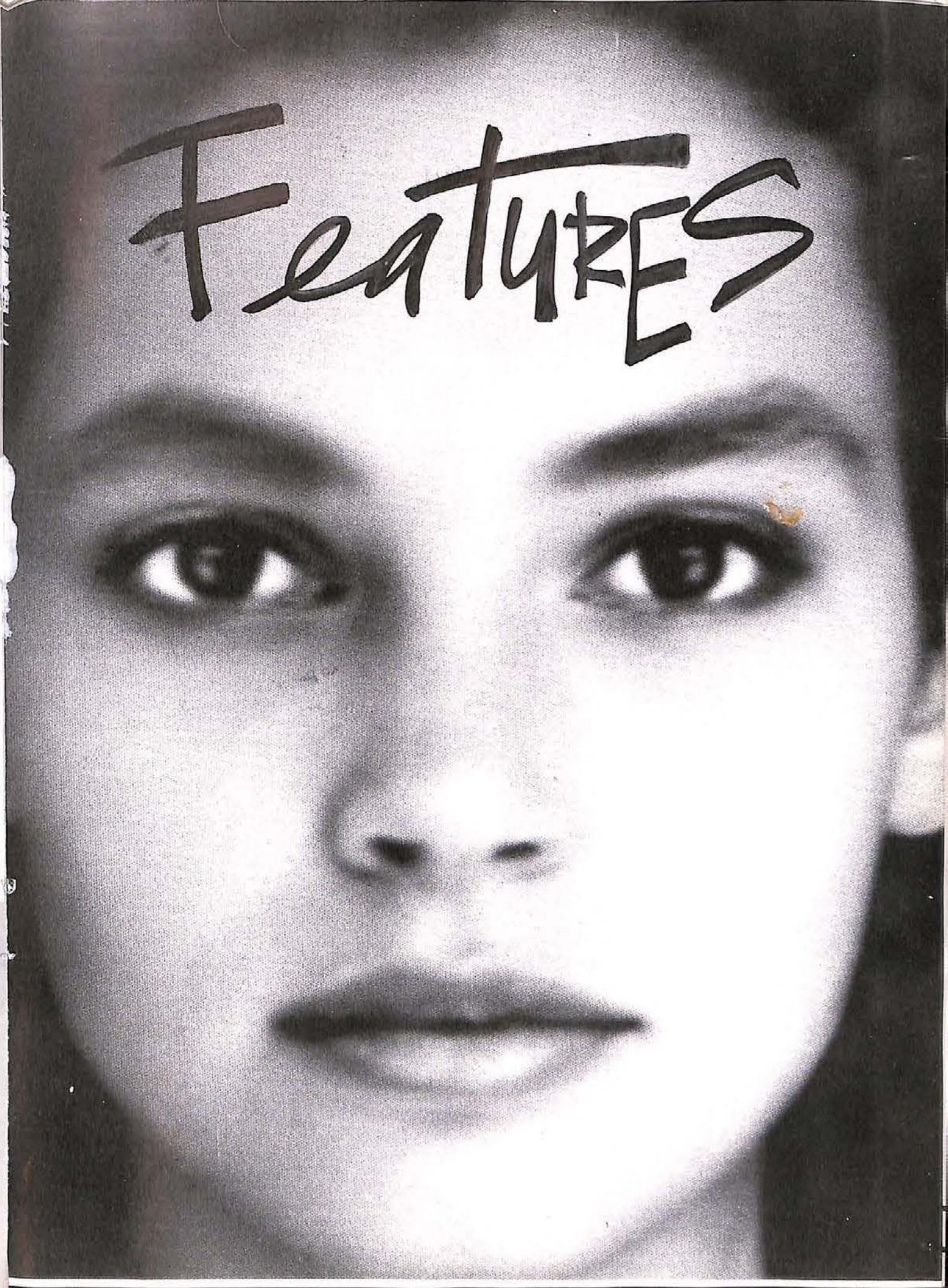
Dedication

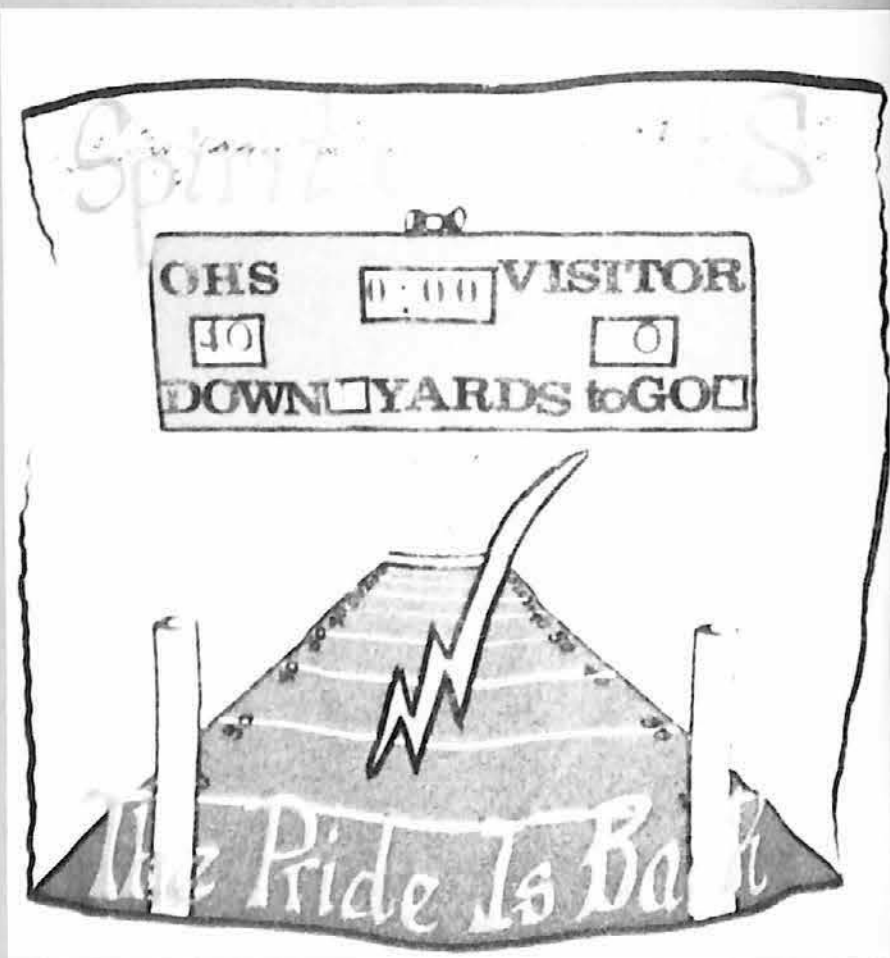

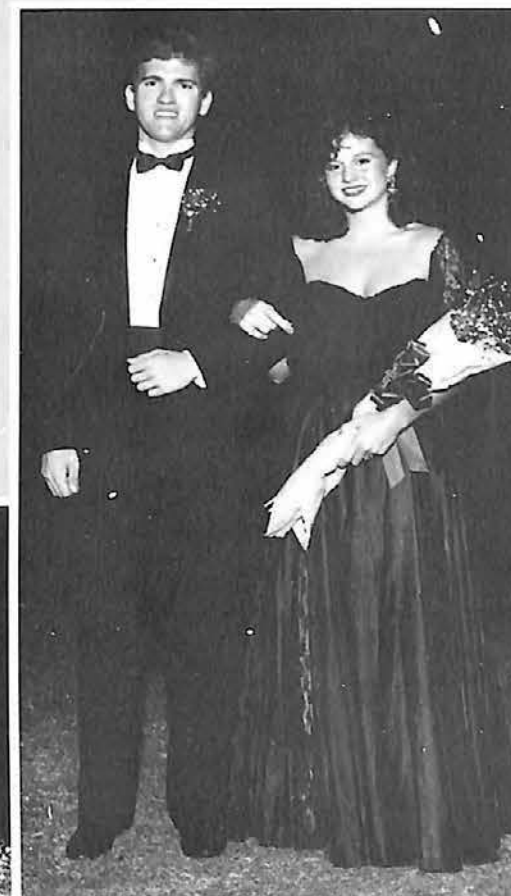

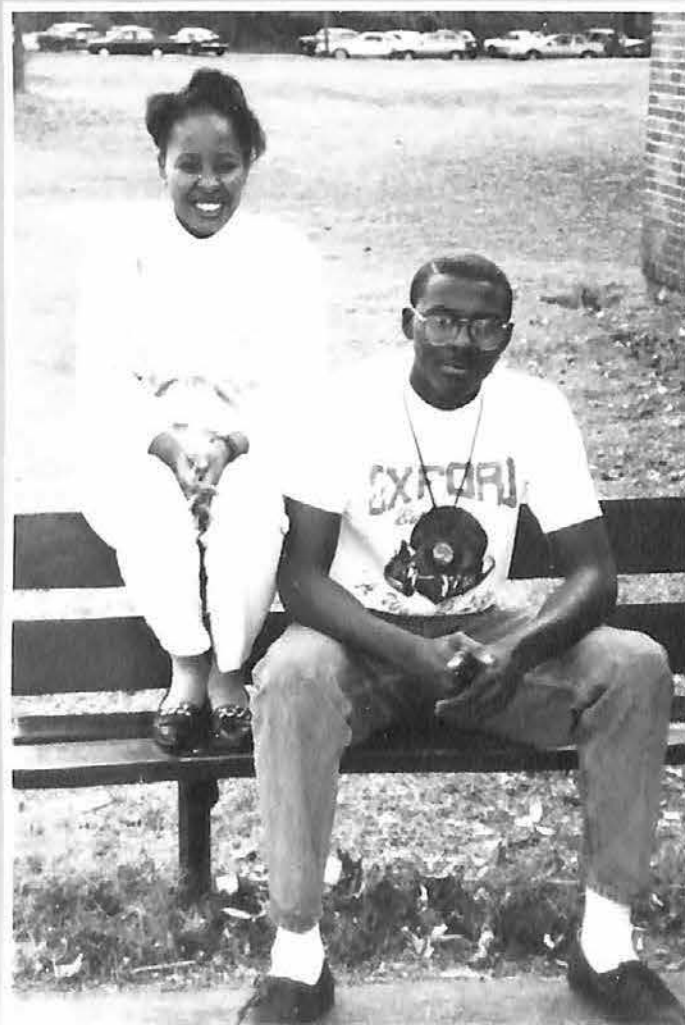
BEST ALL AROUND
