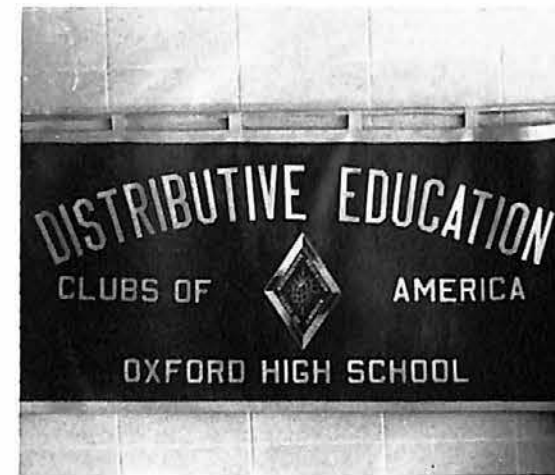
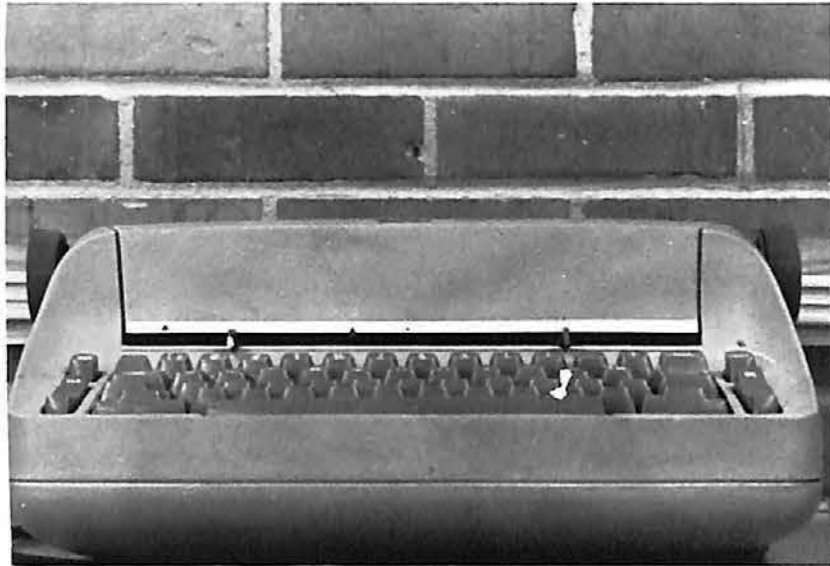
PRE-MED CLUB

This is the Bicentennial, the 200th anniversary of our nation's birth. The United States has had an exciting life for such a young country, but just think of what she has before

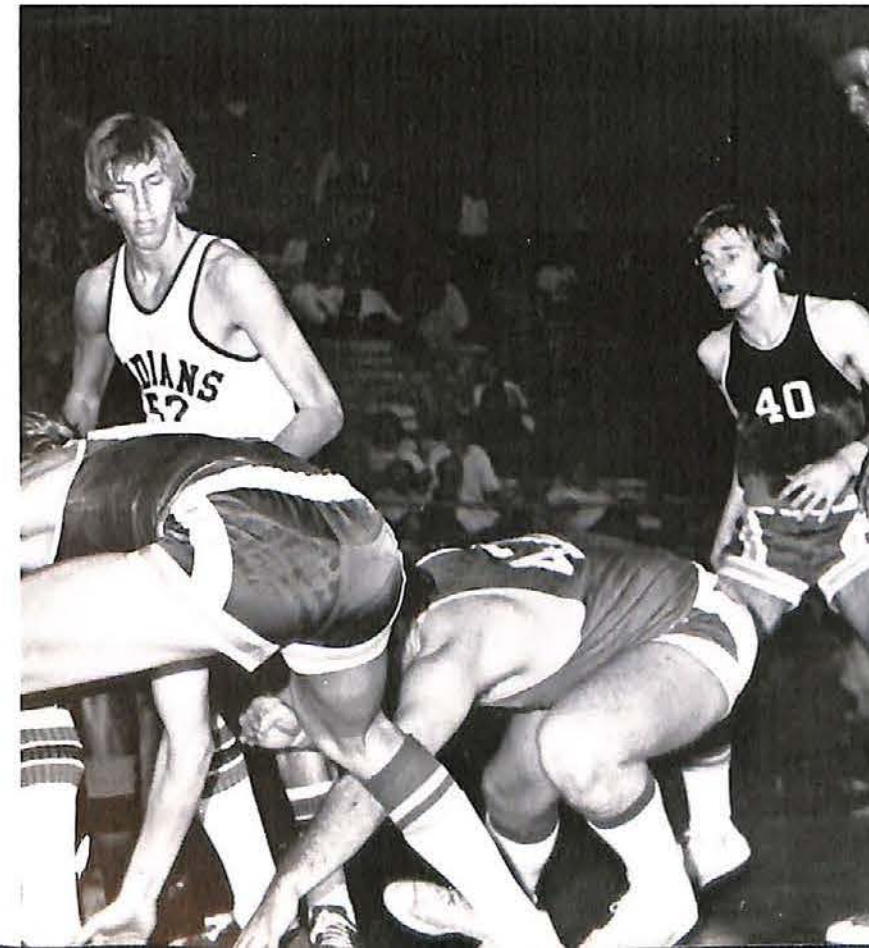
her. We are the generation that will determine what her future will hold. Take advantage of all your vast opportunities.

OHS Goes to State

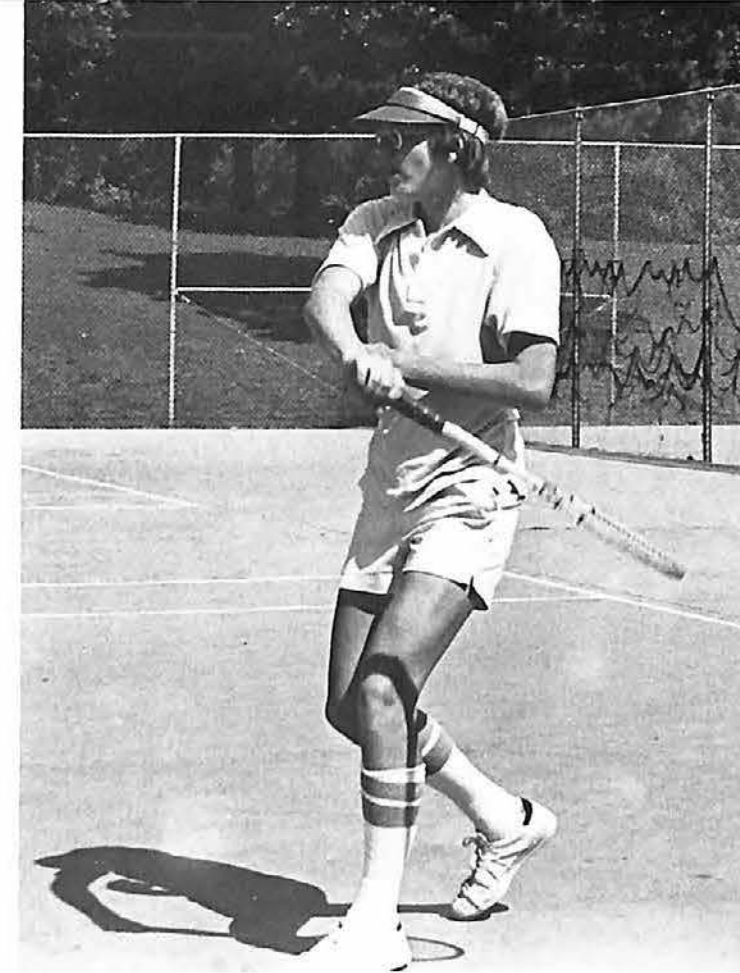

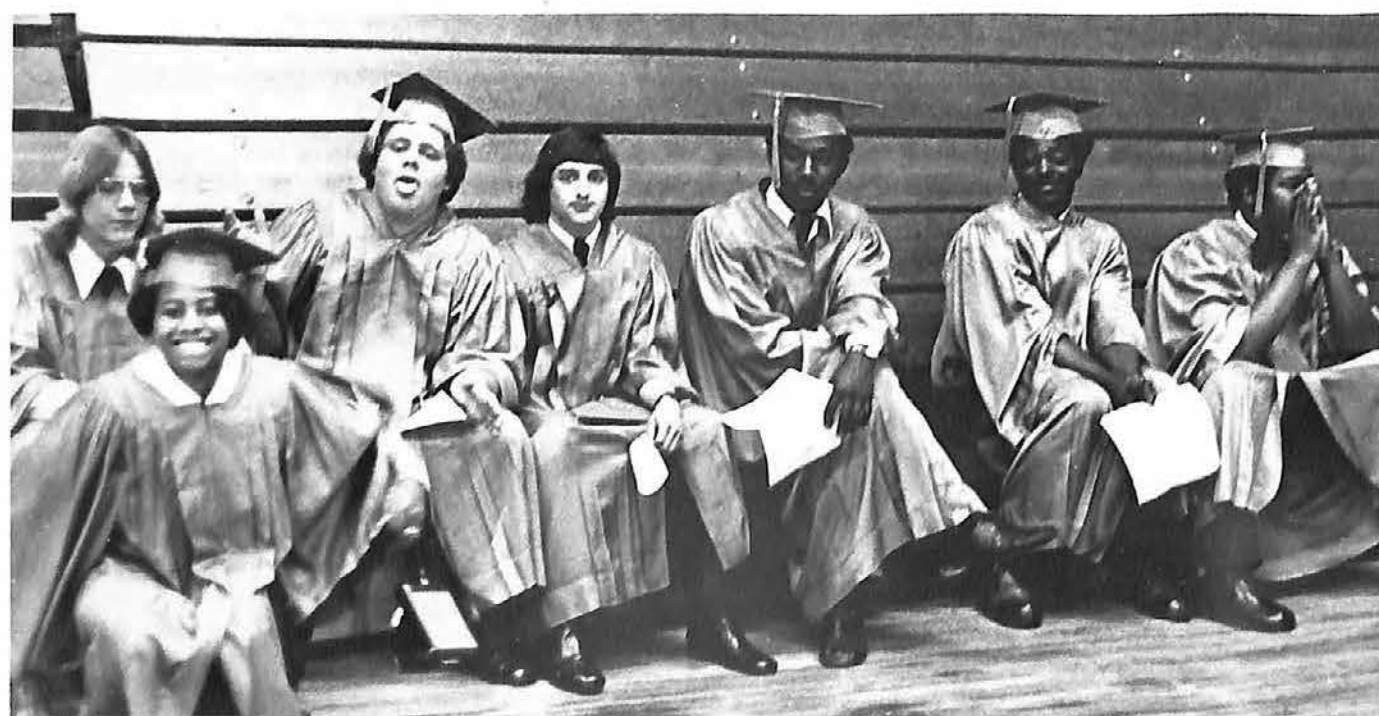
