




The Woodwind Ensemble is a club of talented woodwind instrumentalists. The Club is sponsored by Mr. Roben Work.

The Varsity Chorus, under the direction of Mr. E. D. Forte, is composed of students selected through individual tryouts. The group participates in assemblies and school concerts.




BRASS ENSEMBLE

The Chess Club this year increased its membership by over 100%. The organization was begun to create an interest in and provide practice time for the game of chess.




This is the business club's second year at OHS. It too increased its membership by more than 100%. The club sponsor is Mrs. Maxie Lee Work.


Y-Teens this year was both an A Club, and a B club. Both groups had the same objectives, constitution, and sponsors. The groups tried to meet together after school and have joint activities.

A Word About the Club Program at OHS

Oxford High School offers two types of clubs — A and B. At the beginning of each school year, club selection sheets are circulated and each student signs for an A club and/or B club, or an A and/or B study hall. The program provides for meeting times for each club, and promotes education outside the classroom, fellowship, and recreation.

Signing for a club is comparable to signing for another class. Unfortunately, this often means a long list of club members who are there simply to avoid study hall. Only four meeting periods are provided for each club during the year, so clubs must often meet after school. This year club meeting times have been rotated so that the same class is not interrupted every time, and so that B and I students will not miss so many club meetings. They often miss anyway. though. Clubs may charge dues, but may only have one fund-raising project during the year. Also, students must sign for something under the A column, and something under the B column. Students may not belong to two A clubs or two B clubs.

OHS is appreciative of its club program. Appreciative, however, does not mean that there is no room for improvement.




