Oxford went 6-3 in regular season play. The Chargers played in the Oxford Civitan Bowl and defeated Lafayette 3-0 to take the first place trophy. In basketball, Oxford posted a 12-14 record. However, Oxford won the Little Ten Tournament and also placed second in the District II Tournament. In track, Oxford excelled by sending three events to the State Tournament. Kenny Mullin won the State high jump. The Charger Tennis Team went to the State Tournament in three events.
