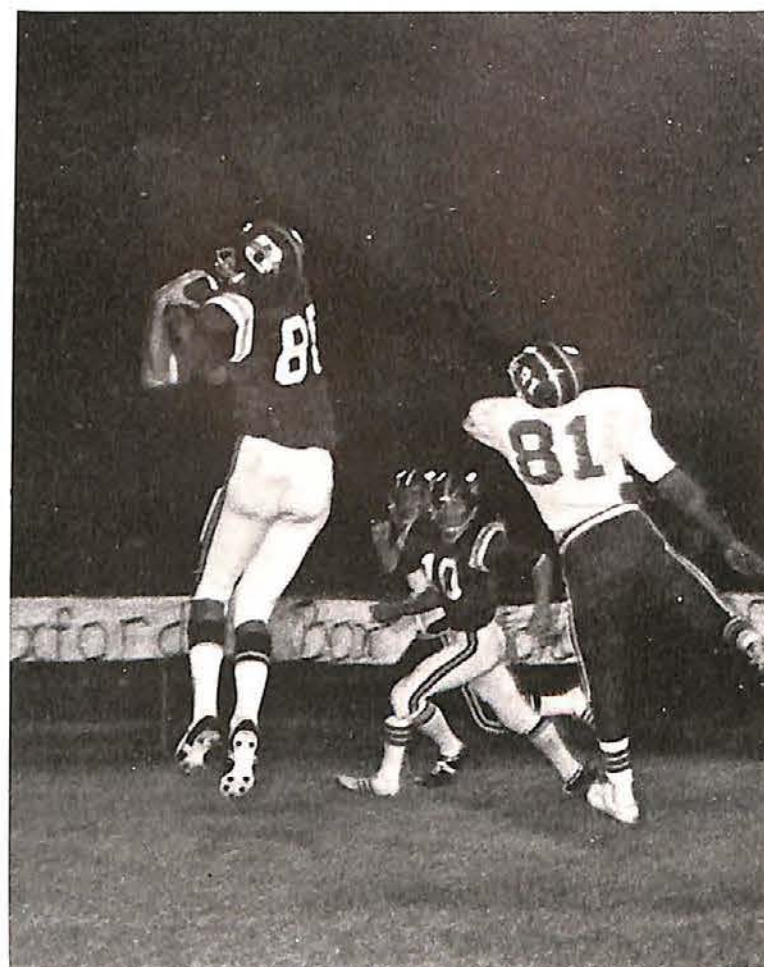




## Little Ten Championship

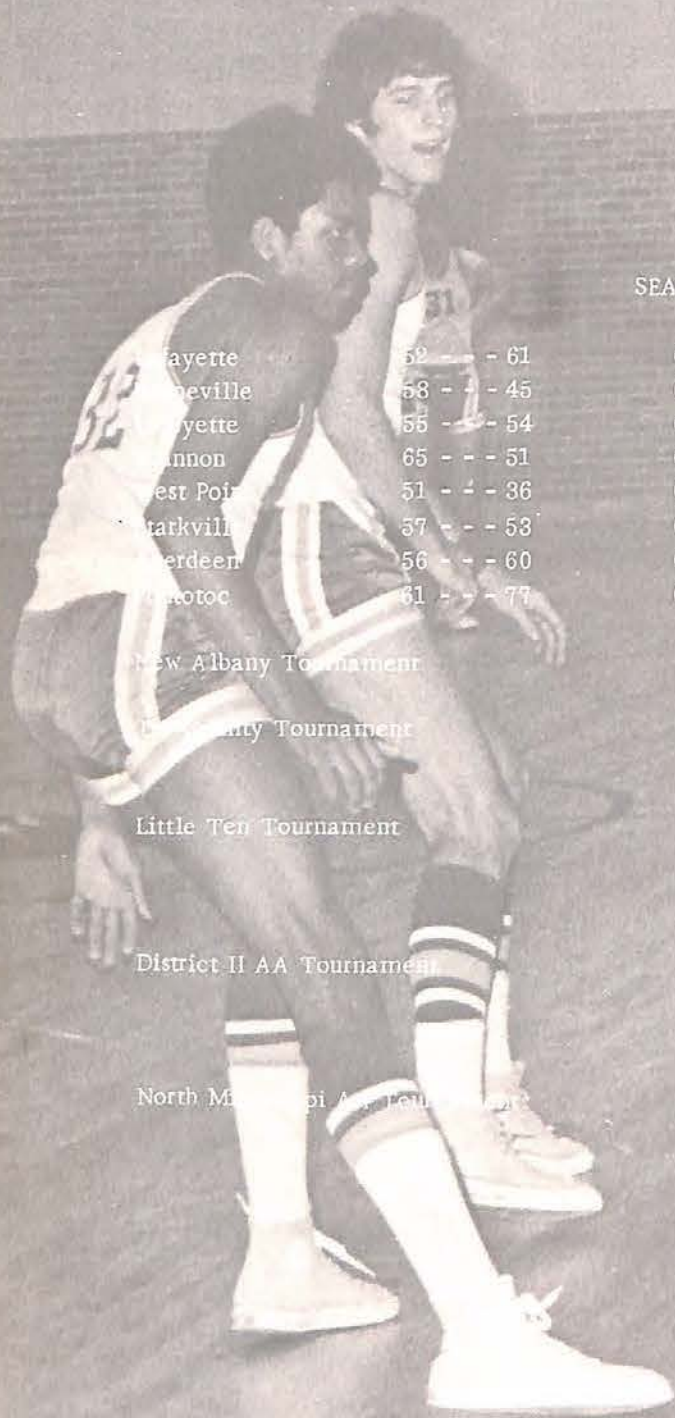


## Oxford Civitan Bowl

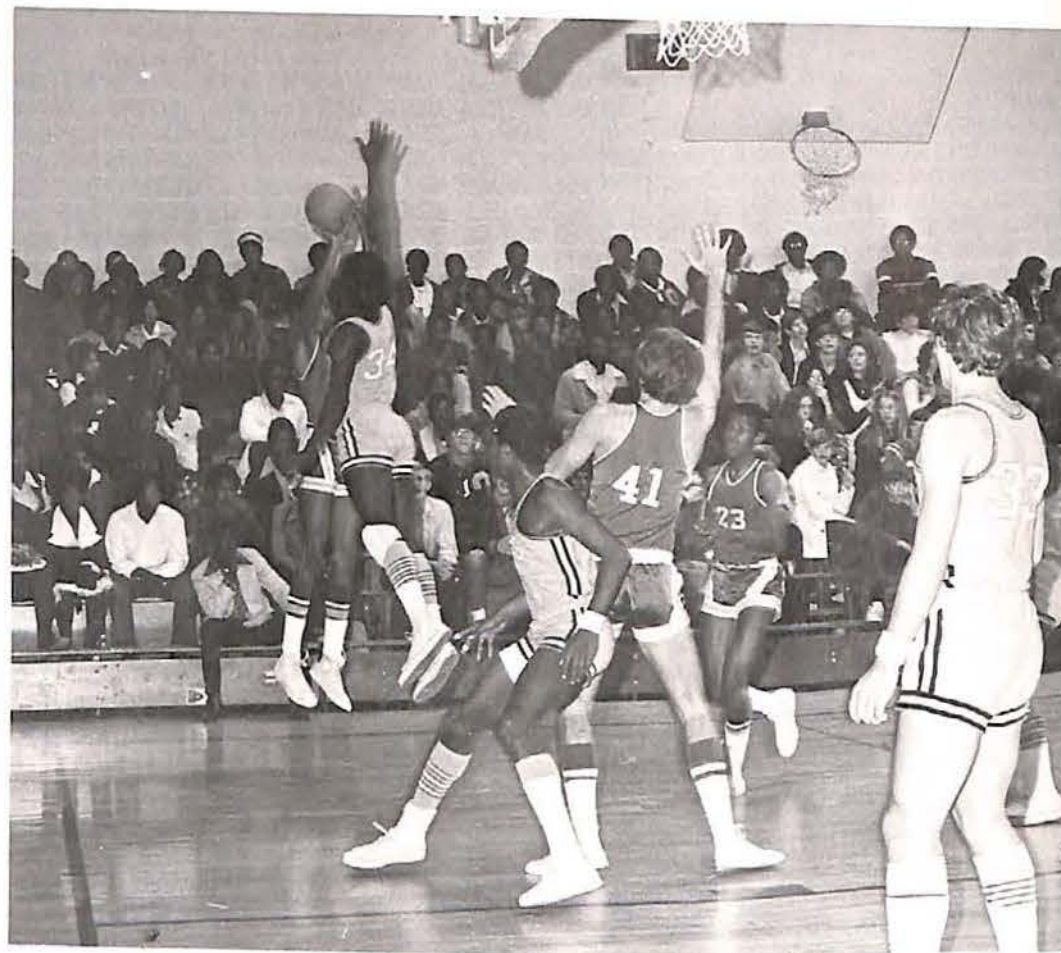
