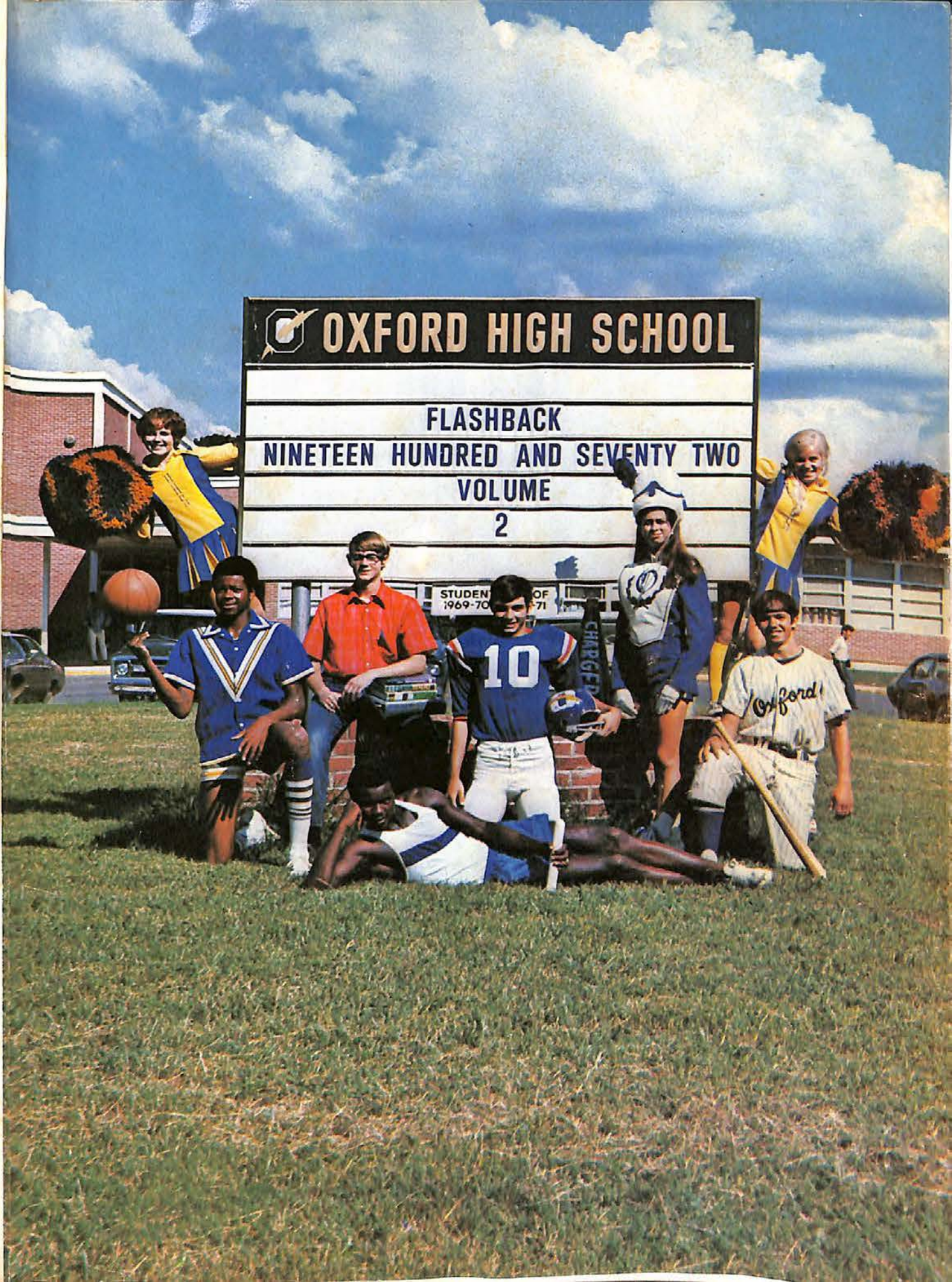

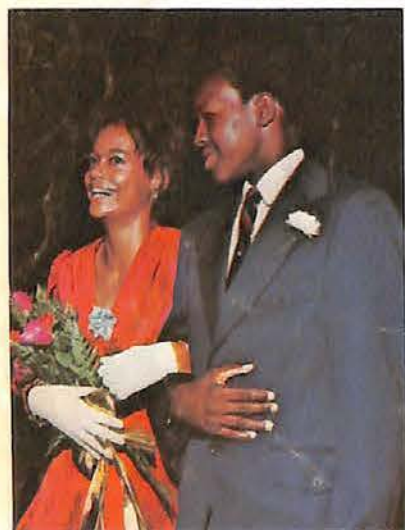

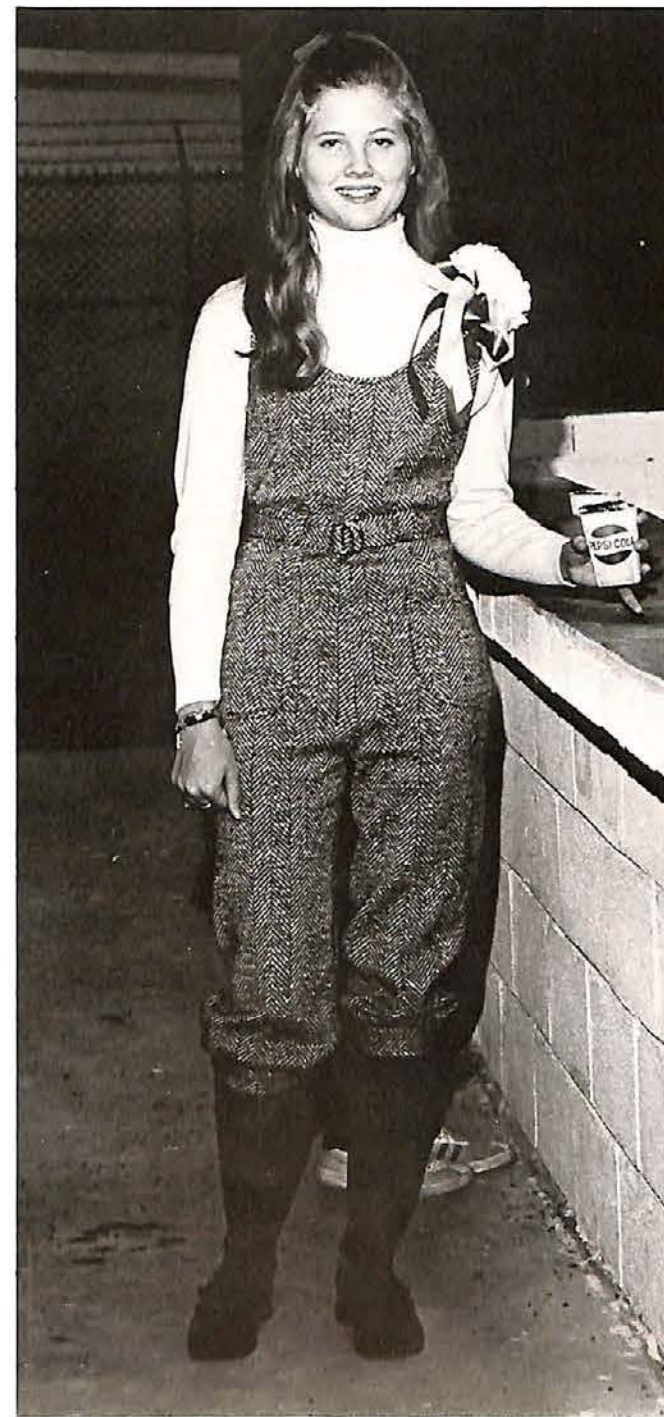




## Foreword

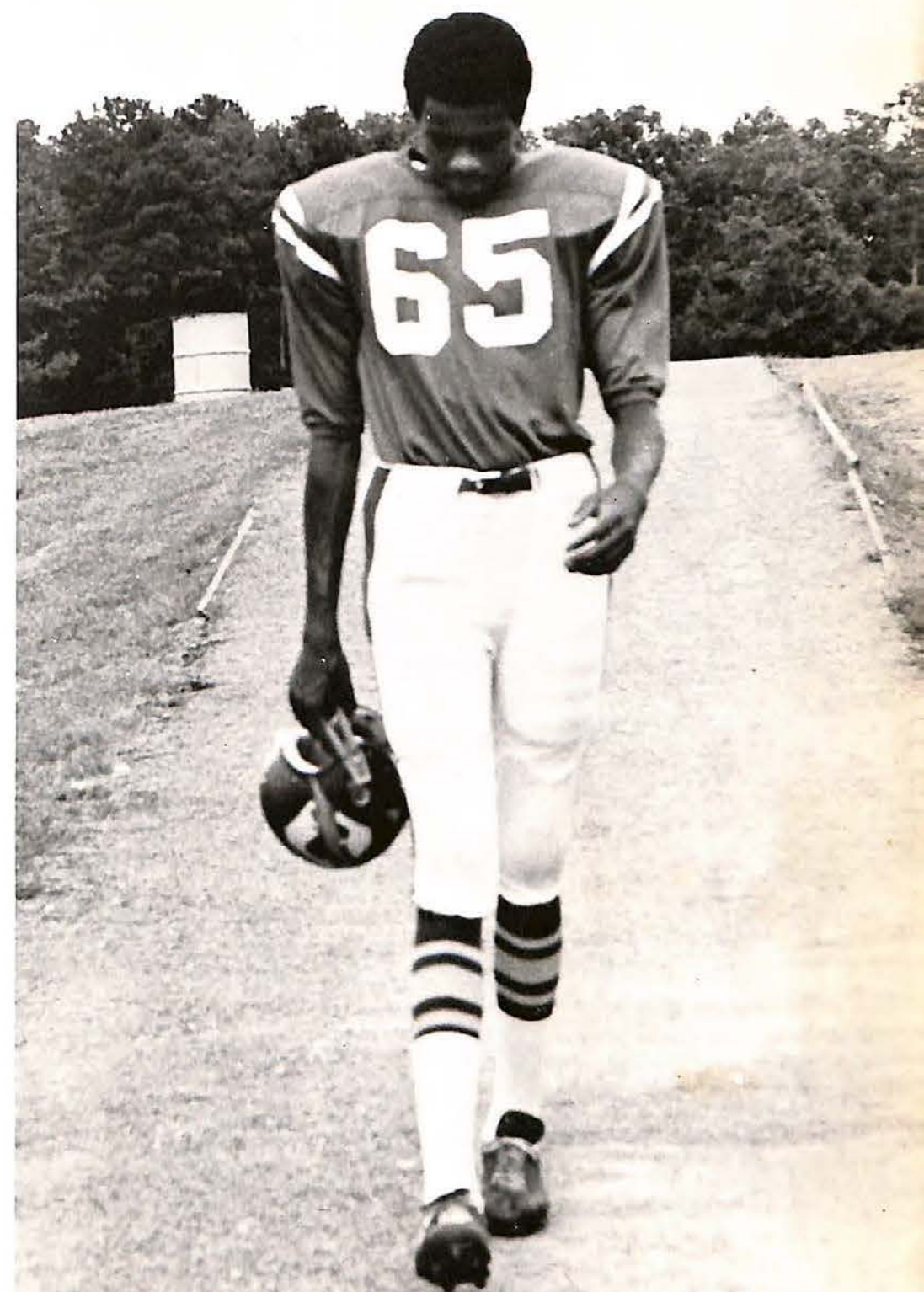

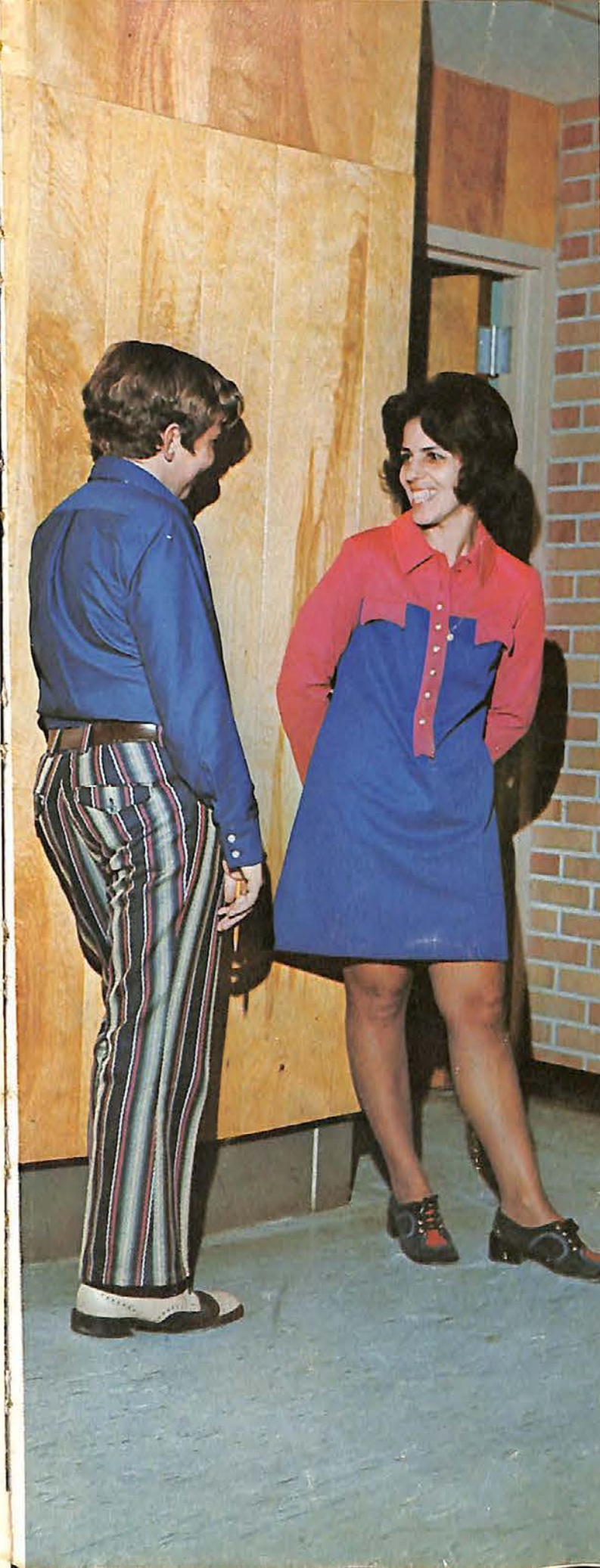

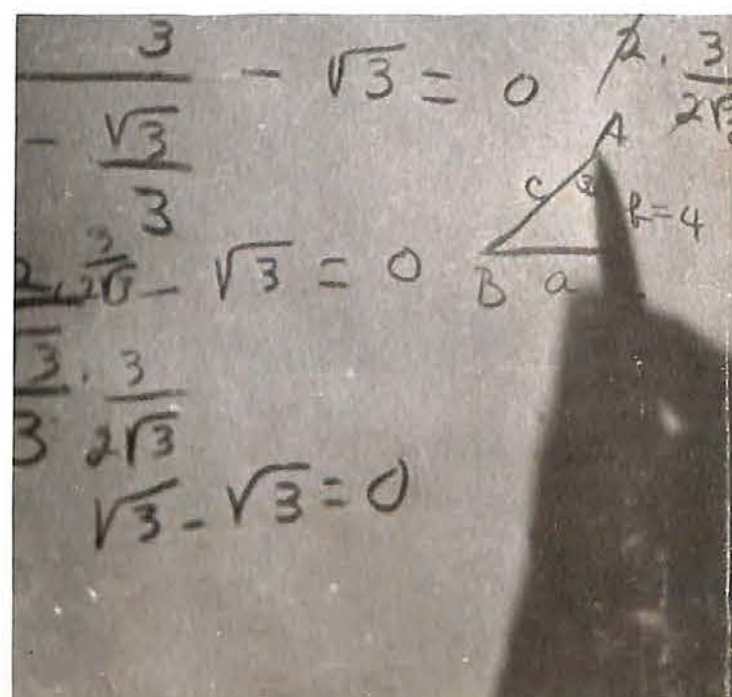
## Dedication

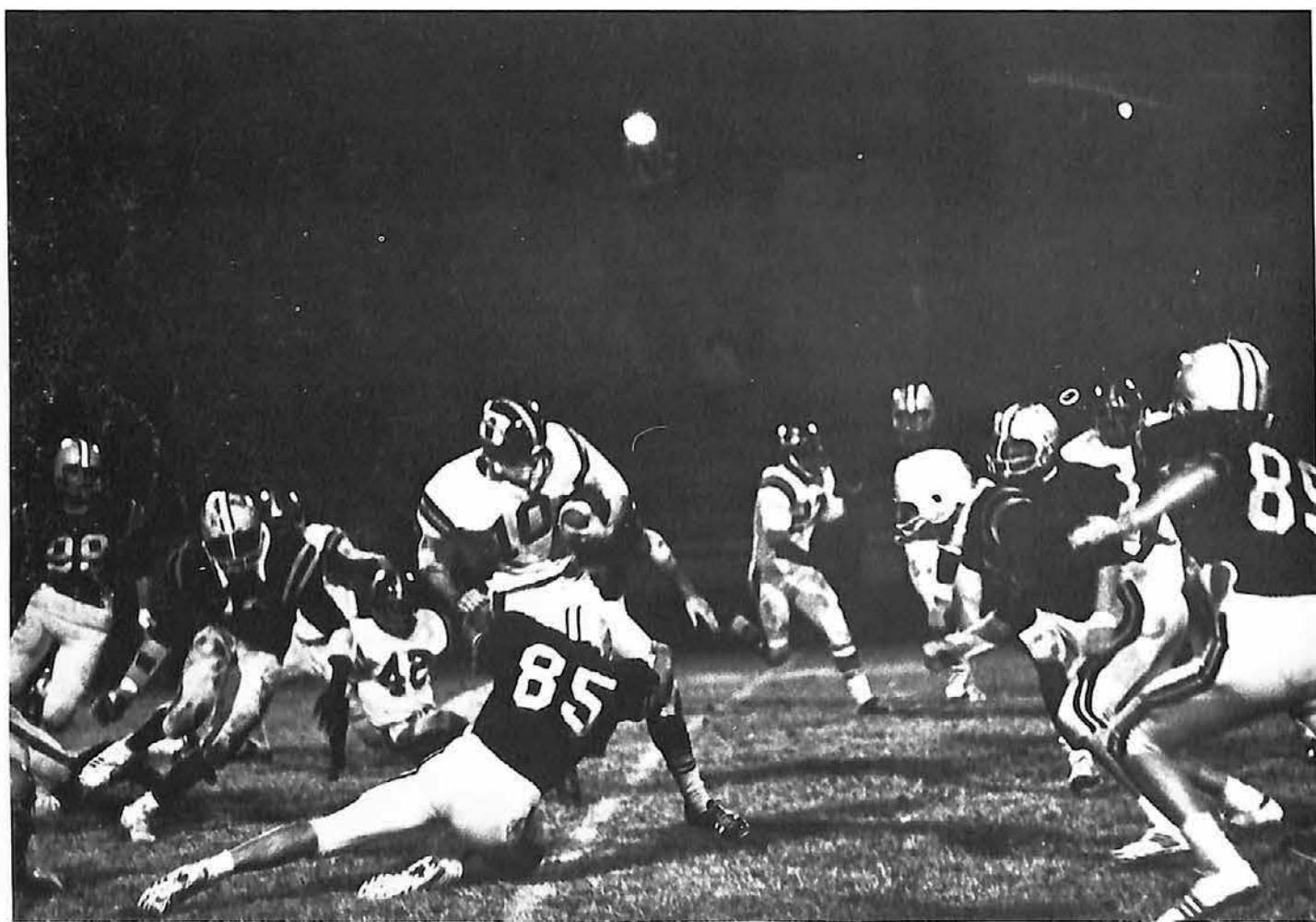

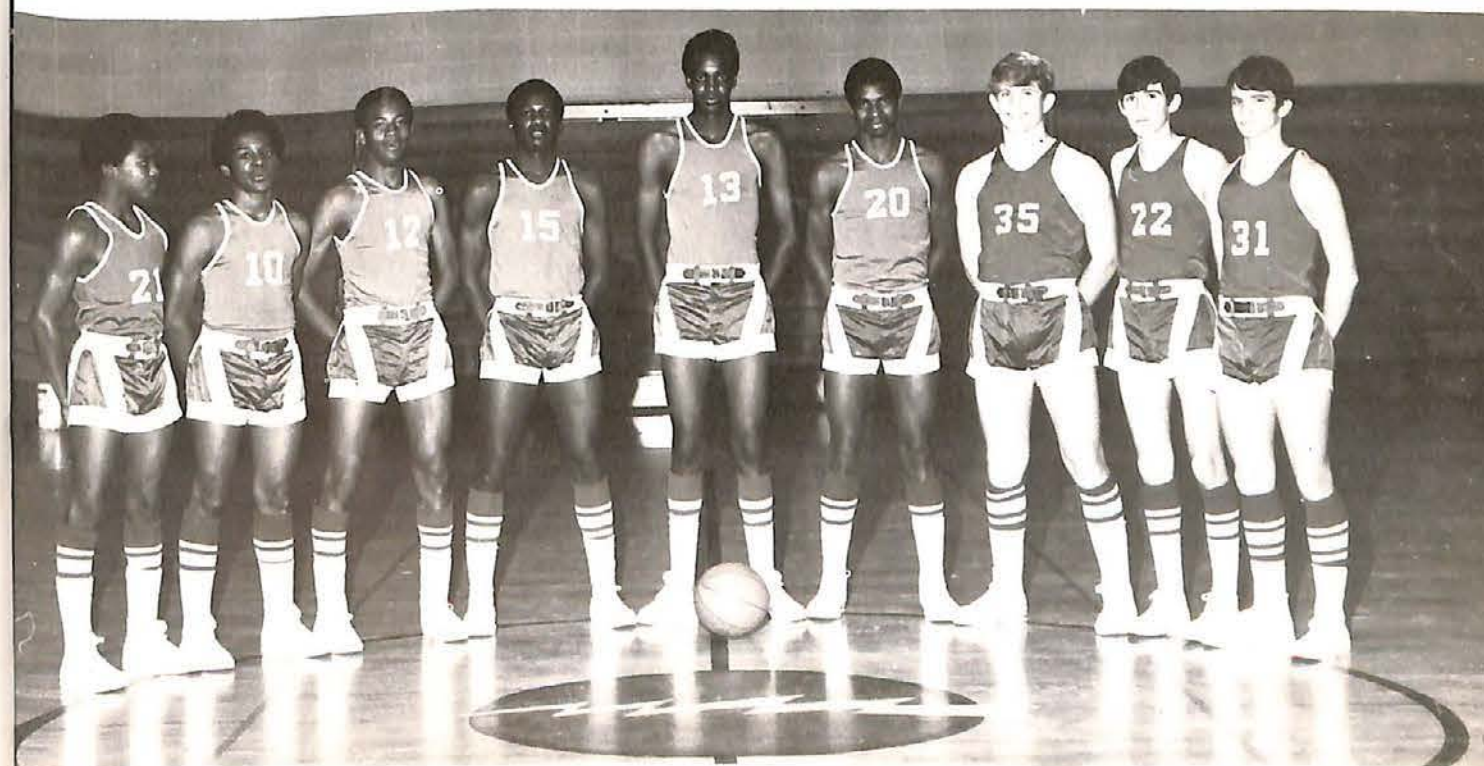
## Chargers Show Strength

## Ecology Club



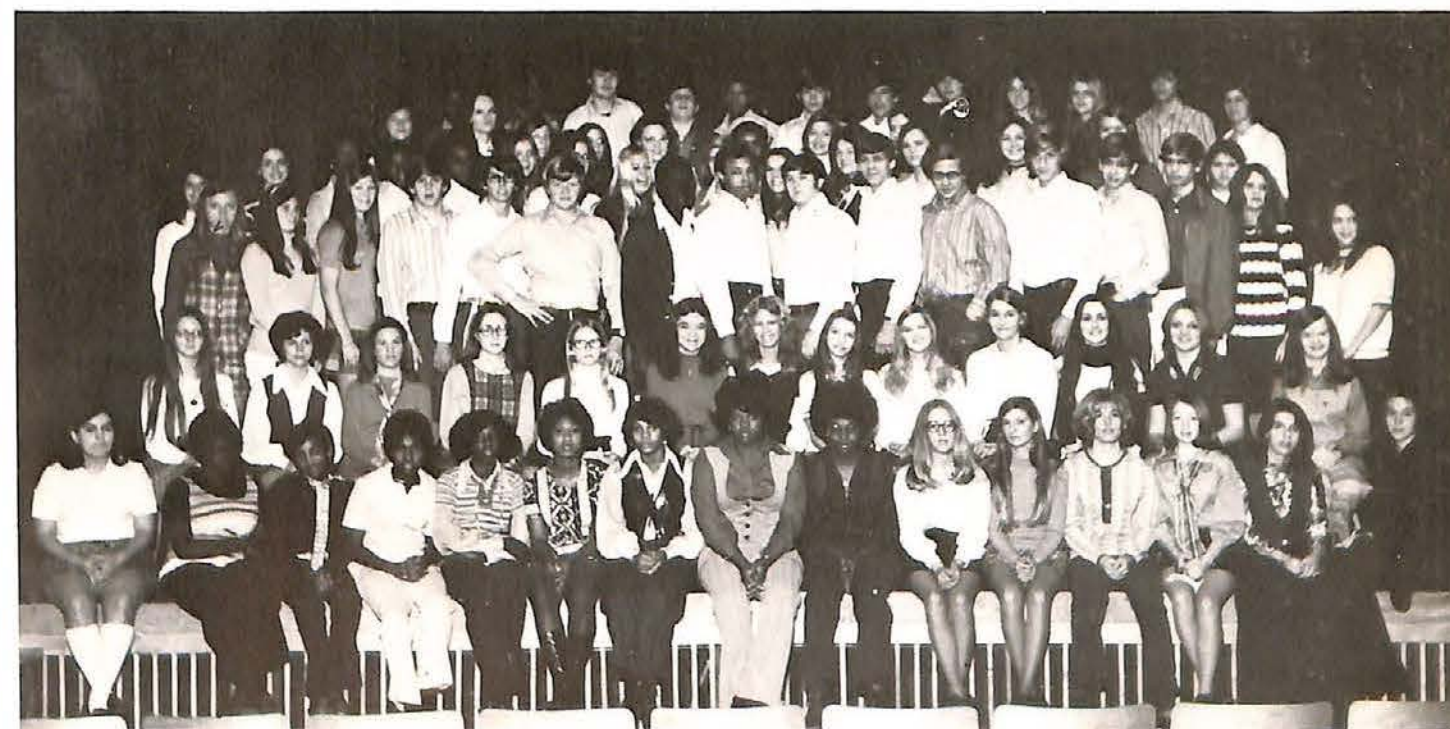

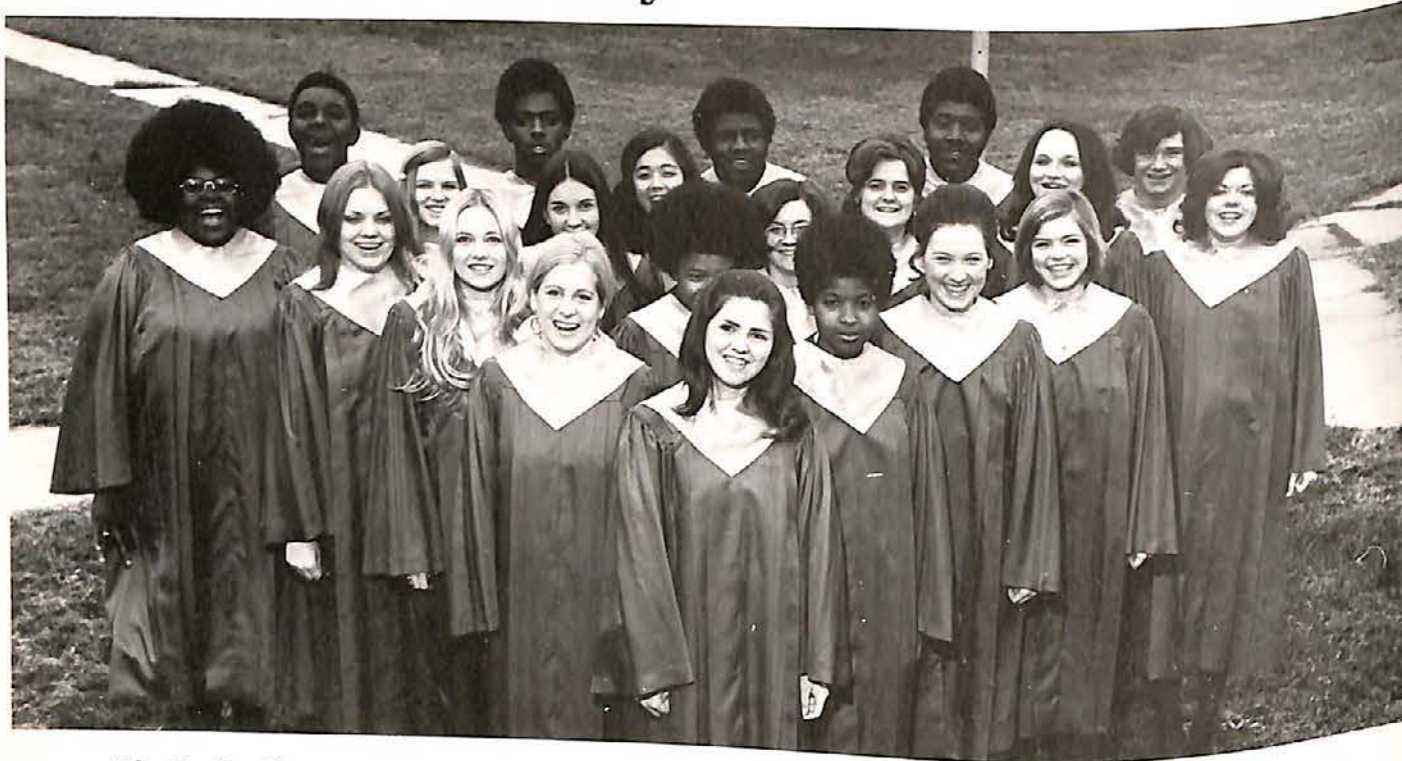
## Dance Club
