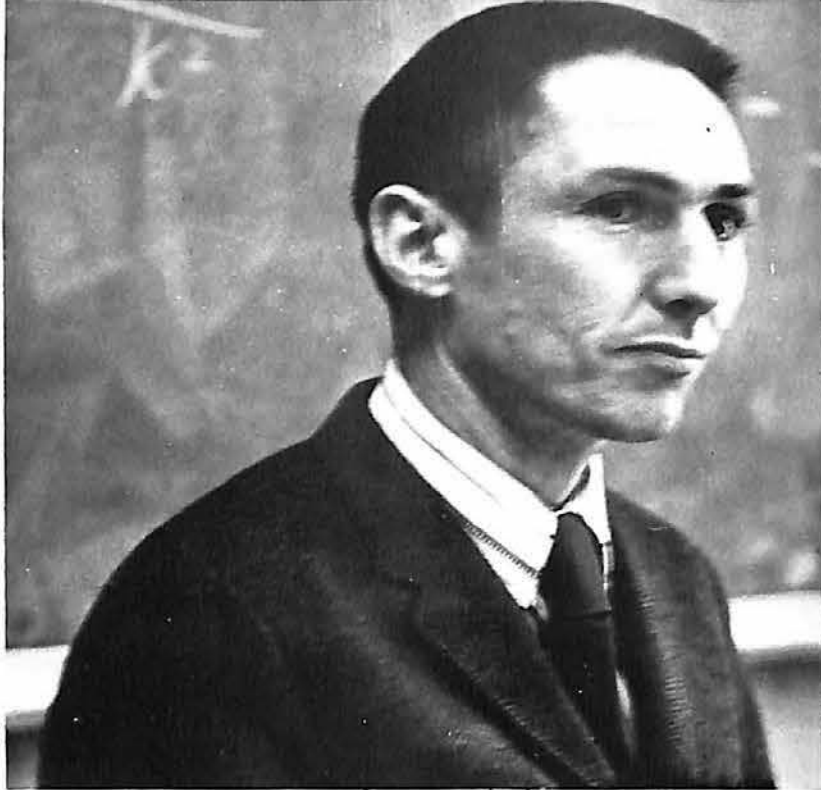
## Chargers Visit Batesville J. C. Bowl

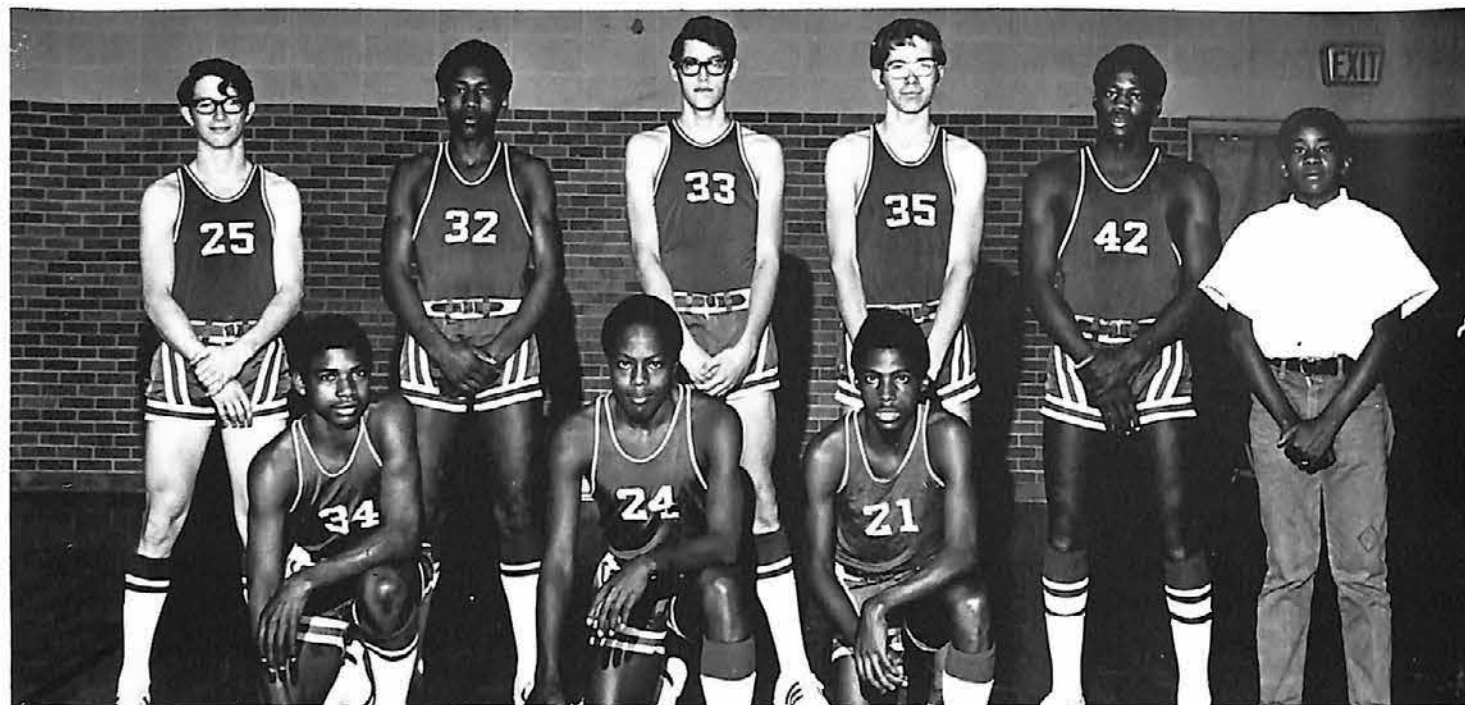


## OHS Basketball Bigger and Better Than Ever

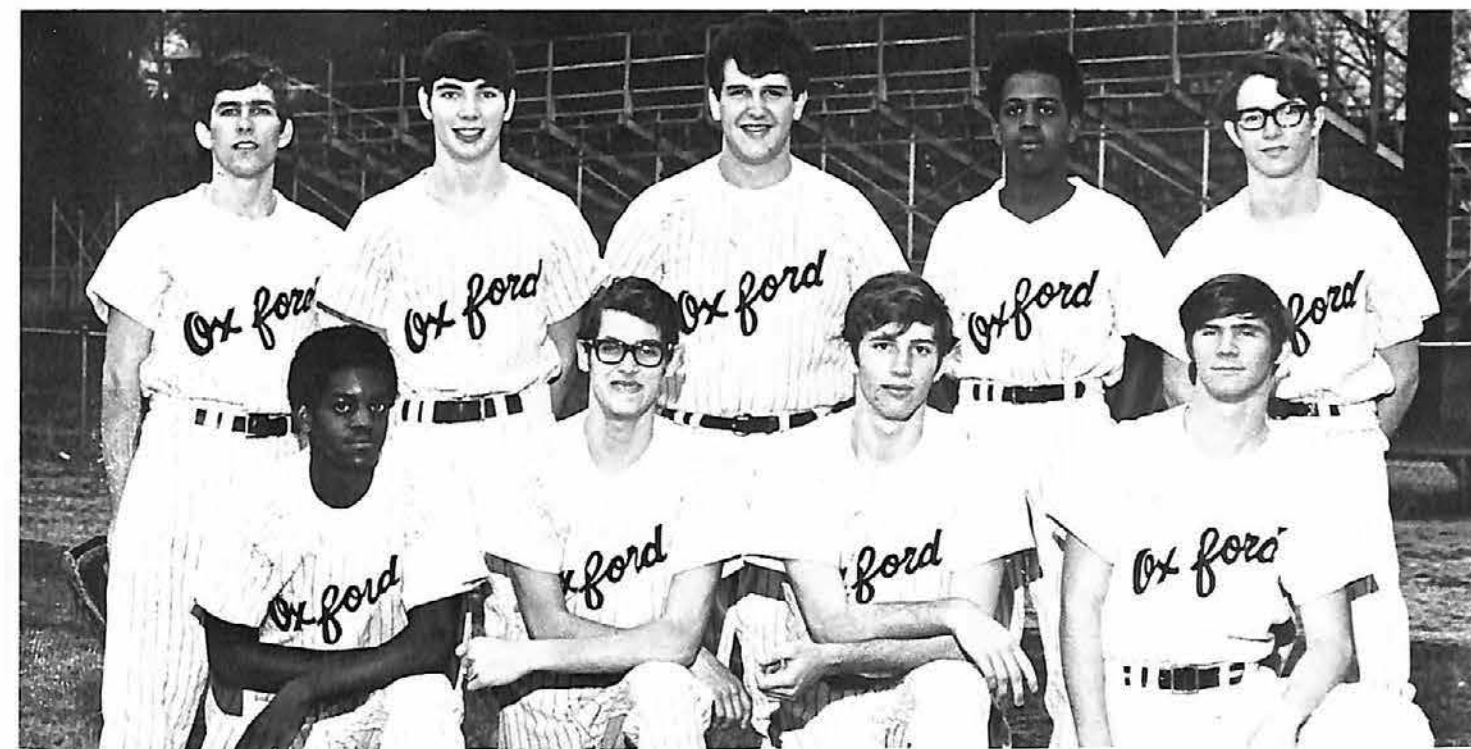

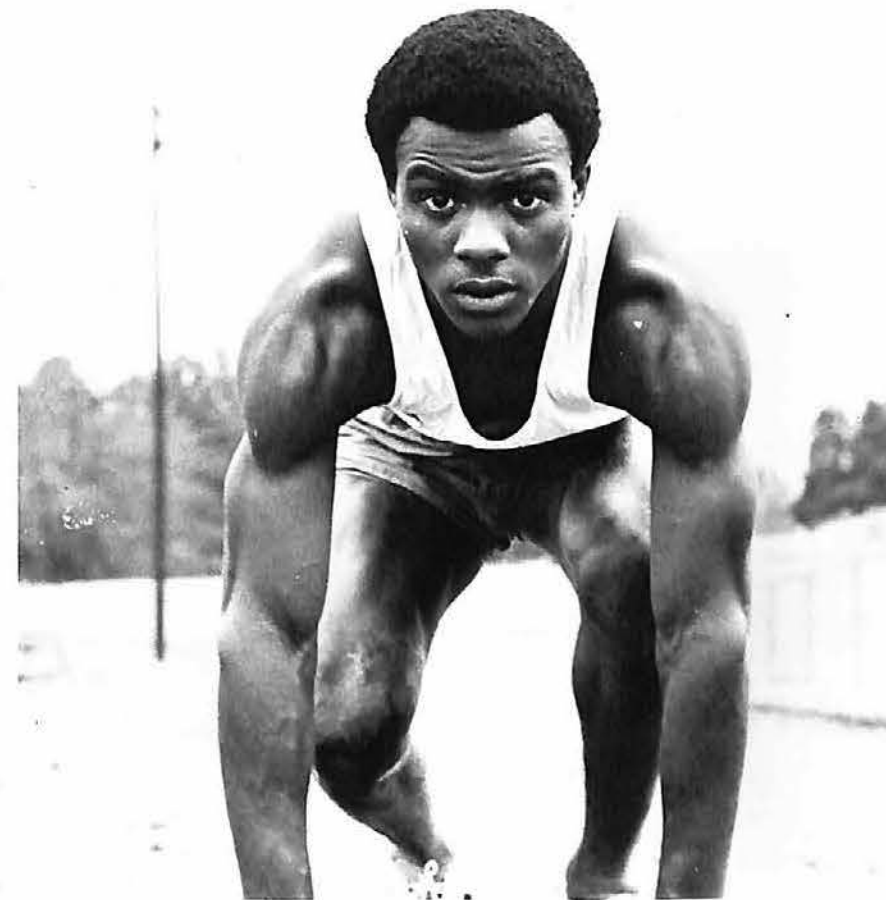

## 1970 Track

Although frustrating at times due to weakness in field events, the '70 track season had moments of glory for one of the fastest teams ever at OHS. The first track meet was the Aberdeen Invitational. Out of 48 schools represented, the Oxford trackmen placed a healthy twelfth. The next track meet was the distant Cleveland Relays, in which Oxford placed sixth in a field of eighteen. Oxford placed a close second in the Little Ten track meet, the high point of the season. The 880 relay team, composed of Bobby Carothers, Walter Denton, Robert Quarles, and Robert Chatman set a new Little Ten record. In the weak District II track meet, the Oxford cinder pacers wiped out the competition and placed first. To finish up their season, the track boys went to the often-canceled North Half track meet at Greenwood. Due to a long trip, tough competition and too much fun in the sun, the team failed to place in the North Half.

At first, of course, I was quite alarmed. It seemed sad that my great dreams might never be fulfilled. I have really hoped that I could change the world. Perhaps as a human I have not experienced and tasted all of life. I have never written a book, circled the globe, read enough good literature, written an outstanding song or poem, given a great speech or sermon, been a sports hero, saved anyone's life, learned to play any musical instrument as a virtuoso, discovered a cure to a disease, found a girl I would like to marry, been a national or world leader, ended war, or anything else noteworthy of encyclopedia recognition. But as a child of God I have lived. I have found meaning in my life and love for everyone on earth.

I have found striking similarities in my illness with that of John Gunther, Jr., who is eulogized in the book by his father *Death Be Not Proud*. He was seventeen as I am and likewise had a tumor. His was a brain tumor and much more severe. At this point it looks like I will live but I want to make some things clear just in case. Johnny Gunther was a remarkable person and the book has provided solace for me. Of course, the Bible has influenced my feelings and helped me more.

If I die I only hope that I have done something for this world. My main prayer is that my departure won't bring grief to anyone. I hate funerals because I think they develop a wrong concept of death.

I honestly think I will pull through this because I believe I can use my faculties for the Lord in this world.
