The Many Faces of Dedication





The administration works untiringly to develop O. H. S. students into more responsible, mature young adults.






1969 A Great Year

National Honor Society



The Jets Club is a state foundation for technical engineering. This O. H. S. organization renewed its charter this year and received material and privileges of the state Jets Club.


The members visited the Ole Miss Campus on Engineering Day this spring.
