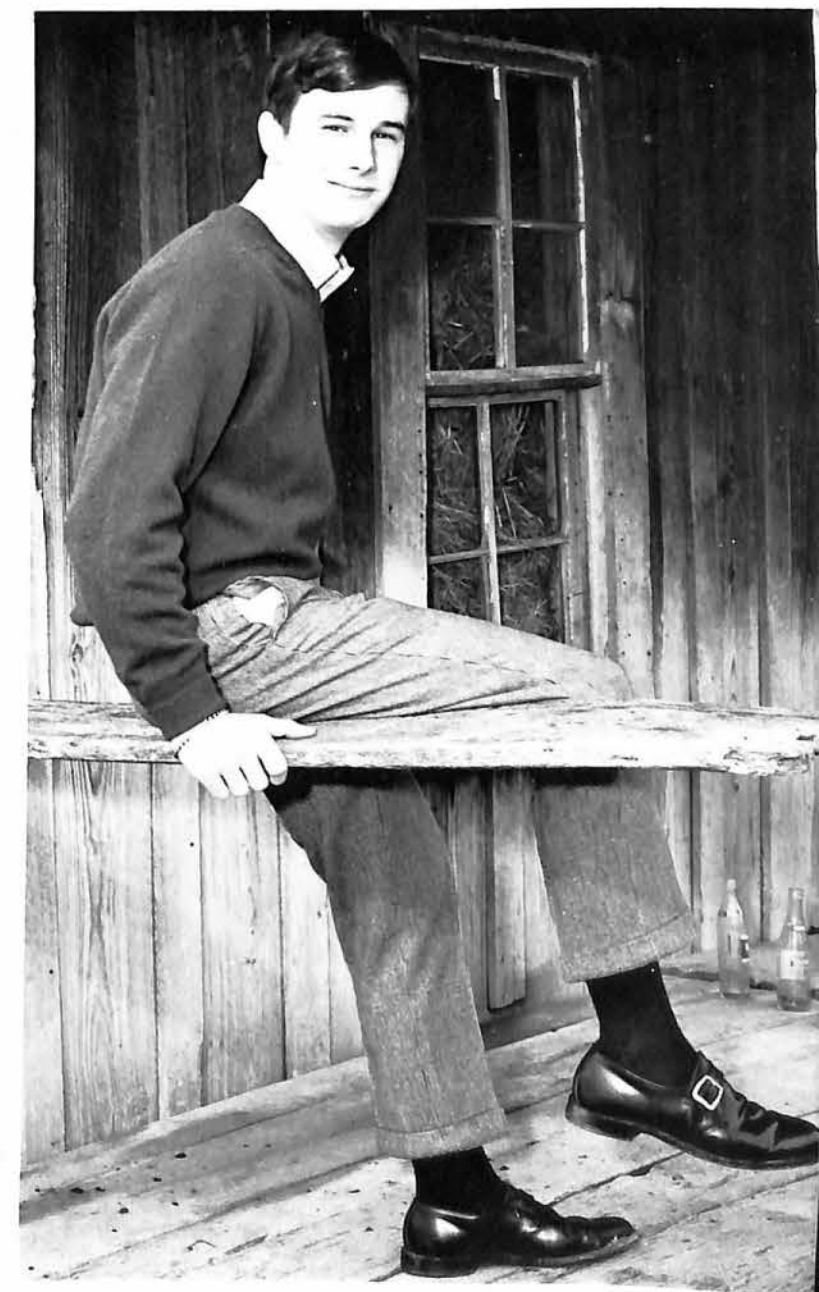
Carole Butler

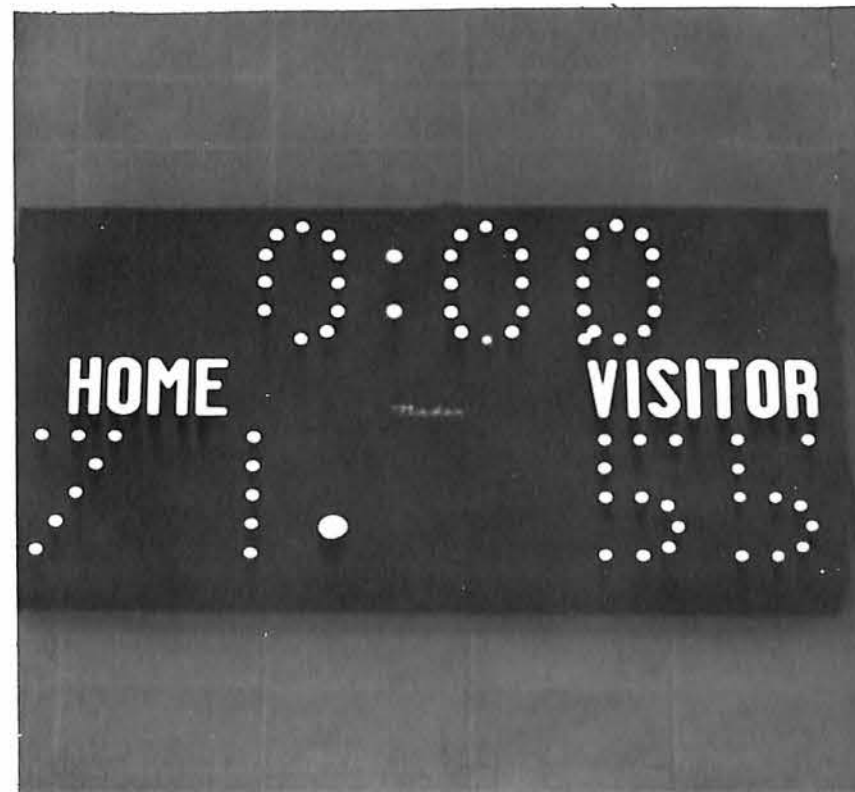
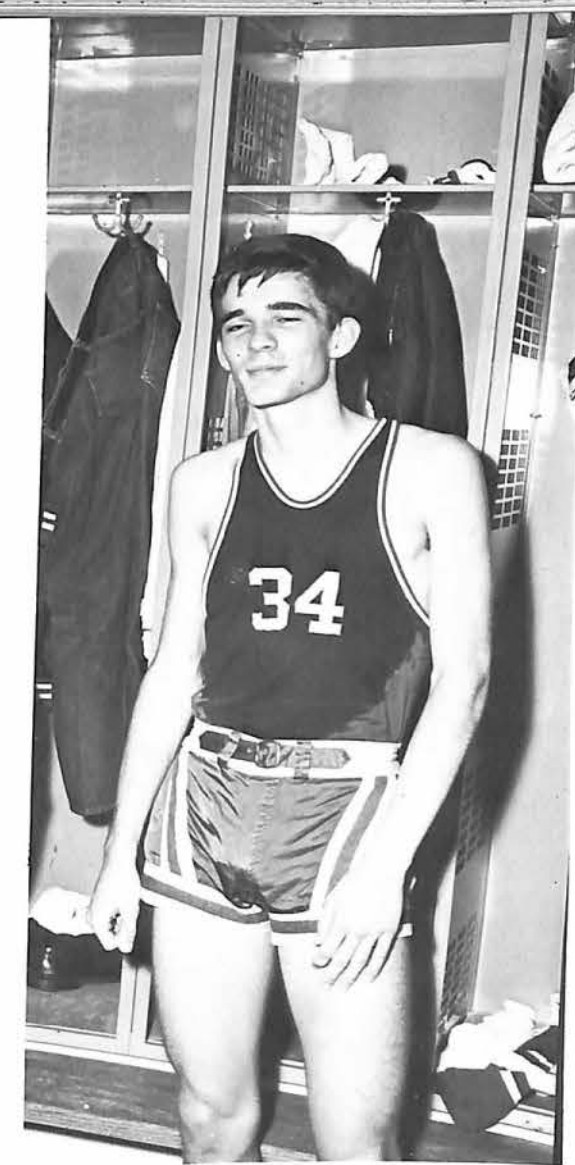


# Colonels Can Recall . . .

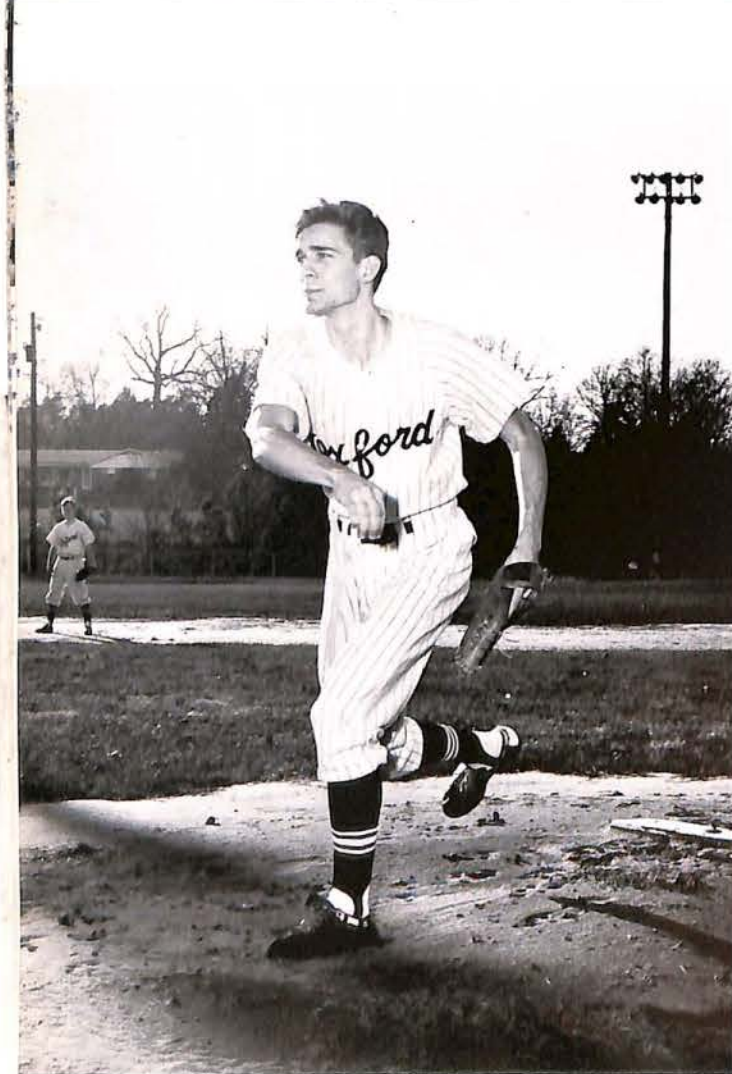
All of a sudden a cheer breaks out, the band explodes, the cheerleaders break through the goalpost and HERE COME THE COLONELS!

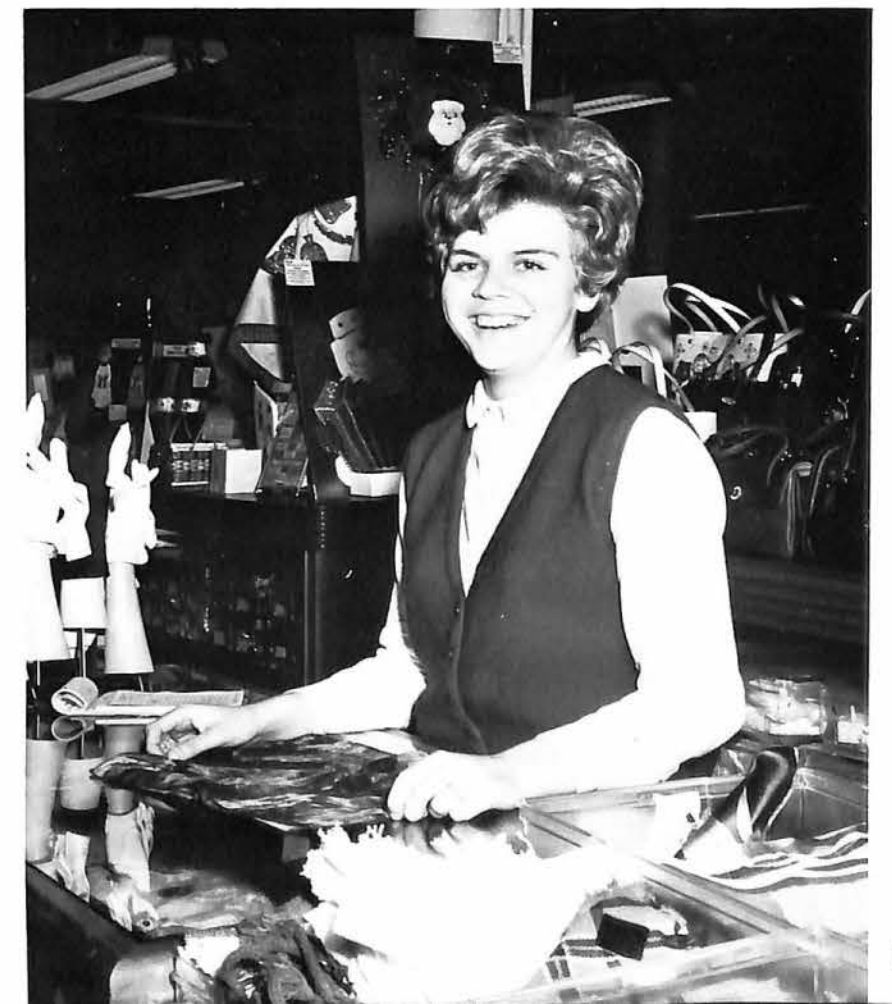


## DECA

The officers were Linda Saucier, president; Leslie King, vice-president; Fay Varner, secretary; and Pam Fielder, treasurer.

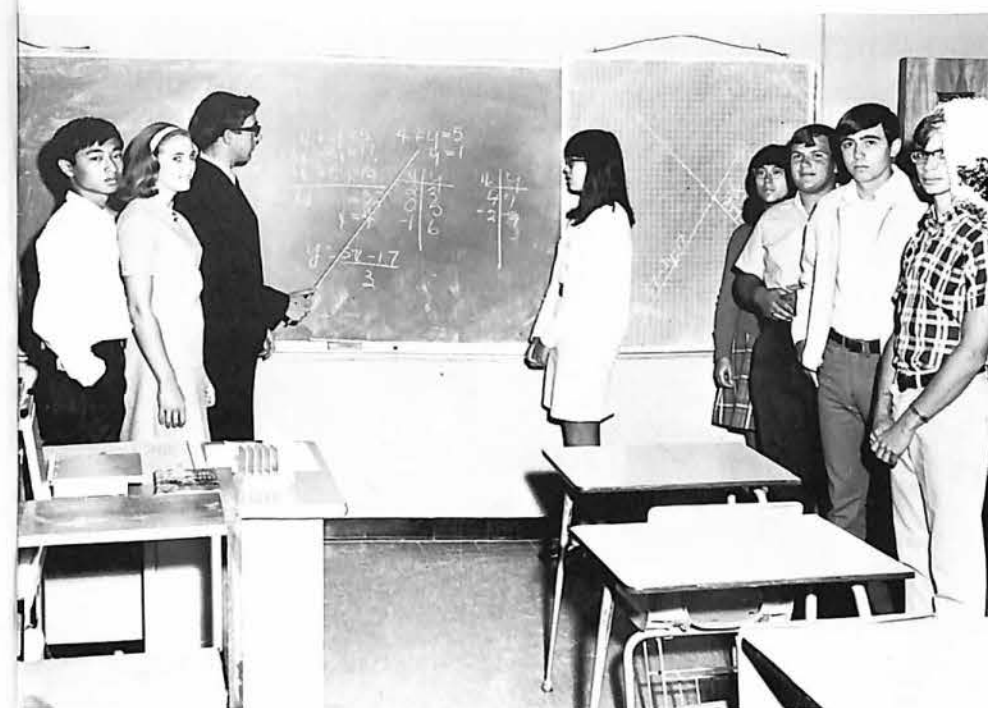
Junior F. H. A.'s purpose is to teach girls to take pride in themselves and to become better homemakers.

The Jets Club is a state foundation for technical engineering. This O. H. S. organization renewed its charter this year and received material and privileges of the state Jets Club.

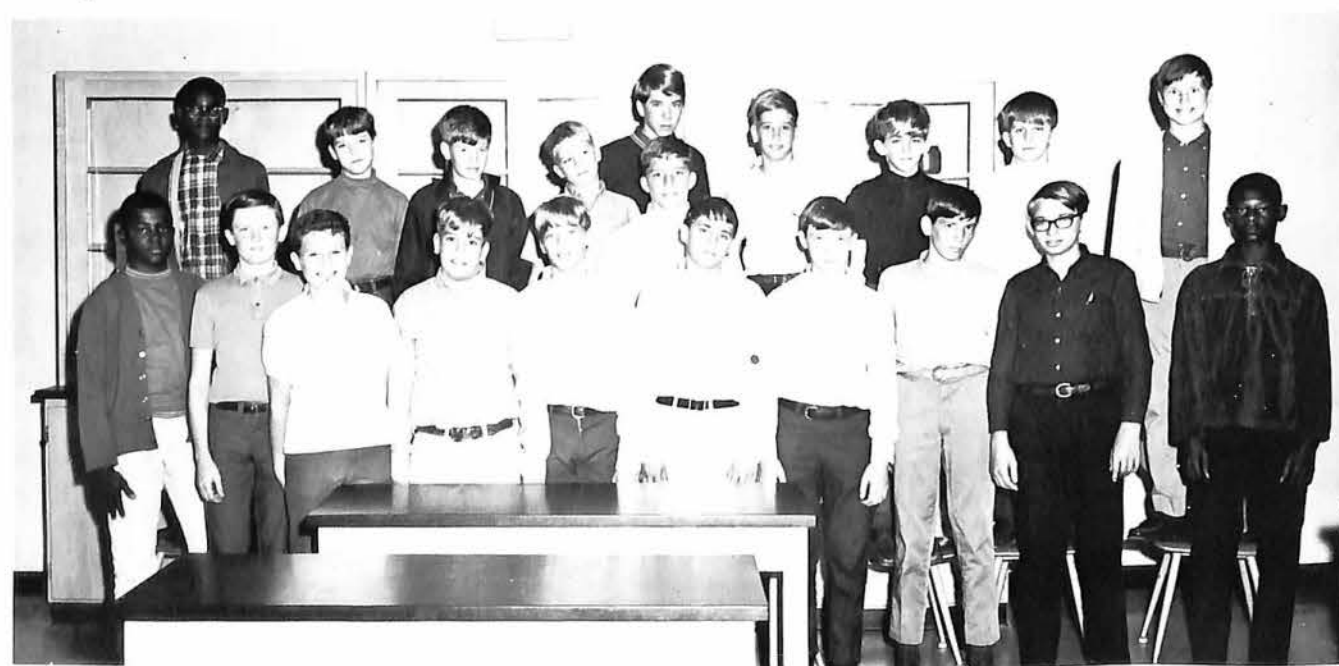
The members visited the Ole Miss Campus on Engineering Day this spring.
