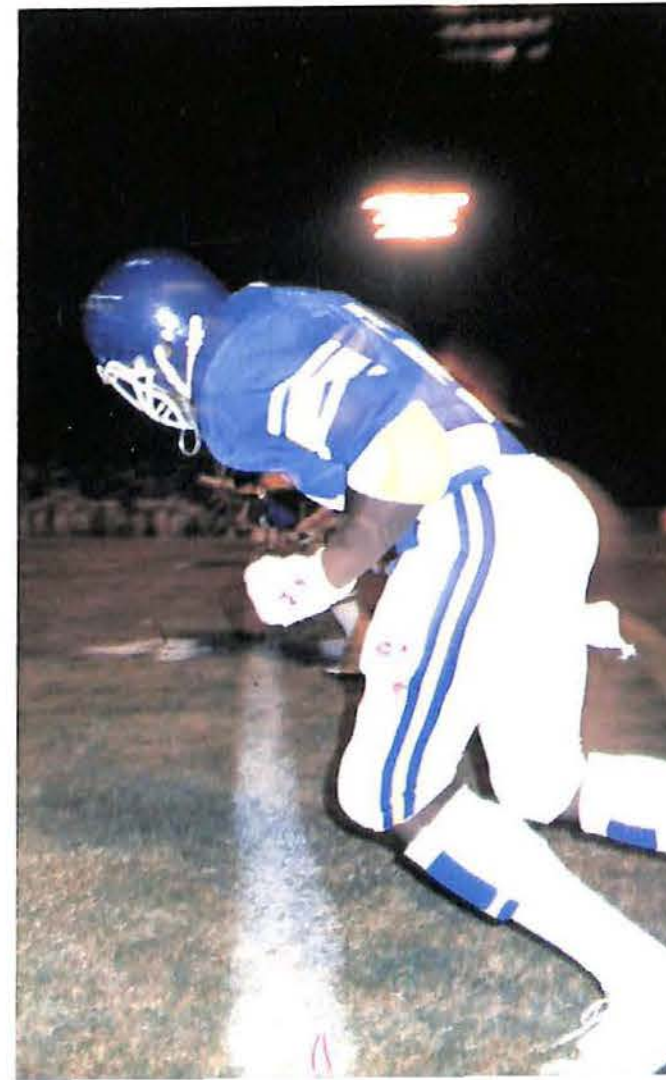
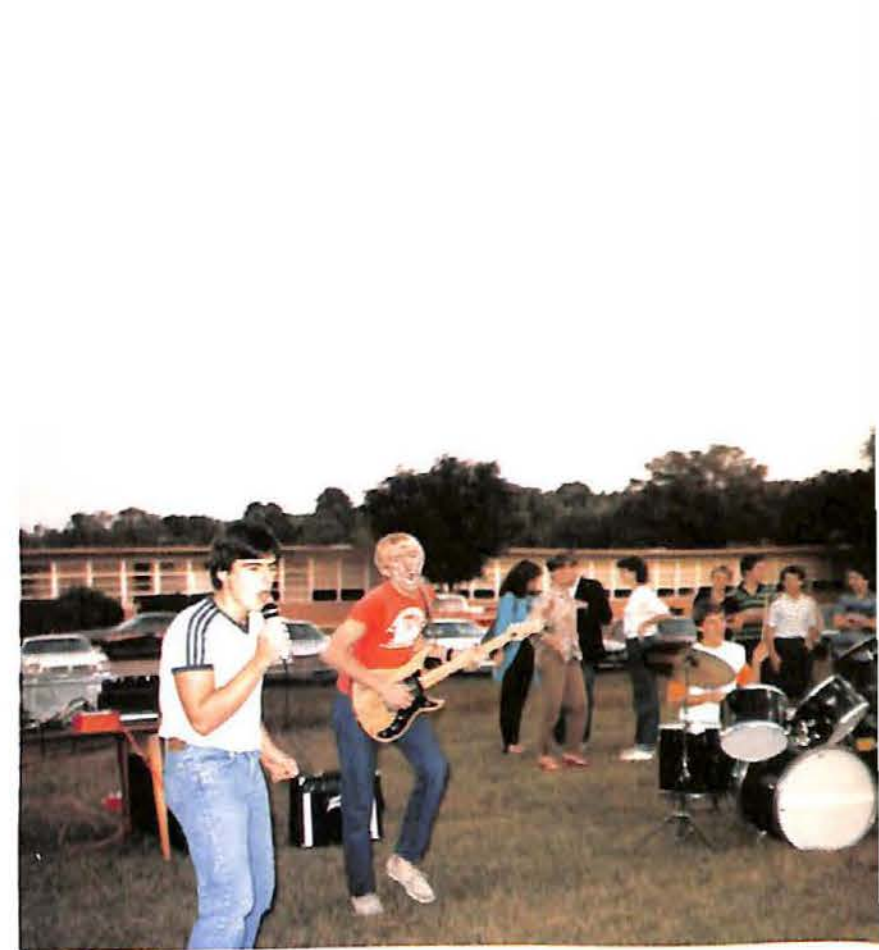
Our Best is Showing

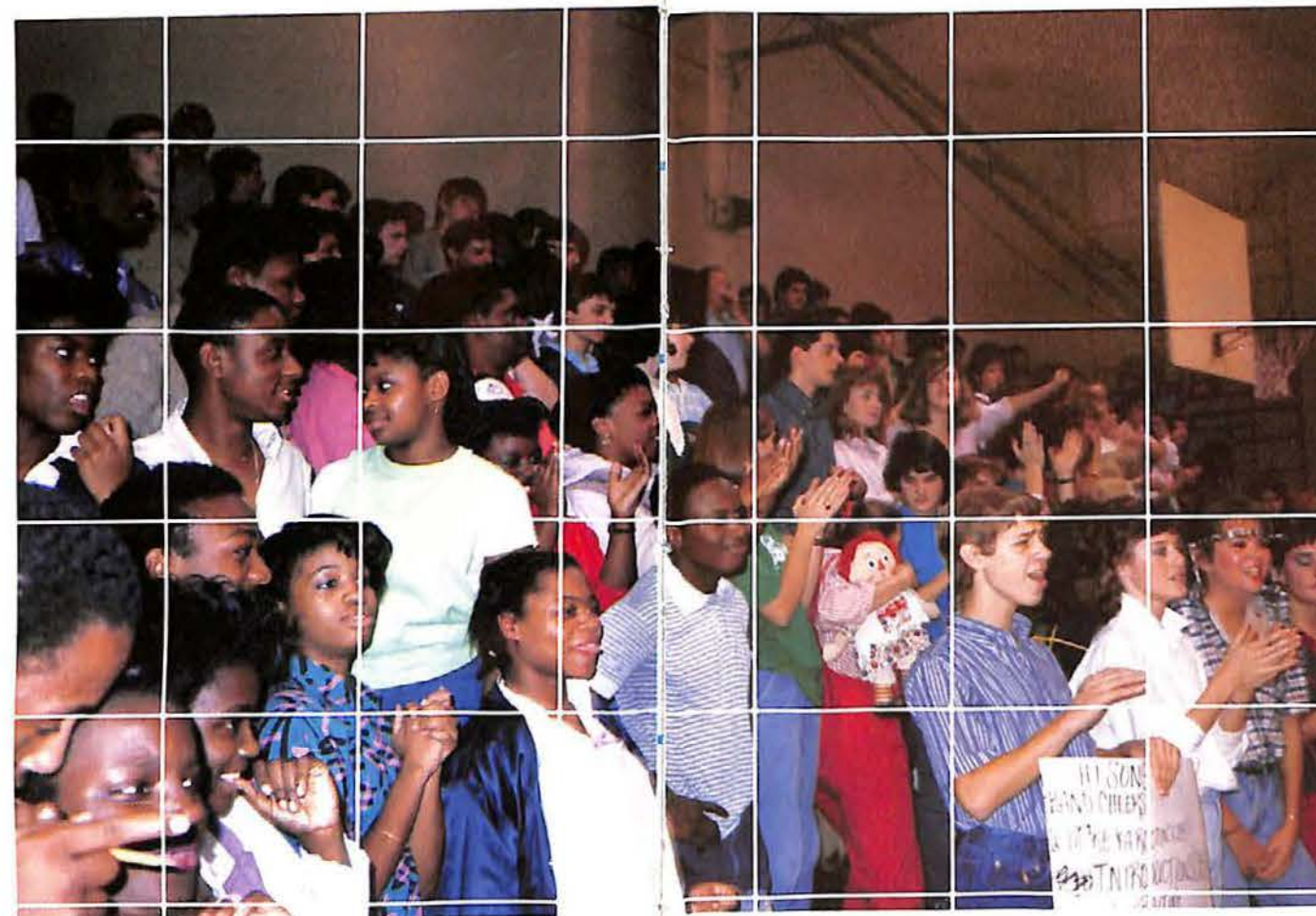

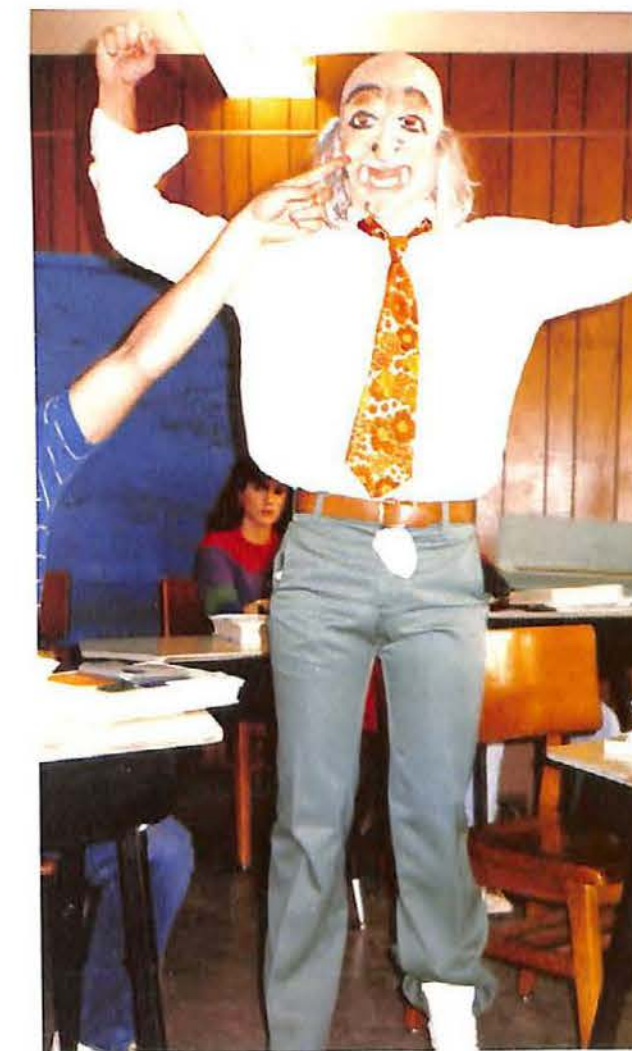

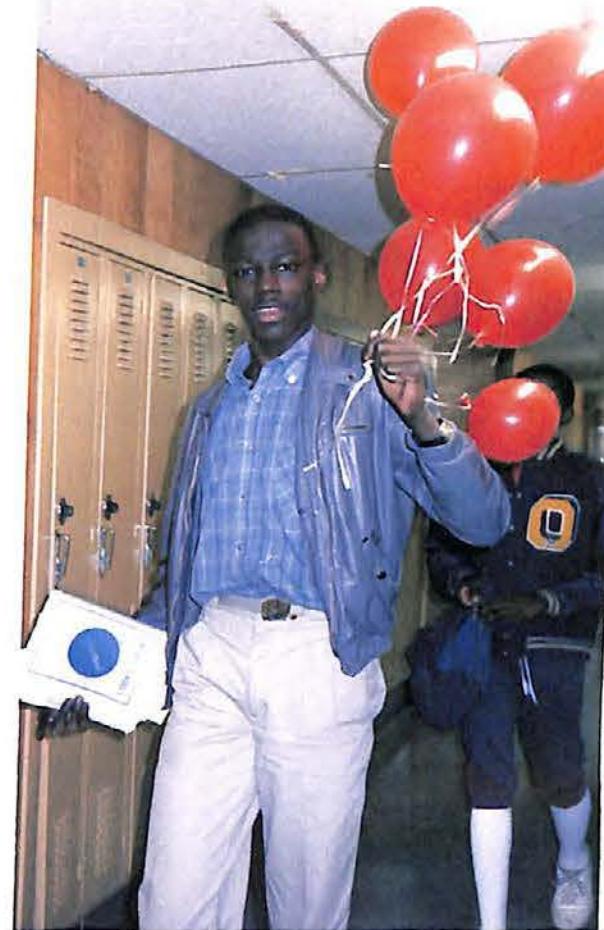

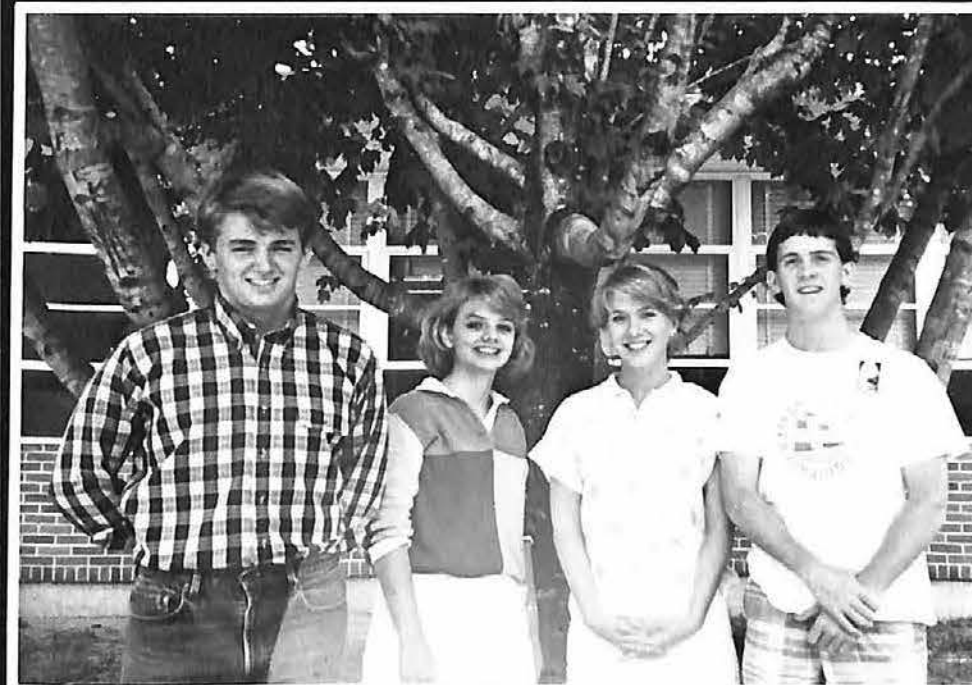


THESPIANS

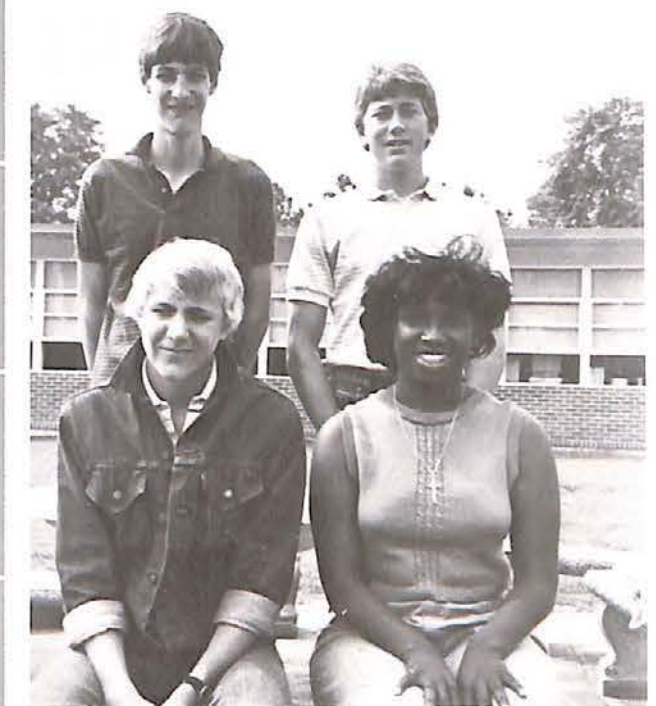

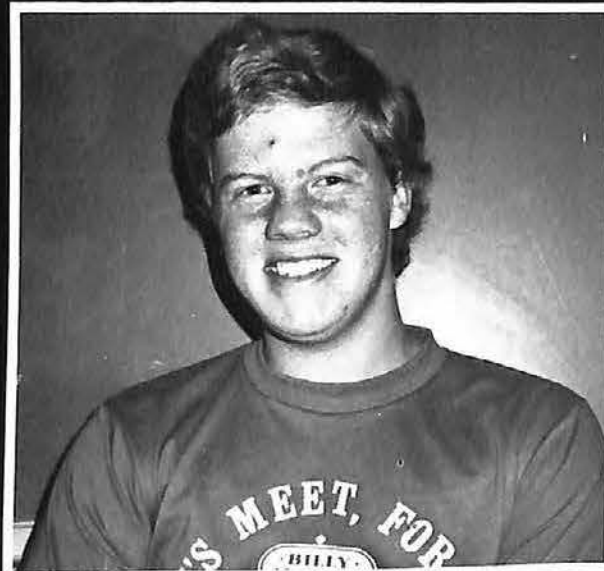

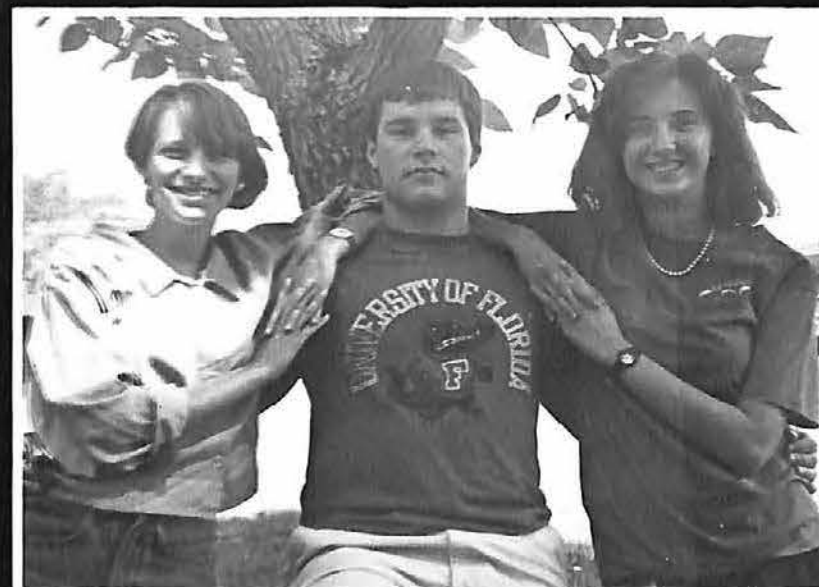
CONGRESS OF BUNDESTAG

Associated Student Government

The Associated Student Government at Oxford High School is made up of four branches: the Executive Branch, the Legislative Branch, the Senate, and the Judicial Branch. These branches work in different ways to develop good citizenship, promote harmonious relations, improve school morale, and provide fun activities for all students.

The Executive Branch consists of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer. These officers are elected by the student body after they meet set qualifications.

The Legislative Branch is made up of Representatives elected by the student body after they meet set qualifications. Each class chooses representatives according to the size of the class.

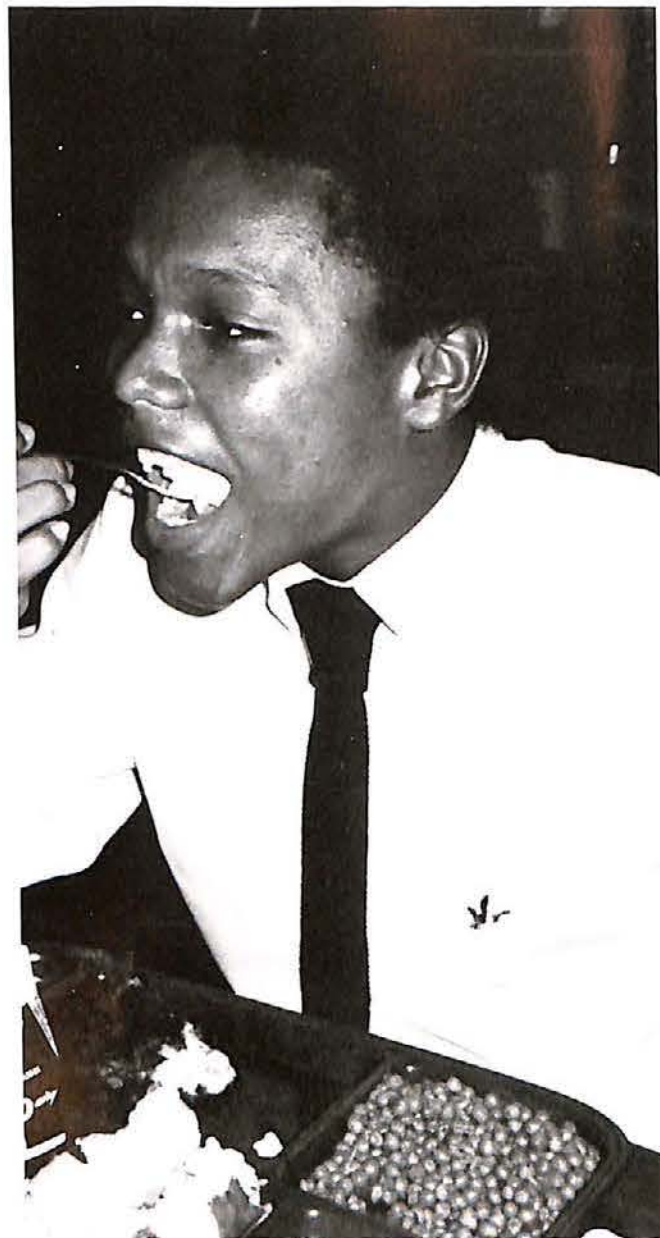
Luv That Lunch

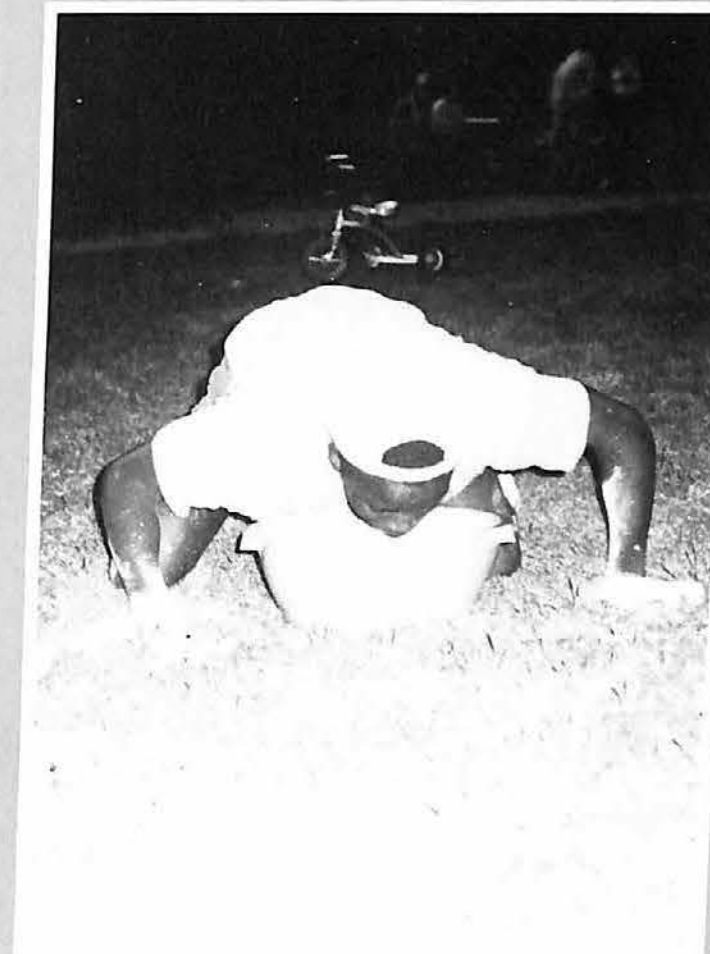
A Salute to the Olympics

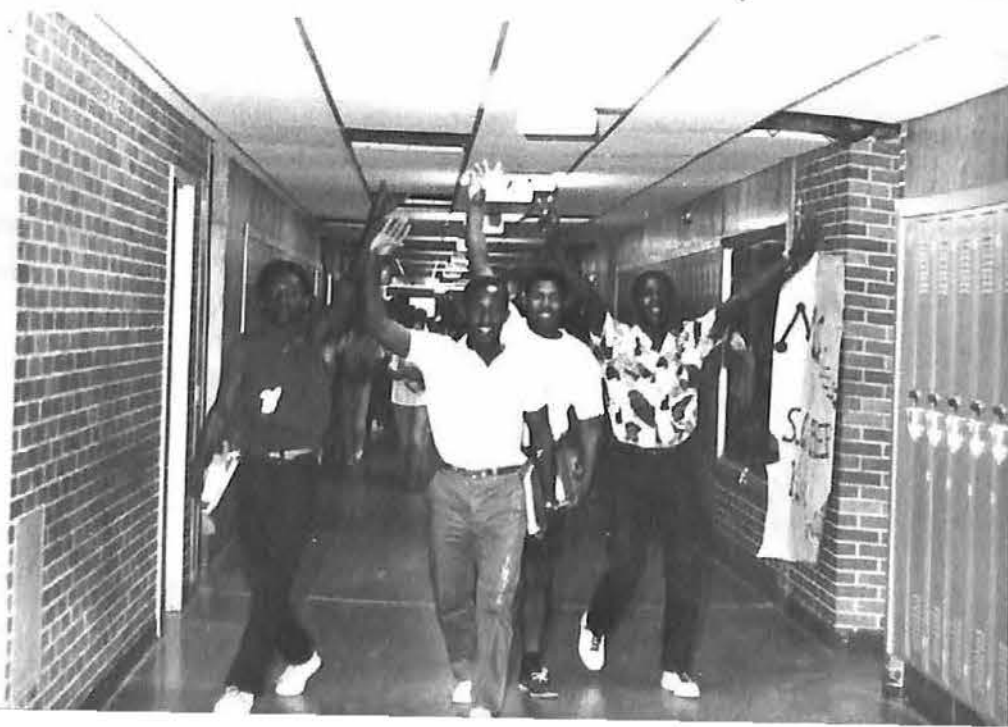

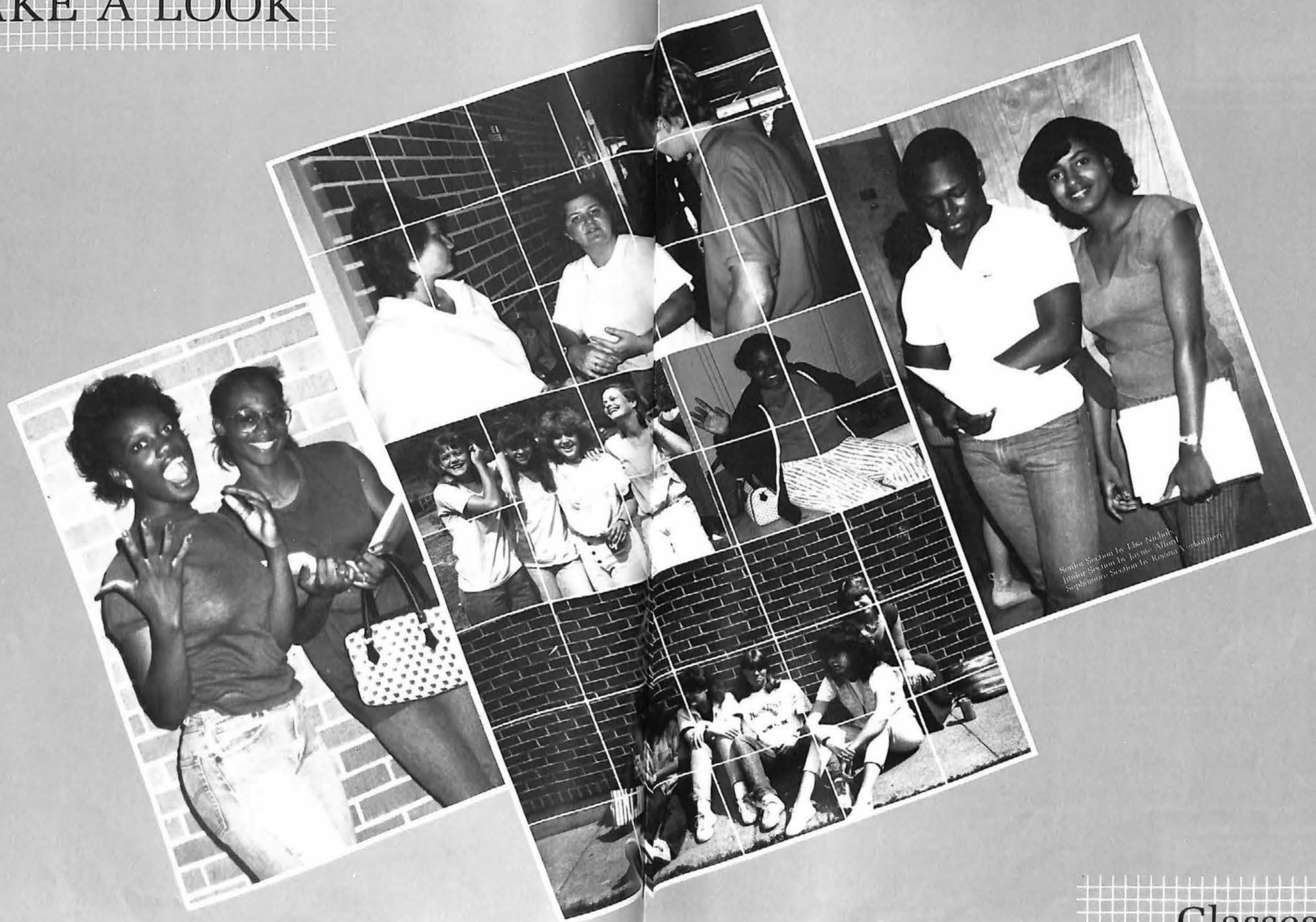
