



MAIN ATTRACTIONS


HOMECOMING WEEK 1982







NANCY CHIEN




BARBARA COBB


HOLLY SALLIS

SHARON VAUGHN






DOROTHY WALTON

What To Do When The Power Goes Off

Unexpected winter happenings, such as ice storms, can interrupt electric service for hours because of broken power lines. There are several important things you should know before the power goes off, so save this ad and refer to it if there's an extended power outage.

BEFORE THE POWER GOES OFF:

1. Keep a batterypowered radio and a fresh supply of batteries on hand.

2. Have candles or fuel-type lamps and matches handy.

3. If you have a fireplace, keep a good supply of wood.

4. Secure charcoal, sterno, or campstove fuel for emergency cooking. (CAUTION: Plenty of ventilation is essential to avoid suffocation.)

5. Have plenty of warm clothing and bed cover available. AFTER THE POWER GOES OFF:

1. Turn off every electrical item that was on when the power went off, especially heating thermostats. This will allow us to get circuits reenergized when the power is turned back on.

2. If the weather is cold, close off all but one room and try to keep it warm with some type of wood, coal, or fuel-type heater. (CAUTION: Plenty of ventilation is essential to avoid suffocation.)

3. Keep the battery radio tuned to a station on which we are making local announcements about the power condition.

4. Wear warm clothing indoors. 5. Refrain from opening doors to

your refrigerator or freezer so that food will remain

cold longer.

6. With heat pumps, do not reset the thermostat to the "ON" position as soon as power comes back on. If power has been off from two to ten hours, wait 11/2 hours before turning a heat pump on. Should power have been off longer than ten hours, wait three hours. This will allow crankcase heaters to evaporate all liquid refrigerant. Not doing so could result in heat pump failure.
