

### **Learning snapshot**

Here is a look at what the children have been up to this week.

Year 1 - This week we looked closely at the different features of dinosaurs. We made junk model dinosaurs thinking about their body parts. We then looked at what dinosaurs ate and made herbivore and carnivore teeth using clay.
