Sixth Grade

Math with Mr. Klemme:

Your math 6 students have been exploring the topic of geometry in class. We reviewed the shapes and formulas from elementary school and have now added the formulas for parallelograms, rhombus, trapezoid, kites, and triangles to our knowledge base. We have learned about deconstructing complex shapes to make them easier to work with as well. We will be using this knowledge to find the surface area and volume of rectangular and triangular prisms in class as well.

Pre-Algebra classes have been plugging away with expressions.

We've applied the Commutative, Associative, and Distributive properties to simplify or expand these expressions. We have also started to combine like terms in our expressions. Students will continue to use these skills for our Algebra unit as well as their Algebra classes and Integrated classes as they get older.

MN Studies with Ms. Atchison and Ms. Pfeiffer:

This week and last, students learned about the US-Dakota War, the causes, and its impact. For our unit summative, students will be creating new historical markers about the war. This was something Minnesota's Historical Society did 10 years ago to show a more accurate history of the event.

For our next unit, students will be learning about Minnesota's main industries in the late 1800's: flour, lumber, and iron. Students will learn about the natural resources, jobs, and machines that grew the major three industries in Minnesota. At the end of the unit, students will work together to create a commercial about one of the industries to attract people to work in that industry.

Science with Ms. Crowley and Mr. Chase:

The University of Minnesota Science for All came for their last visit of the year to teach about polymers, what they are and their many uses. The PhD student that lead the class works on developing more ecofriendly polymers. The students tested three different diapers to see absorbed which more water: Pampers, Huggies, and Tippy Toes. We found that Pampers absorbed the most water.



The Environmental classes will be going on the FREE field trip for Science for All to the University of Minnesota east bank campus on Friday, May17th. Lunch is provided and permission slip were sent home.

Seventh Grade

English with Ms. Steinhoff:

7th graders are wrapping up their poetry unit! Ask you student to show you a poem that they have been working hard on. Up next, for our final unit of the year, will be a whole class reading of "The Outsiders" by S.E. Hinton! We will continue our character work from the fall, as well as learning about how to write an argumentative claim. Students will also fine tune their skills in textual evidence to back up their claim. The end of the year is coming up fast!

Eighth Grade

Math with Mr. Hayden:

In Integrated Math 1, we are working through our unit on statistics, which covers a wide variety of lessons. At first, we focused on histograms, dot plots and box plots as three possible ways of displaying data. We learned how we can analyze and compare data, and what we can determine from the shape or spread of the data as well. We learned how to calculate standard deviation, which is one of the ways we describe the spread of data. However, calculating standard deviation by hand can be a very time-consuming task so we also learned how a standard deviation calculator can be used to save time. Lastly, we are learning about twoway frequency tables and how we can interpret them.

In Algebra, we just finished our unit on systems of equations so now we are on to real numbers. During this unit we will learn how to convert rational numbers to decimals, how to write repeating decimals as fractions, how to differentiate between rational and irrational numbers, and how to compare and order real numbers. Lastly, we will look at both square roots and cube roots and when they can be used to solve problems. Looking at square roots specifically should help us prepare for our last unit of the year, the Pythagorean Theorem.

Global Studies with Mr. Kareem and Ms. Croone:

In 8th grade Global Studies we are currently studying Africa. Students began by reflection on some of the misperceptions people have about Africa, and some of their own assumptions. They are now working on a political map of Africa and the different regions of Africa.

Band/Orchestra

Murray Middle School Music students had the great opportunity to listen to professional musicians from St Paul Conservatory of Music play for them. Students were able to ask them questions and learn about a great opportunity for them to get virtual lessons through-out the summer.





3 students had the opportunity to go to Marshall, MN at Southwest Minnesota State University to play with professionals, community members, and other students from around Minnesota in a symphony orchestra. They got there at 10 am and played in a concert at 5 pm.
