Summer School & Camp

BCEMS and BTMES are starting on plans for **summer school** and which students should be referred for summer school, free of charge. The district has three options for students in K-7 grades: General Education Summer School, Small Group (ESY), and Barre Buds. Here is a brief description of each option:

- General Education (Gen Ed): The purpose of general education summer school is to minimize regression of skills over the summer vacation for students who are currently behind their peers in grade-level standards. It services students who may or may not require specialized instruction, as long as they can be successful in a general education classroom. If you have questions about this program, please contact Milika Neddo at mneddbce@buusd.org
- Extended School Year (ESY): For Students on IEPs who qualify based on VT Special Education Regulations regarding ESY. Special Education case managers will have IEP Team discussions for decision-making about ESY eligibility and will make referrals. If you have questions, please contact your child's case manager.
- Barre Buds: For students on IEPs who qualify for ESY and who have highly individualized academic programming and social/emotional goals and/or use an AAC system. If you have questions, please contact your child's case manager.

The YMCA will also be providing a **summer camp** program, one of which will be located at Barre Town Middle and Elementary School.
