

1904. When he was in high school, he took his first art class. The things he liked to draw in art class were cartoons. When he was 18, he left his home and attended Dartmouth College. He became the editor of Comedy Magazine. Once at college, Dr. Suess got in trouble for breaking one of the rules. The punishment he got was that he wasn't allowed to work for the magazine. One day, Dr. Suess moved to England to train and become a professor. Dr. Suess realized this was not the right career for him. Then, Dr. Suess met his future wife, Helen Palmer. They were both in the same college. When they got married they decided to move back to the United States that same year, which was 1927. In the United States, Dr. Suess and Helen moved into an apartment in New York City, and then he started working as a cartoonist.


