What is Title 1?

Title I funds are federal funds that are allocated to provide additional academic support and learning opportunities to assist students as they master challenging Tier I curricular and address standards in core academic content areas.

Hammond High Magnet School uses Title 1 funding to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high quality education and reach, at minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments These funds support our learning environment in a variety of ways by providing extra interventions and/or instructional materials for students in reading and mathematics as well as technology to enhance performance of all students and reinforce concepts taught in the classroom.

2023-2024 GOALS !!!!

- ✓ Increase our cohort graduation rate from 66.3% to 70% and increase our graduation diploma index from 7.2 points to 7.5 points.
- ✓ Increase the percentage of our seniors graduating with a JumpStart basic or advanced credential from 21.1% to 25%.
- ✓ Increase the number of our seniors eligible for a TOPS award from 118 to 130
- ✓ Decrease the percentage of students chronically absent from 42.6% to 40%.
- ✓ Decrease the percentage of students who are suspended out of school from 17% to 15%.





2023-2024 GOALS !!!!

- ✓ *Increase ACT scores:*
 - *composite score from 16.5 points to 19.5 points*
 - *18+ from 90 to 93*
 - *21+ from 44 to 47*
- ✓ *Increase their overall LEAP2025 growth to mastery in ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies combined from 0% to 1%*
- ✓ *Increase their WorkKeys assessment scores and National Career Readiness Certificates*
- ✓ *Increase LEAP2025 English I, Mastery scores from 17% to 20%*
- ✓ *Increase LEAP2025 OVERALL Mastery scores from 19% to 21%*

- ✓ *Increase LEAP2025 English II Mastery scores from 28% to 31%*
- ✓ *In the Spring of 2024, HHMS will increase LEAP2025 Algebra I Mastery scores from 13% 16%*
- ✓ *In the Spring of 2024, HHMS will increase LEAP2025 Geometry Mastery scores from 18% 21%*
- ✓ *In the Spring of 2024, HHMS will increase LEAP2025 U.S. History Mastery scores from 19% to 21%*
- ✓ *In the Spring of 2024, HHMS will increase LEAP2025 Biology Mastery scores from 18% to 21%*
