PH 2034 TEAM: OPTIONS INPUT

WHAT DO YOU LIKE

- Amount & variety of options shown
- Detailed information presented
- Using district owned properties
- Consideration of student disruption
- Updating the most outdated buildings significantly so they meet standards of today

CONCERNS

- Ability to impact <u>as many</u> kids as possible
- Ability to impact kids that feed both PHHS & PHS
- Band-aids don't make longterm difference for students & educators
- Super elementary; does not seem equitable
- Many needs outside of the list
 are they deferred?

OTHER QUESTIONS

- What land does the district own; what sizes are needed for the projects?
- Weighting of the score categories: Primary concerns for the kids are impacts the buildings have on overall health – ex: filtered HVAC, water
- Timeframes for projects
- Is there middle ground between replacement and additions for ES?

COMMUNITY MEETING INPUT





COMMUNITY MEETINGS

- Prioritize HS & MS Improvements
- Plaza replacement is a high priority
- Union Chapel and Graden replacements should be high priorities
- Additions might be more palatable to the voters, but are not a good long-term solution
- Consider parity between sides of the district when establishing priorities
- Consider PH South Improvements





COMMUNITY MEETINGS

- Consider if building next to existing shoehorns a less than desirable solution in the long-term
- Graden ES is currently a poor site location
- Consider infrastructure beyond learning spaces: athletics & theater, swimming + extracurriculars
- A portion of the community is prepared to pay for big/ awesome investments
- Explore Realtor Input
- Northland partnerships to support additional community assets

- Visited every building over the lunch hour
- Discussed what people liked, had concerns about, and what else should be considered

STAFF CHATS

CONSISTENT "LIKES"

- Replacement is the best <u>long-term</u> solution to support needs (48+)
- Replace Plaza (39+)
- Replace Union Chapel (25+)
- Phased Approach to Replace PH High;(17+) Master planning that campus
- Replace Graden (14+)

CONCERNS

- Additions Don't bandaid problems of the worst buildings
 - It maintains inequity
 - Fine for boosting middle of the pack buildings
- Super Elementary
 - too many kids to foster sense of belonging
 - Hectic pick-up
 - Strain on Specials

MIXED INPUT / OTHER

- Prioritize by Building Score (10+)
 -vs-
- Prioritize by Highest
 Grade-Level (1+)
 (HS > MS > ES)
- Inequity: Upsetting for kids to see a newer buildings during Summer school, compared to their own older facilities

STAFF CHATS

CONSISTENT "LIKES"


- 'Campus Approach', if an appropriate site can be found; Smooth transitions
- Relocate Graden not an ideal site for an ES (4+)
 - Intrigued by sale of Graden
- Neighborhood schools for walkability (4+)

CONCERNS

- Consolidation Approach
 - Feeder pattern impact
 - (Remove this option)
- Consider 'Free and Reduced Lunch' participation as a metric for prioritization

MIXED INPUT / OTHER

- Consider <u>number of</u> <u>students impacted</u> as a metric (2)
- Chinn like replacement, but want to stay tucked into the neighborhood (4+)
- PH South has needs (4+)
 - Field house, football stadium, deferred priorities



STAFF CHATSOTHER THOUGHTS

- Current Plaza location is past the highway for most students. Relocate. (6, from different buildings)
- Consider moving Plaza to West side of district
 (1)
- Urgency of available adjacent property (Plaza). (3)
- Congress relocate so PHHS can utilize site
 (1)
- PH South traffic control concerns (3)
- Keep improving athletics

BOE SURVEY RESPONSES

SUPPORT

- Support Partial Replacement of PHHS and master planning of the campus to demonstrate commitment to community
- Support Replacements as the preferred strategy
- Use Additions as necessary to maximize impact.
- Open to Campus Approach
- Consolidation Options, per staff and community feedback, NOT in favor of these options
- Would support sale of Graden, after usefulness as swing space

OTHER STRATEGIES

- For remaining buildings scoring 60- low 70s, support key updates and maintenance for buildings based on improvements that increase longevity, safety, and efficient building operation.
- Maximize utilization of schools above 70.
 Control the bleeding on schools scoring 65-70. Replace schools under 65
- Want more information on smaller projects on people's minds (ex: PHS football stadium, robotics, 2022 bond projects that were deferred)
- Considering use operations/maintenance budgets to do smaller projects at PHHS.



In support


- Good option for Plaza MS, Union Chapel ES, Park Hill HS

- Concerns about cost






BUILDING ADDITION

In support


- Appreciate focus on high school

In support


- Support for improving Plaza MS; mention of Graden ES and Union Chapel ES

- Citing issues at English Landing/Lakeview






BUILDING CONSOLIDATION












Initiate Phase 1 of PH High Replacement. Masterplan the campus site for all phases of replacement.

New site, near Plaza. Sell Graden property.

Spread remaining funds into minor improvements that help bridge until the next LRP. Example: Restrooms, SPED, collaboration space, intervention space.

- Highest grade levels first, followed by lowest scores
- Large reach / Impact
- Potentially viewed as "band-aid"








NEXT STEPS OF THE PLAN
