Madeira Ranked Third in Best High Schools

Madeira High School was ranked third within the state of Ohio in the 2024 US News and World Report Best High Schools. Walnut Hills High School was ranked first and Bexley High School was ranked second.

The U.S. News Best High Schools rankings include data on nearly 25,000 public high schools in 50 states and the District of Columbia. Nearly 18,000 schools were ranked on factors based on their performance on state assessments and how well they prepare students for college. Ohio high school students are assessed in English language arts, math, science and social studies via the Ohio's state tests. To graduate, students must earn at least 20 credits in various subjects, learn economics and financial literacy, as well as take two or more semesters of fine arts, according to the Ohio Department of Education. Methodology used is college readiness 30%, state assessment proficiency 20%, state assessment performance 20%, underserved student performance 10%, college curriculum breadth 10% and graduation rate 10%.

The report also ranked Madeira High School #212 in the national rankings, #2 in Cincinnati Metro Area High schools, and #207 in STEM high schools.
