**Scholarship Deadline:
June 16, 2024**

Eligibility Requirements

- Must be a Southeast Asian* American high school student graduating in June 2024
or
- A two-year community college student
- Must be from Long Beach, Signal Hill, Lakewood, Bellflower, Cerritos, or Artesia
- High school graduates must provide proof of acceptance to an accredited community college, vocational/trade school, or university/college
- Two-year community college students must provide proof of enrollment
- Must have volunteered in a Southeast Asian community, for a Southeast Asian non-profit organization, or in a community service project that benefited the Southeast Asian community
- Minimum GPA 2.5

*Southeast Asian countries: Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar (or Burma), Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Timor-Leste (East Timor), and Vietnam

Application Requirements

- Complete the scholarship application before June 16, 2024.
- Provide a copy of their transcript.
- Two letters of reference from school staff, an employer, or a community leader.
- **All materials must be received by the deadline date of June 16, 2024, at 5:00 p.m.**
