SOLON SCHOOLS 2023-24 KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

It's time to register for kindergarten in the Solon Schools. Kindergarten Information Night is March 1 at 6:30 p.m. Information Night is a virtual event. The link for the program is posted on the district home page. Families are encouraged to complete the kindergarten interest form posted with the program link. Information Night provides an overview of Solon's kindergarten program, kindergarten readiness as well as the district's new online registration process.

Centralized Kindergarten Registration runs from March 6-13 and is completely online this year. The online registration portal on the district web site will open on March 6. Families must complete the registration process, including submitting all required forms, by March 13 for their child to be guaranteed kindergarten placement in their home school.

Residents are encouraged to share this information with friends and neighbors who have children turning age 5 by September 30. The upcoming March registration window is critical to analyzing staffing needs for next school year.
