### TREASURER'S REPORT

The Board approved the payment of bills totaling \$2,827.96.

### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The list of 388 seniors who are candidates for graduation contingent upon each candidate's successful completion in meeting all state and local requirements for graduation were approved.

The Board approved a contract between the Solon Board of Education and the Solon Education Association for the period of September 1, 2022 through August 31, 2025. The Board of Education and the Solon Education Association have agreed on a new three-year contract. The salary for the three years will be as follows:

2022 – 23 – 2.5% base raise

2023 – 24 – 2.5% base raise

2024 – 25 – 2.5% base raise

The resignations of Anthony Davidson (Intervention Specialist at Solon High School), Dana Tangry (Fourth Grade Teacher at Parkside Elementary), and Rachel Vidd (Intervention Specialist at Solon High School), were approved effective August 31, 2022. The Board awarded a contract to Midwest Environmental, Inc., the lowest responsible bidder, for the Asbestos & Hazmat Abatement Project of Arthur Road School in the amount of \$139,000.

The Board approved an increase for the school lunch program for the 2022-23 school year raising the price for the secondary buildings to \$3.75 and to \$3.50 for the elementary buildings.

Tuition reimbursements were approved for 20 individuals in the amount of \$12,592.82. The next board meeting will be June 30, 2022, 8 a.m. at the Board of Education.

#### **SOLON SCHOOLS EARN TOP EDUCATION RANKING FROM CLEVELAND MAGAZINE**

For the 14th straight year, the Solon Schools have earned the #1 education ranking from Cleveland Magazine in its annual *Rating the Suburbs* issue.

The education rankings are based on a wide variety of school data, including state of Ohio report card indicator achievement and value-added measures, SAT and ACT participation rates and student scores, AP classes and participation rates, National Merit Scholar finalists and commended students, as well as other important information such as student supports, extra-curricular activities/clubs and athletic programs offered.

In ranking the city of Solon #6 for Cleveland's 20 Best Places to Live 2022, Cleveland Magazine noted: "Once again, Solon nabbed the No. 1 education ranking. As the third-most diverse suburb in our top 20 with the second most home sales in 2021, Solon continues to be one of the best places to live in the area."

SOLON HIGH SCHOOL AND SOLON MIDDLE SCHOOL SCIENCE OLYMPIAD  
TEAMS BOTH EARN TOP 5 SPOTS AT NATIONALS

Following their state championships in May, the Solon High School and Solon Middle School Science Olympiad teams both excelled at the national competition May 14. The SMS team took fourth and the SHS team took fifth. Showing the depth of the Science Olympiad program, Solon is the only district with middle school and high school teams both earning top 5 finishes in the nation.

Team members earned medals in many individual events, which tested their science knowledge in a wide range of scientific disciplines from genetics, chemistry, biology and physics to earth and space science and technology and engineering.
