TREASURER'S REPORT

The Board approved the payment of bills totaling \$2,465.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The Board approved a contract between the Solon Board of Education and the Solon Education Association for the period of September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2022. The Board of Education and the Solon Education Association have agreed on a new one-year contract. The salary for the one year will be as follows: 2021-22 – 0% base raise. All provisions in the current contract will be carried forward.

The Board approved the retirements of Jill Glauber, ELL teacher at Solon Middle School, and Wendy Gillund, grade 4 teacher at Lewis Elementary School, effective August 1, 2021. Magalie Frazier was approved as a home instruction tutor for the 2020-21 school year.

The Board authorized the Business Manager to advertise and secure bids for the following projects: Dual School Roofs 2A, 3; Dual School Roof 6; SHS Roof 3, including HVAC upgrade; SHS Roofs 10A, 10C, 11, including HVAC upgrade; SHS Roof 23; OMS HVAC Installation; and OMS Exterior Doors.

The Board authorized the Ohio Schools Council to advertise and receive bids on behalf of Solon City Schools, per the specifications submitted for the cooperative purchase, of five (5) school buses for the 2021-2022 school year.

2021 NATIONAL RED RIBBON WEEK THEME DESIGNED BY SOLON MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENT

The theme for Red Ribbon Week 2021 will again be rooted in Solon. “Drug Free Looks Like Me” is the original design and concept of Solon Middle School seventh grader Marin Wurst.

Marin’s theme will be used as part of the annual Red Ribbon Week campaign in October in more than 100,000 schools nationwide. Red Ribbon Week is a long-standing and respected drug prevention and education program.

This is the fifth time a Solon Middle School student has won the national theme competition. Each year, SMS art teacher Cheryl Holsapfel challenges her students to create theme ideas and submit them for consideration to the National Family Partnership Red Ribbon Week contest.

Marin’s theme was selected for the creative way it portrays how individuals keep their community safe, healthy and drug free, according to the National Family Partnership. “All segments of the community -- health care workers, police officers, educators, school bus drivers, parents -- people just like you and me, are examples of what we can achieve through self-dedication, care and commitment,” NFP said in announcing Marin’s winning entry. “The theme encourages everyone to use their voice to make a difference no matter who they are, where they’re from or what they do.
