INFORMATION ITEMS

SOLON SCHOOLS FAMILY SURVEY

During the first week of June, the district collected input from families of Solon Schools students about their experience with emergency remote learning during the extended school building closure caused by the coronavirus pandemic. The survey also solicited family feedback regarding their thoughts for the next school year.

The Governor has directed school districts to make plans for the fall that include a variety of contingencies, including all students attend class in their school buildings, all students continue full remote learning and students attend school in a hybrid, blended model that combines some in-school learning and some remote learning at home.

The district is developing plans for each of these options. It is still too early to know with any certainty which plan will be launched in August and whether we will need to implement more

than one of the plans throughout the school year depending on changing public health circumstances.
The deadline to complete the survey was June 5. The district is compiling the survey results, which together with input from our staff and administrative team, will be used as plans are developed for the 2020-21 school year.
