# SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The Board approved an out-of-state trip for the SHS Speech and Debate Team to travel to Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut, from September 12 to September 15, 2019, for the 2019 Yale Invitational. Bus routes for the 2019-20 school year were approved.

The Board approved Madison Culver as a candidate for graduation contingent upon her successful completion in meeting all state and local requirements for graduation. It is unusual but legal that a student completes their high school obligation earlier than their class. In this case, Madison Culver has met her requirements by taking college credit plus classes during the summer. Therefore, she can be graduated.

#### DONATION TO SOLON HIGH SCHOOL

Solon High School received a donation from graduate Dr. Park Nobel in the amount of \$15,000. Dr. Nobel's request is to use the funds in an unrestricted manner.

Below is the information that will be on the plaque placed by the National Merit Scholar photos honoring Dr. Nobel and his donation.

Park S. Nobel, Solon High School Class of 1956.

Park moved to Solon in 1943 and attended the Solon Schools grades 1-12. A 1956 National Merit Scholarship winner, he was among the first 100 students to receive this prestigious award! Park was valedictorian and president of his 39-member senior class and the first president of Solon High School's Key Club. He went on to earn a Bachelor's Degree in Engineering Physics from Cornell University, a Master's Degree in Physics from the California Institute of Technology, and a Ph.D. in Biophysics from the University of California, Berkeley. He soon joined the faculty at UCLA, remaining for more than 50 years, becoming a Distinguished Professor of Biology Emeritus. Park wrote or edited 18 books and published nearly 400 scientific articles, where his specialty was desert plants, especially agaves and cacti. Solon High School is very grateful for Dr. Nobel's generous support.
