COURSE TITLE: EARTH SCIENCE

COURSE DATA: REQUIRED: 2 Semester Credit Year

COURSE You will study and investigate the core scientific studies related to Earth

and Space Science. The first half of the year students will explore: **DESCRIPTION:**

During the second part of the year students will investigate: Meteorology and Earth's Atmosphere, Weather, and Climate Change; and we'll end the year learning about Astronomy and the search for life beyond Earth.

COURSE TITLE: HEALTH 9-12

Some units include personality and self-esteem, mental disorders, relationships and dating, stress, exercise and life-long fitness, and basic human anatomy. AGRICULTURE

COURSE TITLE: COMPUTER AIDED DRAFTING (CAD)

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This class will teach you through hands on use the basics of CAD, which is using a specific computer program to create 3 dimensional drawings of objects for manufacturing purposes. The program we will be using is called ProEngineer, which is the same program used in many manufacturing facilities, including several located here in

Renville County.

of band literature and performs at concerts, large group contest and pep band events. Students have the opportunity to play and perform solo and small-ensemble repertoire. In addition to performance, the curriculum focuses on understanding music theory, analysis, and the impacts of music on people and cultures. Students receive individualized instruction in the form of three private/group lessons each quarter. The band meets every other day for a full year. Participation in concerts is required.

COURSE TITLE: VARSITY CHOIR

COURSE DATA: Year ELECTIVE: 1 Semester Credit

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This choir, consisting of 9th-12th grade students, gives students the opportunity to experience the process and expression of musical thought in a large group setting. Each student will show basic music knowledge through performance and lessons. Critiquing, analyzing, communicating artistic intent will be included in the course curriculum. Students will receive no less than four lessons every quarter and have opportunities to perform in various ensembles and participate in solo & ensemble festivals. Sight-reading and ear training will be an integral part of vocal lessons. Participation in concerts is required. Choir meets every other day for a full year.
