TREASURER'S REPORT

The Board approved the payment of bills totaling \$74,892.09.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The Board approved a Revenue Sharing Agreement with the city of Glenwillow and SGM Glenwillow, LLC for 0%. Although there is no revenue-sharing between the village and the schools, the schools will benefit by receiving 51% of the property taxes projected to be \$257,000 annually, and an additional \$100,000 during the first year of the abatement. We will place the \$100,000 in our athletic field maintenance program.

Susan Bergen and Susannah Miller were approved as home instruction tutors for the 2017-18 school year. The Board approved the following individuals as substitutes on an as needed basis for the 2017-18 school year:

The Board approved a resolution declaring an urgent necessity and authorizing the solicitation, outside of statutory competitive bidding procedures, of competitive quotes and proposals for a new HVAC unit at the board office.

SOLON SCHOOLS PRESCHOOL MAINTAINS 5-STAR STEP UP TO QUALITY RATING
