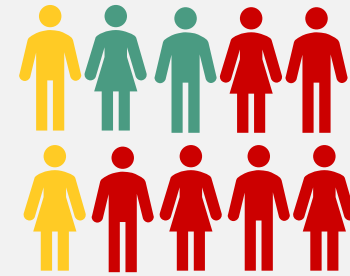
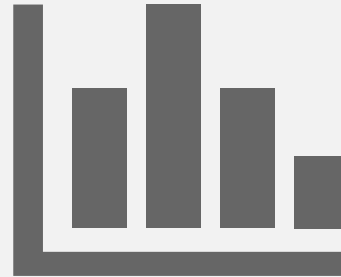


Kindergarten Math Data

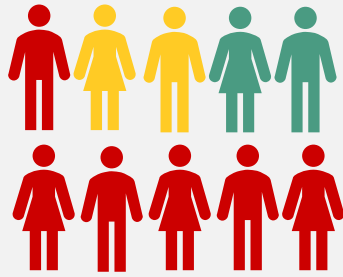

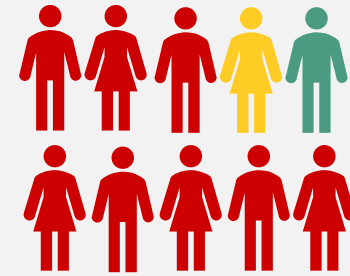
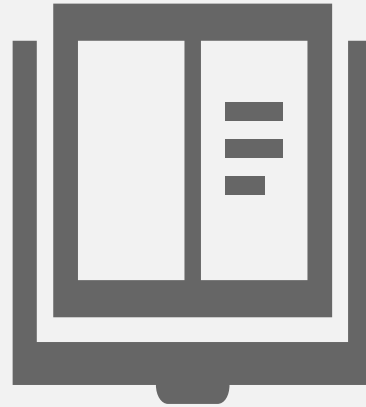

- Coordinate and work with all Head Start programs

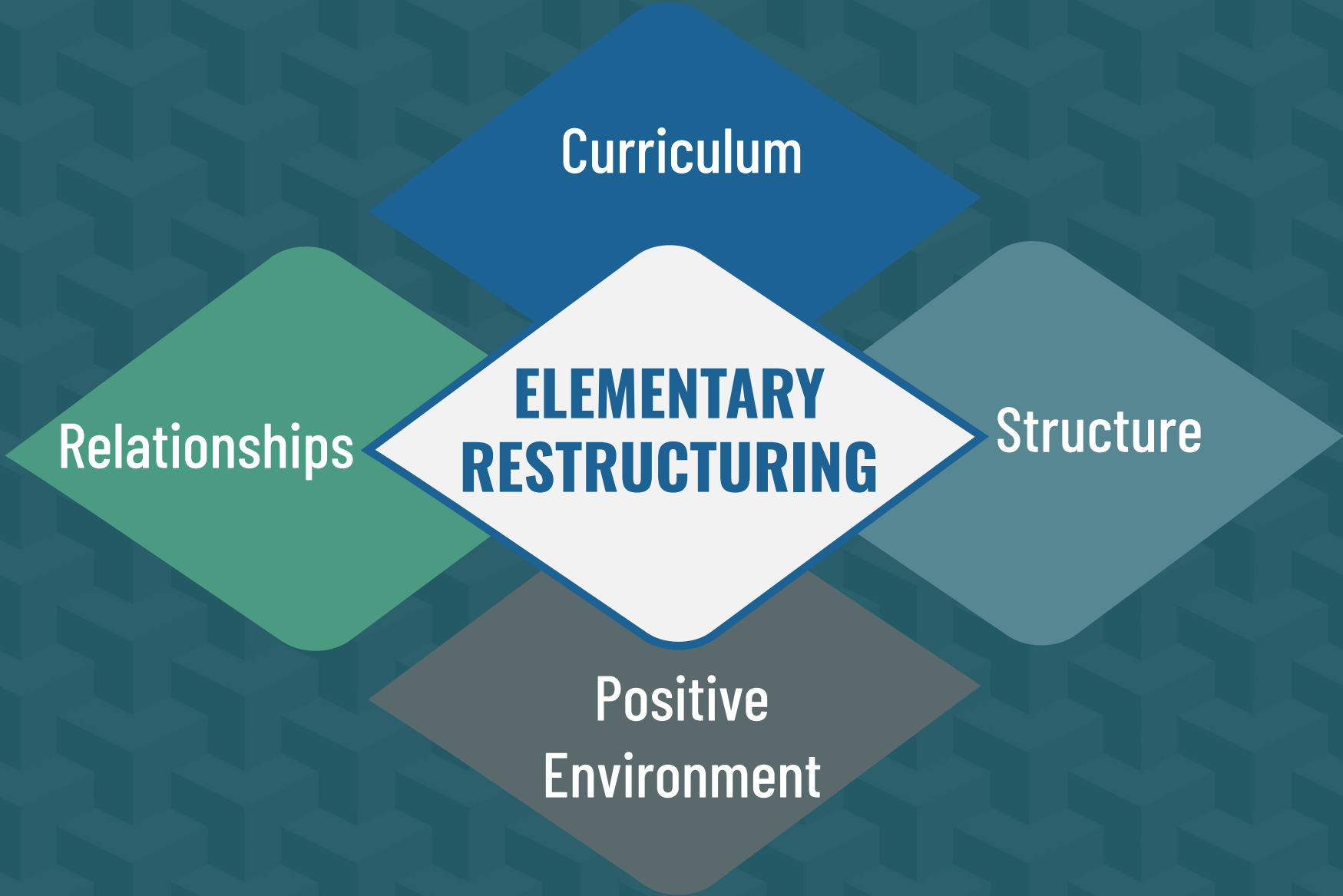
K-4 Class Size Reduction

Understanding the Data: Achievement vs. Growth

ACHIEVEMENT

The Same Goal for All = Proficiency Levels



The measurement is based on what all students should achieve by the end of that grade level, regardless of where one starts.

GROWTH

Individual Goals = Growth Levels (PVAAS)



The measurement is based on the amount of growth a student should achieve by the end of that school year; it takes into account where one is starting.

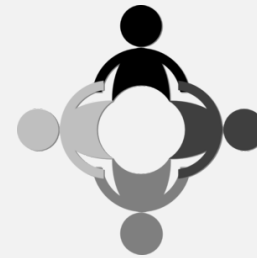
Welcome Center

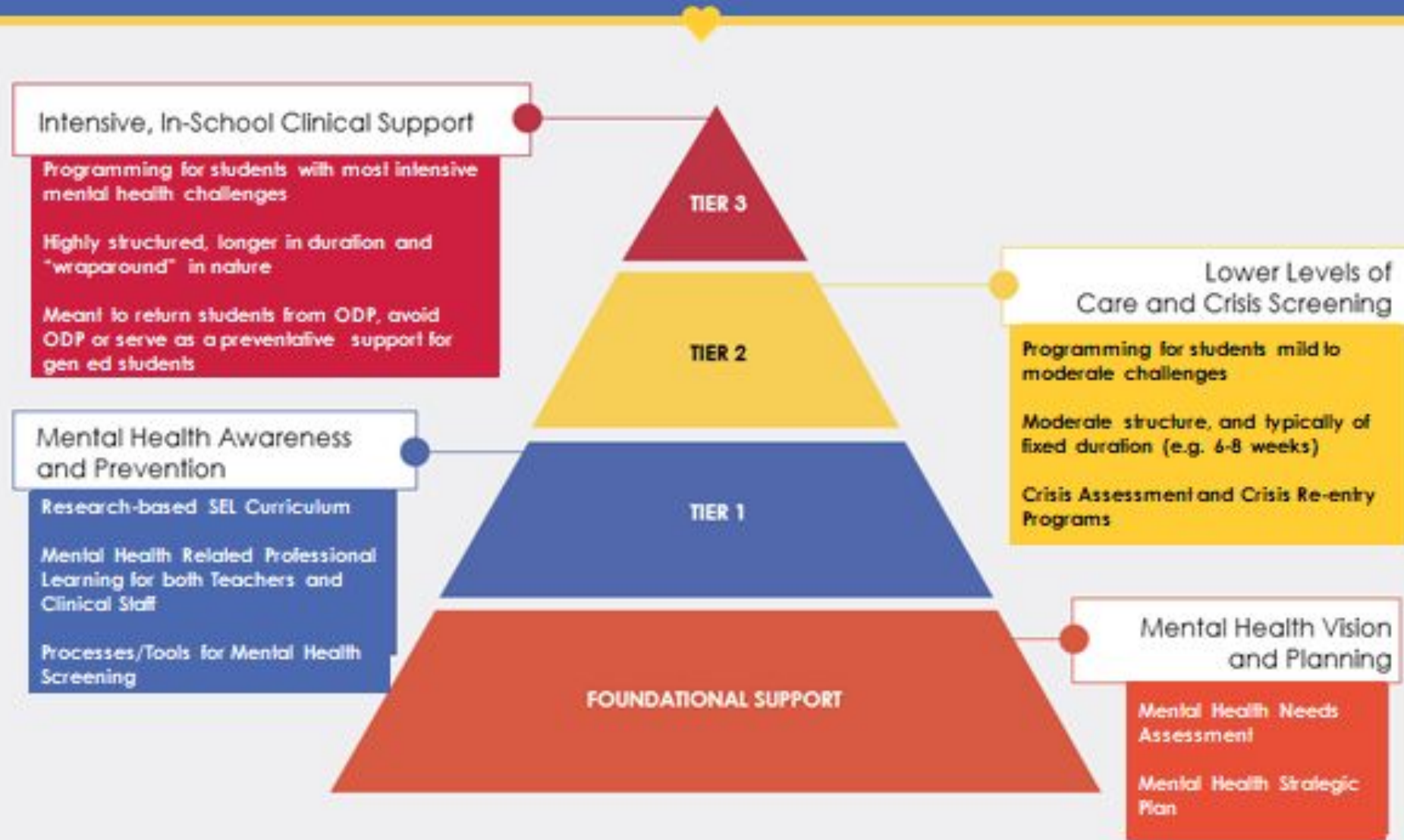
