

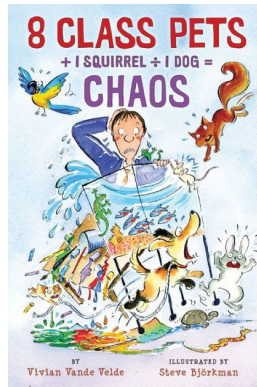

Whole School Reading Event

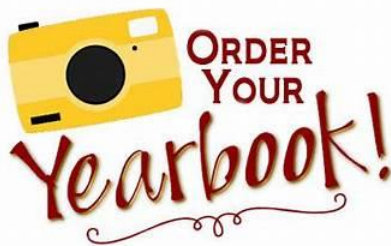

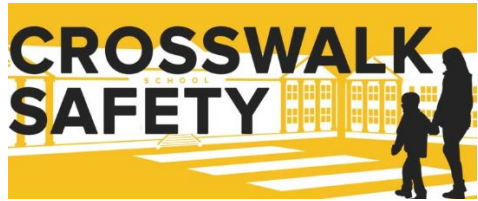

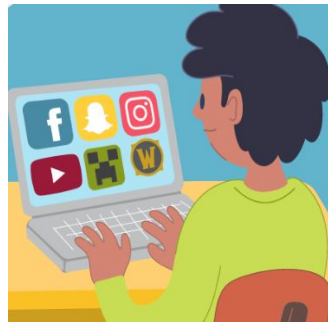
