PROFILE 2022-2023

The School

Saint Bernard School is a Roman Catholic, co-educational, college preparatory school for grades 6 through 12 located in Uncasville, Connecticut. It is co-sponsored by the Diocese of Norwich and the Xaverian Brothers and welcomes students of all faiths who value academic excellence, personal and spiritual growth, and a commitment to community. Saint Bernard courses are structured to develop disciplined study habits, to stimulate critical thinking, and to enhance the skills necessary for the expression of that thinking.

Mission

Enriched by the values attentive to the teachings of Jesus Christ, the Saint Bernard School community is committed to providing a challenging college-preparatory education for students of all faiths.

Students

A culturally-diverse campus, enrollment is open to students who meet the academic standards as determined through a strong desire to attend Saint Bernard School, teacher recommendations, a review of previous academic performance, and an interview. Current enrollment is 397 students; 52% male, 48% female. Saint Bernard's commitment to diversity is reflected in a financial aid program that supports approximately 55% of our high school students. 45% of SBS students identified as being from minority groups, and an additional 4% are international students.

Faculty

With an average class size of 18, and a student-toteacher ratio of 12:1, we are able to get to know each of our students well. The faculty and administration are composed of 36 professional educators. 63% percent of teachers hold advanced degrees.

Accreditation

Saint Bernard School is accredited by the New England Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges and the State of Connecticut Department of Education.

Saint Bernard holds membership in the following professional organizations: American Pueri Cantores; American School Counselors Association (ASCA); Association of Catholic Admissions & Advancement Professionals (ACAAP); Connecticut School Counselor Association (CSCA); New England Association for College Admissions Counseling (NEACAC); Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music (ABRSM); The College Board; National Association of Secondary School Principals (NASSP); Connecticut Association of Schools (CAS).

Graduation Requirements

The curriculum is college preparatory. The school schedule consists of eight periods with four courses meeting daily.

Advanced Placement (16)

Saint Bernard's AP courses are designed to meet the College Board's stringent curricular guidelines. In 2021, 65 students took 109 AP examinations administered in 13 subjects. Since 2012 Saint Bernard has recognized 73 AP Scholars, 22 AP Scholars with Honors, 19 AP Scholars with Distinction. AP Courses offered from 2018-2022 school years: 2D Art and Design, Art History, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Computer Science Principles, Computer Science A, Drawing, Language and Composition, Literature and Composition, Music Theory, Physics 1, Spanish Language & Culture, United States Government and Politics, and United States History.

Honors Courses (25)

British Literature; World Literature; Algebra 1 & 2; Geometry, Pre-Calculus; Calculus Biology; Anatomy and Physiology; Chemistry; Physics; Astrophysics; French 2, 3, and 4; Spanish 2, 3, and 4; Advanced Art; World History 1 and 2; US History, US Government & Civics; Symphonic Band; Concert Choir.

Covid-19 Statement

Saint Bernard School transitioned to online learning on March 17, 2020. Traditional grading was maintained and exams took place virtually at their scheduled time. The 2020-21 school year began for all students, in person, on August 31, 2020. In-person learning was maintained, minus 26 school days in which the virtual learning platform was used school wide. Online learning was made available on an ongoing basis to accommodate students in quarantine. The 2021-22 school year began for all students, with traditional in person learning, on August 30, 2021.
