- Title I funds are federal funds that are allocated to provide additional academic support and learning opportunities to assist students as they master challenging Tier I curriculum and address standards core academic content areas.
- Amite High is a school that receives Title I funds. These funds support learning in a variety of ways by providing extra intervention and/or instructional materials for students in English, Math, Science, and Social Studies as well as technology to enhance performance of a students and reinforce concepts taught in the classroom.



Our overall school goals include: increasing student achievement for all students as measured by the LEAP assessment and district beginning and end-of-year assessments in ELA, math, science, and social studies; decreasing the percentage of chronically absent students; decreasing the percentage of students who receive 1 or more out of school suspensions.
