#### STUDENT DISMISSAL

#### Introduction

The purpose of this policy is to provide regular and emergency dismissal procedures to ensure that students are dismissed in a safe and orderly fashion.

## Dismissal of Students During the School Day

- 1. Requests for early dismissal of students shall be made by the parents/guardians in writing and sent to the school office. In emergencies, telephone calls will may be accepted.
- 2. Students will only be released to an individual listed on the emergency contact list.
- 3. Students and parents/guardians will be notified on an annual basis and through the school handbook of any additional procedures at the school level.
- 4. All requests for early dismissal must be approved by the principal or his/her designee.

## Dismissal of Students at the End of the School Day

Students will be dismissed as walkers or bus students.

- Walkers will only be dismissed to parents/guardians or individuals listed on the emergency contact form, and with proper identification. There will be no exceptions.
- Once in line, bus students must go home on the bus and cannot be taken from the bus area by parents/guardians. Only the principal/designee will be allowed to remove students from the bus area for emergency situations. This is for the protection of students.
- Bus students will be dropped off at the regularly scheduled stop five days a week. There are **no** exceptions to this unless the change request is permanent, for the remainder of the school year (Change in Location of Current Bus Stop Policy EEAA-R).
- Students will be dismissed as bus students (students who take the bus home from school) or walkers (students who walk, ride a bike, or are picked up from school by a parent/guardian or an individual on their Emergency Contact form.
- With parent/guardian approval, elementary age students\* will be permitted to walk or ride a bike home. Parents/guardians must send in a signed note to the school stating that this is their wish. Age/grade restrictions for walking or riding a bike home unaccompanied may differ from school to school. Parents/guardians should refer to their child's school handbook (distributed to students at the start of each school year), for procedures specific to their school.
  - \* Middle school-age and high school-age students are not required to have parent/guardian approval to walk or ride a bike home.

# Changes in Dismissal Pattern

Notice of any change in a student's usual dismissal pattern must be received by the school in writing prior to 10:30 a.m.

- In the event of an emergency school closing, parents/guardians will be notified of any changes to dismissal procedures.
- In the event that a student is to be dismissed by the principal or his/her designee for reasons of injury, discipline or other school-related instances, the principal or his/her designee will first contact the parents/guardians and request that the student be picked up at the school. The student will only be released to a parent/guardian or an individual listed on his/her Emergency Contact form, unless other arrangements are made with the principal or his/her designee.
- In the event of an emergency, where a parent/guardian or a designated individual on file cannot be reached, the school nurse or principal may, if warranted, seek out medical attention for a student. The principal's office will continue to call the parents/guardians until contact is made.
