GRADING SYSTEMS

The administration and professional staff shall devise grading systems for evaluating and recording student progress. The records and reports of individual students shall be kept in a form that will be meaningful to parents and students, as well as teachers. The grading system shall be uniform—system wide—at comparable grade levels.

The Committee shall approve the grading and reporting systems as developed by staff, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent.

The Committee recognizes that any grading system, however effective, is subjective in nature and requires all faculty members to conduct student evaluations as objectively as possible. The Committee shall support staff efforts to find better ways to measure and report student progress.
