

Make Up Opportunities

Although there is no substitute for day-to-day instruction in class, it is understood that a student may be legitimately absent due to illness, bereavement, etc. and will need time/opportunity to make up work that has been missed.

In the event of short term absence, the teacher will minimally allow the student one make up day for each day of absence. There may be exceptions to this rule, eg. long term assignments given prior to the absence or debilitating illnesses or hospitalizations. It will be within the teacher's discretion to limit or extend the time period in such cases.

If a student or parent has prior knowledge of an absence, as in the case of an impending surgery, the teacher should be advised so that special arrangements or alternate assignments may be considered. However, if a student is to be absent for a trip/vacation, the student will receive the work when he/she returns.
