Special Education Law

- Federal: Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (reauthorized in 2004)
- Massachusetts: Chapter 71B (Chapter 766)603 CMR 28.00

Special Education is:

- Specially designed instruction to meet the unique needs of an individual in order to access and make effective progress in the general curriculum, and/or
- Related services necessary to access and make effective progress in the general curriculum

Eligibility for Special Education: (All 3 Must Be Met) V 1. The student has a diagnosed disability 2. The student is not making effective progress* as a result 3. The student requires special education services to do so.





Let's review the process:

Referral is made

by a parent/guardian/care giver or a teacher

Response from School

within 5 school days of receiving the referral; may include consent to evaluate.

IEP meeting

Within 45 school days total (15 days after evaluation period)

Determine eligibility, develop IEP, determine placement

Next step

Parents receive 2 copies of the IEP with choices on signature page and placement page

30 days to sign and return.


Evaluation

Within 30 school days of receiving signed consent to evaluate.

In suspected areas of disability

Implementation

IEP is fully implemented once it is signed and received by the school.



Parents are equal partners!

Team consists of parents, general education teacher, special education provider, student if 14 or older, and others based on need/discretion of family or school

Six Basic Principals

Participation

Parent and student participation is paramount, as students are the focus of special education.

It is the obligation of the district to ensure participation.

FAPE

Is Free and Appropriate Public Education

Services are provided by the public school district at no cost to families with services to enable progress including all levels PK-22, and


