



CARROLL ISD SCHOOL SAFETY & SECURITY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES May 7, 2024

The second meeting of the Carroll ISD Safety & Security Committee (SSSC) for the 2023-2024 school year was called to order by SSSC District Lead Mr. Brian Nickel on Tuesday, May 7, 2024, beginning at 4:44 PM in the Carroll ISD Administration Center, 2400 N. Carroll Avenue, Southlake, TX 76092.

Chairman Mark Flores welcomed SSSC members, including the Superintendent, Teachers, Staff, Community Members, and City Representatives from Emergency Management and School Resource Officers.

The SSSC reviewed its purpose: The School Safety and Security Committee is a working group of diverse individuals that serves the members of its school district by helping create and maintain a safe and secure school climate and culture for staff and students.

REVIEW OF PREVIOUS MEETING

Secretary Amy Simcox highlighted the minutes from the January 30th meeting, then the SSSC transitioned into the current agenda.

SAFE GRANT

Mr. Flores announced a SAFE Grant award of \$277,758.

Mr. Nickel informed the SSSC that the district must apply funds to first meet compliance requirements. Outstanding compliance item of door maintenance is underway.

Once compliance is met, can look at secondary approved uses:

- Access control
- Video cameras
- 2-way radio systems
- Internal door maintenance
- Secondary locking devices
- Light notification systems in event of lockdown or emergency

Narcan

Mr. Nickel informed the SSSC of outreach by non-profit, Jacob's Journey. Offered unlimited access to free of Narcan as the District may have needs.

Narcan is typically stored in nurse's office at each campus. Mr. Nickel recommended placement in all AEDs and or wall next to AEDs in our high school use facilities like high school gyms and other areas used in after-school hours.

The SSSC discussed optimal storage options for Narcan outside of nurses' offices, availability to school trainers, and signage/instructions.

Stadium RA & ERP

Met with Priority Assessment regarding stadium security. Priority Assessment conducts risk assessments and builds emergency response plans for stadiums. Proposal made for a risk assessment and emergency response procedures at Dragon Stadium.

The SSSC discussed existing emergency response procedures currently in place.

UPDATES

CISD Maintenance and Technology

a. Security Film

Mr. Nickel updated the SSSC of arrival of security film, and upcoming commencement of precision measurements. Current estimated installation would be completed in July 2024.

b. Silent Panic Alert Update

Mr. Nickel informed the SSSC that the silent panic alert system has been successfully installed and tested on all elementary school campuses. The silent panic alert system is mandated by the State for implementation for 2024-25 school year.

City of Southlake

No updates.

SROs

Capt. Hernandez informed the SSSC of full staffing of SROs across all campuses and Clariden School, including 2 rovers.

Armed Security

Mr. Patrick Holiday provided positive feedback on armed security services at Johnson Elementary. SSSC discussed ongoing coordination of communication with SROs and ability to fill SROs absences when necessary. The State has mandated on-campus security personnel every day.

Drug Dogs

The SSSC received positive feedback on effectiveness of drug dog service (newly implemented for 23-24 school year), particularly at the senior high school campus. Priority on high school campuses, with occasional visits to middle school campuses as time permits.

Gateway MOU

Mr. Nickel updated the SSSC on status of execution of Gateway MOU.

- a. White's Chapel MOU for RES

Mr. Nickel informed the SSSC of White's Chapel's interest in exploration of MOU.
