



Please make sure you review your graduation requirements carefully. The "Course History" tab in your StudentVue shows your progress towards completing your requirements.




You should utilize the "Graduation Status Report" on the back side of your instructions to help you keep track of your credits throughout high school and plan for next year.



- All students must complete at least one graduation pathway listed on the "Completer Pathway Options" chart on the back side of your instruction sheet.

WHAT CLASSES DO I NEED TO TAKE?

- ► When completing your Student Course Enrollment Worksheet, you must sign up for seven classes and three alternate elective courses.
 - 1. Unless otherwise told by your teacher or School Counselor, you will sign up for the **four** required core academic classes for your grade level.
 - 2. You will also sign up for **three** additional courses that fulfill graduation requirements, that are part of your graduation pathway and/or are electives you wish to take.
 - 3. Lastly, you will choose <u>3</u> alternate elective courses to enter in the "Alternate Courses" space at the end of the worksheet.
 - 4. This is a total of <u>10</u> courses that are listed or selected on your form that is returned.

TEACHER RECOMMENDATIONS

01

Your current core academic teachers will give their recommendation for placements in A-level, honors, or AP courses.

CTE teachers will also approve your enrollment in graduation pathway courses.

02

If your parent/guardian disagrees with the recommendation, they should contact the teacher to discuss their concerns.

03

After talking with the teacher, your parent or guardian can override a recommendation. They must attach a written request to your Student Course Enrollment Worksheet when it is submitted.

DO I REALLY HAVE TO TAKE MATH?

- Maryland state law requires that each student take a math course each year while in high school and students must earn 4 high school math credits to graduate.
- Even if you completed math credits in middle school, you must still enroll in a math course **each** year you are in high school.
- For admission to any public college or university in Maryland, you will be required to take a math class at the Algebra II or higher level in your senior year of high school.
- Additionally, while CCPS requires <u>two</u> credits in the <u>same</u> foreign language for graduation, many colleges either require or prefer students to have 3 credits of the same foreign language.

If you are planning to attend college, it is important to take challenging courses throughout high school. If you are not already challenging yourself, you should seriously consider selecting at least one higher-level course for next year. Most college admissions officers tell us that taking challenging courses is more important than earning straight A's in high school.

CANI CHANGE MY MIND?

Schedule changes each year are only made in extreme circumstances, such as errors in academic placement. You must be <u>very</u> careful with course selection.

Please select the correct course levels with the help of your parents/guardians and your current teachers.

Carefully choose your electives and alternates and make sure these are classes you will be happy with.

You should review the "High School Program of Studies" for descriptions of courses before you sign up for a class.

If you're still unsure about a course, please speak with your School Counselor or the current course teacher before selecting the class.

DEADLINE

Your Student Course Enrollment Worksheet must be submitted by the deadline: Friday, January 12th.

WHERE DO I TURN IN MY WORKSHEET?

The completed worksheets should be turned in to the appropriate grade-level box outside the Counseling Office in the Commons Area.

You may turn in your worksheet to the boxes before 1st period and during lunch.

COURSE REQUESTS IN STUDENTVUE

February 1st through 9th students will be called by grade-level to the cafeteria to input course requests into StudentVue.

- Your worksheet with be returned to you at that time to assist with this process.
- School Counselors will be available to help.

INDIVIDUAL MEETINGS

School Counselors will meet with each student individually from February 12-March 11

to finalize course requests.

Reminders for the Class of 2026

- You must take a Math **EVERY** year while in high school and you must pass **FOUR** math classes to graduate.
- You must have a completer pathway to graduate from high school (ie. World Language or a <u>CTE program</u>)
- You must take <u>two</u> years of the <u>same</u> world language if that is your completer pathway (ie. Spanish I & II or French I & II, or Latin I & II). This also applies if you desire to attend college.
- You must complete an Earth, Life and Physical Science course to graduate (Earth Systems/AP Environmental, Biology, Chemistry/Physics)
- You must complete two Health courses (one with PE & one with Financial Literacy in 11th grade)
- To graduate early you must have **two Math credits before** the beginning of 10th grade. Also, you must apply for early graduation, be approved, and take English III in summer school before the beginning of the third year.
- To attend early college, you must complete Geometry before the beginning of 10th grade.

Alternative Programs During High School That Affect Your Future Career and College Plans Plan Ahead NOW!

11th grade options:

Early Graduate, Dual Enrollment, Dual Credit, CSM Early College

- If you are interested in graduating early or starting college courses early, these are some of the requirements.
- Interested in **Fire and Rescue (MFRI)**. Click <u>here</u> for more information. To enroll for 11th & 12th grade, you must apply by the <u>end of 10th grade</u>, be 16 years old and established with a firehouse.
- Interested in **graduating early** during third year of high school? You must have already taken Geometry or have two math credits by the <u>beginning of 10th grade</u>. And you must take English III in summer school <u>before</u> your third year in high school. Click <u>here</u> for more information. Application will be available during individual scheduling meetings.
- Interested in **CSM Early College** during junior or senior year? The application is open! The application closes on February 15th. Click <u>here</u> for more information.
- Interested in **Dual Credit** during junior or senior year? LPHS offers course in the building that will allow you the opportunity to receive credit towards high school graduation and college credit, if all requirements are met. The classes offered are: Advanced Algebra with Trig, Pre-Calculus and Composition and Rhetoric.

Alternative Programs During High School That Affect Your Future Career and College Plans Plan Ahead NOW!

12th grade options:

Early College, Dual Enrollment, Full Time College Waiver

- Interested in **CSM Early College** during junior or senior year to earn an associates degree or certificate? You would attend CSM **all** day.
- Interested in **Dual Enrollment** during senior year to earn college credits? You would attend school for **half** the day and then CSM for afternoon courses. Click <u>here</u> for more information.
- Interested in **Full Time College Waiver** at CSM to earn college credits during senior year? You would attend CSM **all** day. Click <u>here</u> for more information.

Planning for Life After High School

- Start your research on your pathway beyond high school.
- If you are planning to attend a college or university, begin planning to take the SAT and/or the ACT during your junior year.
- If you are planning to attend a college or university, begin your research on what is required to meet your goal of attending your desired college or university.
- If you are planning to attend a trade school, begin your research on what is required to attend your desired trade schools.
- If you are planning to go to the workforce, begin your research on career opportunities post high school.
