

PREFACE

Lakeview has a proud tradition of providing excellent education, winning activities, and putting students first in all decision-making. We are excited to have three public school buildings spread throughout the district with Platte Center Elementary, Shell Creek Elementary, and Lakeview Jr./Sr. High School. Lakeview Preschool is also located at both Platte Center Elementary and Shell Creek Elementary. In addition to LCS buildings, inside district boundaries are two K-8 parochial schools, Christ Lutheran Elementary School and St. John's Lutheran School.

Lakeview Community School District is a PK-12 public school district that enjoys strong community support and provides quality education for approximately 960 students. Lakeview demographics consisted of 961 students with 37.98% on free/reduced lunch, 15.50% in special education, and 8.74% as English Language Learners. The students are a combination of children residing in suburban Columbus, rural Columbus and Platte Center, as well as industrial tract residents. There are eighty-one (81) certified staff members, seventy-eight (78) non-certified staff members, and five (5) administrators employed by the district.

The District offers a broad range of academic and extra-curricular opportunities for its students including Advanced Placement (AP), college-level courses, STEM education, a world-class agriculture education program, and career education opportunities that are second-to-none. The district also offers migrant education and an English as a second language program. Lakeview has a strong academic background displayed with strong NSCAS scores and ACT scores above the state average.

PHYSICAL FACILITIES

Lakeview Community Schools is made up of the following schools: Lakeview Junior-Senior High School, Shell Creek Elementary and Platte Center Elementary. The District also receives a majority of the students from the Christ Lutheran and St. John's Lutheran parochial schools when reaching high school age. The Board of Education building and grounds committee meets at least quarterly to make sure each facility is kept up to date concerning routine maintenance. They also review potential projects and updates on at least a yearly basis.

Lakeview Community Schools buildings have taken on many changes over the last several years beginning with an addition to the Lakeview Jr./Sr. High School in 2009. This project created additional classrooms allowing the 7th and 8th grade students to move into the building. In 2013, Shell Creek Elementary was remodeled and expanded due to increased enrollment. In 2019, a bond was passed for Lakeview Jr./Sr. High School providing additions and renovations to the original building. Construction began on the facility in 2020, and was completed at the beginning of the 2021-22 school year. These changes within the district have helped improve the excellent education provided to Lakeview Community School students.






ASSESSMENT RESULTS

JUNIOR CLASS ACT SCORES

In the spring of 2023 all 11th grade students in Nebraska were required to take the ACT. The graph on the left shows the percentage of Lakeview juniors compared to Nebraska juniors who met ACT Benchmark. The graph on the right shows the percentage of Lakeview juniors compared to Nebraska juniors who were proficient on the statewide ACT assessment.



GRADUATE ACT SCORES

The chart below shows Lakeview's ACT scores for the last six graduating classes. Students may take the test at any grade level but the students last score is the score used for school composite averages. Beginning in 2017, all junior students began taking the ACT due to the change in state statute.
