Middle School Enrichment

- 76 courses offered to grades 5-9 (8:30 11:30 am)
- Enrichment students had the option to explore:

 business, chess, stock market, law, acting, sewing,
 gaming, public speaking, painting, drawing, music,
 neuroscience, architecture, forensics... and more!
- Academic enrichment was provided in English, math, social studies, science, and literacy.

Elementary Enrichment

• 257 students enrolled in our elementary program
