# Planned Use of the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Grant

- Safely returning students to in-person instruction;
- Operating schools and meeting the needs of students;
- Purchasing educational technology, including hardware, software, connectivity, assistive technology, and adaptive equipment, for students that aids in regular and substantive educational interaction between students and their classroom instructors, including students from low income families and children with disabilities;
- \* Addressing the impacts of the COVID-19 Pandemic on students, including the impacts of interrupted instruction and learning loss and the impact on low-income students, children with disabilities, English Language Learners, racial and ethnic minorities, students experiencing homelessness, and foster care youth;
- Implementing evidence-based strategies to meet students' social, emotional, mental health, and academic needs, including the implementation of evidence based full-service community schools and the hiring of counselors;

# Planned Use of the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Grant (cont.)

- Improving indoor air quality;
- Developing and implementing procedures and systems to improve the preparedness and response efforts of the school district;
- Offering evidence-based summer, after-school, and other extended learning and enrichment programs;
- \* Supporting early childhood education; and
- \* Other activities that are necessary to maintain operation of continuity of services, including continuing to employ existing or hiring new school staff.



## Supplement, not Supplant, Existing Budgeted Funds

- \* Any planned use of the American Rescue Plan funding cannot replace money that has already been budgeted.
- \* Expenditures are recommended to be non-reoccuring items.



## Planned Use of the 2022-2023 Increase in Foundation Aid

- Eliminating the achievement gap for students in need of additional support
- Maintaining low class sizes
- Providing supports for students who are not meeting, or at risk of not meeting state learning standards in core academic subject areas
- Addressing student social-emotional health
- Providing adequate resources to English Language Learners, student with disabilities, and students experiencing homelessness
- Detailed summaries of investments in current year initiatives and funds spent in priority areas.
